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Korean War Armistice 68th Anniversary Commemorated at R.I. National Cemetery

The Korean War Veterans Association Chapter 168 gathered for an annual ceremony commemorating the Korean War Armistice 68th Anniversary and National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day at the Rock Island National Cemetery on July 27.



Ron Sears, Korean War veteran and president of Chapter 168, said that it's important to remember this 'forgotten war.' "Because they are our comrades in arms, and we want to honor those people, and for the country of South Korea," said Sears. "We'd love to have more people come out and see what we are doing and really pay attention to where we are, because we are members the Korean War, we are the forgotten war. You always hear about World War I, World War II; they jumped right into Vietnam, so therefore we are the forgotten the war, which is the United States is the longest war that they've ever fought, because the war is still going on – all they did is sign an armistice, they didn't sign a peace treaty; took a long time to sign that as well. Yes it did, negotiated for about two and a half years." Keynote speaker Col. Todd J. Allison, garrison commander, U.S. Army Garrison Rock Island Arsenal, spoke to the signing of the

First Army Soldiers Sharpen Large-Scale Mobilization Skills

First Army Soldiers from across the nation recently tested their ability to mobilize large groups of the Reserve Component in support of operations against a peer adversary. The exercise, known as Pershing Strike and conducted July 8 through July 19, validated First Army's ability to establish and conduct command and control of large scale mobilization operations, expand mobilization force generation installation, or MFGI, capacity, and conduct post-mobilization operations at key bases around the country. These are similar to operations First Army conducted in World War I and World War II to ensure the National Guard and Reserve were ready to fight and win a potential conflict. "In the possible event of a conflict with a peer adversary, we may need to facilitate the mobilization of National Guard and Reserve Soldiers at MFGI's around the country," said Lt. Col. John Burns, the chief of current operations for First Army, "There are a lot of

It's important we rehearse this and make sure First Army headquarters, divisions, and brigades are synchronized to make the mobilization actions as smooth as possible." Corps of Engineers to Host Open House on Largest Diesel Towboat in the U.S.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Rock Island District, is hosting an open house aboard the Motor Vessel Mississippi August 10 from 1-5 p.m. at River Heritage Park in downtown Davenport. The open house is free to the public and will include a walking tour of the vessel and a chance to view STEM-related exhibits about Rock Island District missions. No registration is needed to participate. The M/V Mississippi is the largest diesel towboat ever built in the United States and is owned and operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. It spends



most of the year as a working towboat for the Memphis District, but is also used by the presidentially appointed Mississippi River Commission for conducting inspections of USACE projects along the Mississippi River. Due to COVID-19 precautions, a limited number of people will be permitted on the vessel in a rotational format during the open house. Social distancing measures will be in place and face masks will be required while onboard. Attendees are also advised to bring a valid photo ID and be prepared for a security check before boarding. The team conducts safety audits, reviewing major subordinate command programs every four years, ensuring they are conducting proper oversight and identifying gaps. Climate Change Has National Security Implications, DOD Official Says

Understanding and dealing with climate change is important to national security and, therefore, to the Defense Department, the senior climate advisor to the defense secretary said. "Climate change effects are real and they are significant," he said. "Climate change is going to cost us in resources and readiness; and the reality is that it already is," Joe Bryan today told the Congressional Clean Energy EXPO and Policy Forum. In response to climate change, DOD is working to become more energy efficient and independent, Bryan said. For instance, some bases are becoming more energy efficient by bringing energy storage and distributed

DoD Extended Policy Guidance For Identification Card Operations During the Corona Virus Disease 2019 Pandemic

The Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Office is operating at full capacity to serve our supported customers. We ask that customers continue to observe masking and social distancing to protect the many higher-risk personnel in the population we serve. For those customers unable or uncomfortable visiting the facility, the Department of Defense has extended the expiration dates of Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards. Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness: In view of the DoD's limited ability to return Identification (ID) Card facilities to normal operations while continuing to comply with local pandemic safety precautions, I am extending the temporary policy guidance at the reference for Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards that expired between Jan. 1, 2020 and July 31, 2021 only, through:

- Aug. 31, 2021: Foreign Affiliates and their dependents.
- Oct. 31, 2021: Dependents of Active Duty Uniformed Service members; Reserve and National Guard Uniformed Service Members and their dependents.
- Jan. 31, 2022: Retirees and their dependents; all other populations.

USID cards that expired before Jan. 1, 2020 or that expire after July 31, 2021 have not been extended and will not be accepted. Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Facility (Building 56):

Austin III said today he's concerned about the number of suicides there and across the force. "I'm deeply concerned about the suicide rates, not only here but across the force," he said during a press conference at Eielson Air Force Base, Alaska. "One loss by suicide is too many. While we're working hard on this problem, we have a lot more to do." Addressing the problem must start with reducing the stigma associated with seeking help for mental health issues, he said. Customers use a computer or mobile device to make their orders online where they select from commissary products offered based on the store's stock assortment. New Masking Policy for Rock Island Arsenal Health Clinic

Effective immediately, subject to any applicable labor relations obligations, the following additional health protection measures will be in effect for all MEDCOM organizations.

- Service members, federal employees, on-site contractor employees, and visitors, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a mask in indoor settings.
- Individuals must wear masks consistently while indoors except:

 1) when an individual is along in an office with floor to aciling walls
 - 1) when an individual is alone in an office with floor-to-ceiling walls and



- closed doors;
- 2) for brief periods of time when eating and drinking while maintaining at least six-feet distance and in accordance with instructions from commanders and supervisors;
- 3) when the mask is required to be lowered briefly for identification or security purposes; and
- 4) when necessary to reasonably accommodate and individual with a disability All individuals should also follow social distancing practices per the local HPCON A protection measures.

DOD Directs Employees in High Risk Geographic Areas to Start Wearing Face Masks Again

Following guidance issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Defense Department has directed employees working in areas at high risk for transmission to begin using face masks again as a measure to prevent the continued spread of the COVID-19 virus, especially the fast-moving, highly-transmittable Delta variant. The new guidance for the department came in a memorandum signed by Deputy Defense Secretary Kathleen H. Hicks. "In areas of substantial or high community transmission, DOD requires all service members, federal employees, onsite contractor employees and visitors, regardless of vaccination status, to wear a mask in an indoor setting in installations and other facilities owned, leased or otherwise controlled by DOD," the memorandum read.
