To all Camp Lejeune Marines, sailors, civilians and your families, I offer sincere best wishes for a joyous holiday season and a Happy New Year.

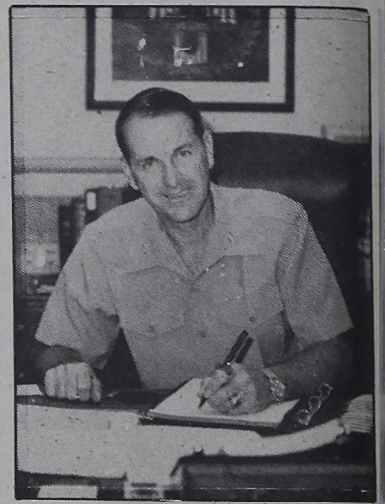

## CG'S CORNER

American Cablevision of Camp Lejeune currently requires a \$75 deposit for the use of a converter to receive certain pay-cable stations in the BEQ, regardless of rank. I think the requirement of \$75 is an extreme measure taken by the cable company. Average pay-tv costs range from \$14.85 to \$26 per month. The \$75 deposit represents nearly three months of payments, and the deposit gathers no interest. What is the reason for this charge?

Cable service to the BEQ's began in late 1984 and it is ordered by occupants and it is a personal contract between the franchise operator and the individual. Because of extensive non-payment of bills and the failure to return rented converter boxes on the part of many of the subscribers, the \$75 deposit was negotiated and approved in April of 1986.

I have asked the contracting officer to renegotiate the \$75 deposit to make sure it only is applied to those high-risk categories of subscribers rather than to all residents of BEQs. I want to be sure that an appropriate fee is determined so that those who pay their bills are not held responsible for those who are not. As soon as this renegotiation is completed, information will be provided to all personnel.

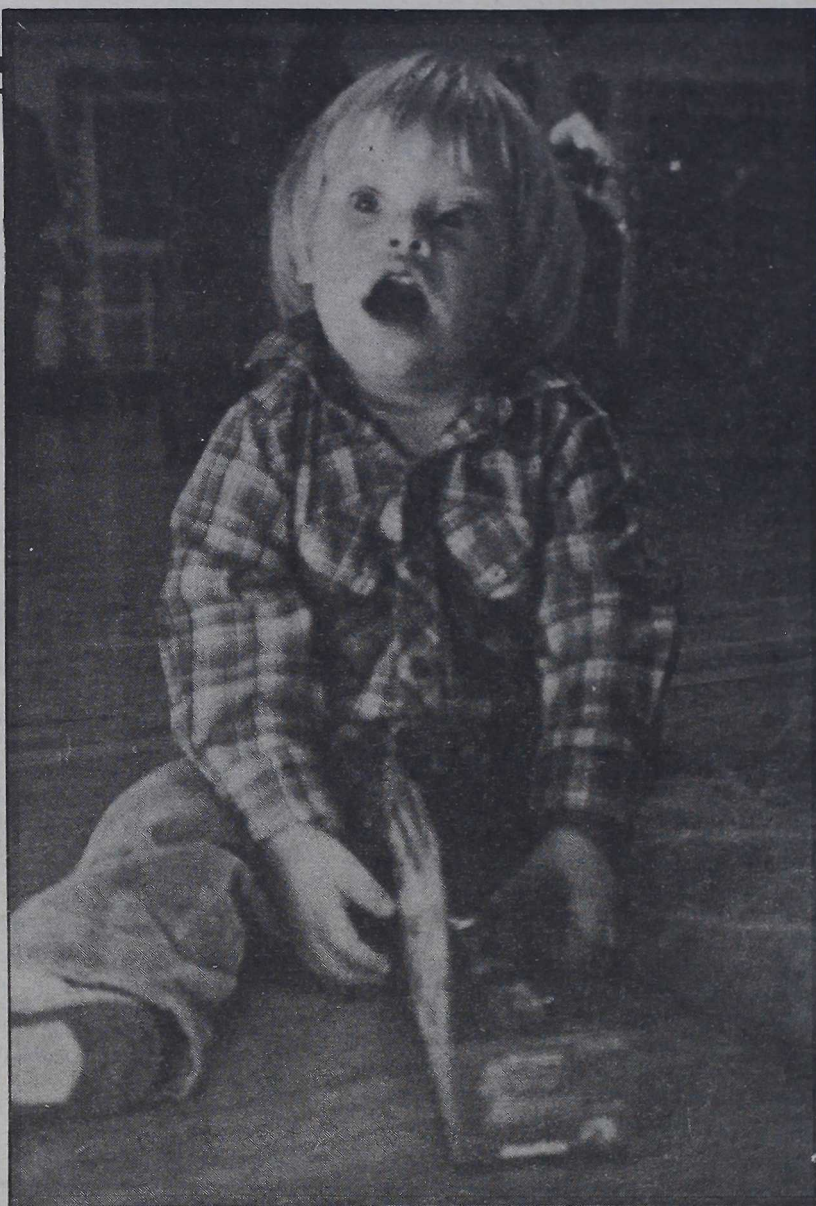
Not only did the party make the Marines feel good, but it also made some people's days just a little brighter.

## HEALTHWATCH Insect bites

The colorful foliage and variety of hunting seasons are reasons for many to head for the mountains and woods. Although the fresh crisp air brings with it a necessity of warm bulky sweaters and hiking boots, protective measures still should be taken against insect bites and stings.

Individuals vary widely in their reaction to insect bites. Irritation is often due to unrestrained scratching or when some portion of the biting or stinging apparatus is left in the skin, such as the stinger of a wasp.

A severe local reaction results in itching, pain and an unusual amount of swelling around the site of the sting. Toxic reactions occurring after 10 or more simultaneous stings are characterized by fever, headache, dizziness, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea.

An allergic reaction could include the eruption of red bumps and welts on the skin, weakness, chest tightness, dizziness, nausea, and vomiting, or a swelling in the throat. A severe reaction should be cared for immediately in facilities prepared to handle such emergencies.

Generally, therapy is directed relief of itching and control of a secondary infection. Simple skin preparations containing menthol, phenol or calamine will frequently be soothing

and give temporary relief. Cold applications such as ice or cool compresses at the sting site will retard absorption, reduce the chemical activity of the insect's venom, and decrease swelling. A cool bath with baking soda will aid in relieving the itch of insect bites.

Prevention of insect bites is obviously the most effective treatment. Here are some prevention do's and don'ts.

### DO:

Wear protective clothing and shoes.

Use insect repellents.

Keep household plants fumigated.

Keep pets clean and properly protected against fleas and ticks.

Enlist help of local pest exterminators.

Check clothing, skin and hair for ticks after being outdoors.

### DON'T:

Wear brightly colored or flowery clothing or jewelry (white is said to be the least attractive color to insects)

Wear perfumes or heavily-scented hair sprays or aftershaves.

No one is immune from getting stung or bitten by an insect, even during the chilly winter months. Taking a few steps toward prevention can decrease your chances of being bitten or stung, and increase your enjoyment out-of-doors.

### Chow hall closings

Both commissaries will also be closed on Jan. 1 in observance of the national New Year holiday and reopen for business at 9 a.m. on Jan. 2.

### T-shirt exchange halted

Military Clothing Sales stores and other retail outlets will no longer accept exchanges of green undershirts because of fading or discoloring, according to a recent Headquarters, Marine Corps, message.

The shirts, worn with the camouflage utility uniform, were being accepted for exchange during 1985 while Defense Personnel Support Center (DPSC) personnel inspected materials and procedures used by manufacturers. The shirts were found to meet all longevity requirements. The fading or discoloration alone will not make an undershirt unserviceable, according to ALMAR 291-86.

Improper laundering and use of oxidizing agents have been tabbed as the biggest causes of fading/discoloration. The message said that while there is no way to prevent eventual fading, there are ways to prevent premature discoloration or fading.

Future DPSC system green undershirts will include a sewn label which lists recommended laundering procedures. Among those are not allowing the green undershirts to come in contact with oxidizing agents, not using bleach or detergents with bleaching agents, using permanent press cycle for laundering or hand wash in either cold or warm water and tumble dry using the permanent press cycle or drip dry on a rust-proof hanger (out of the sun's direct light).

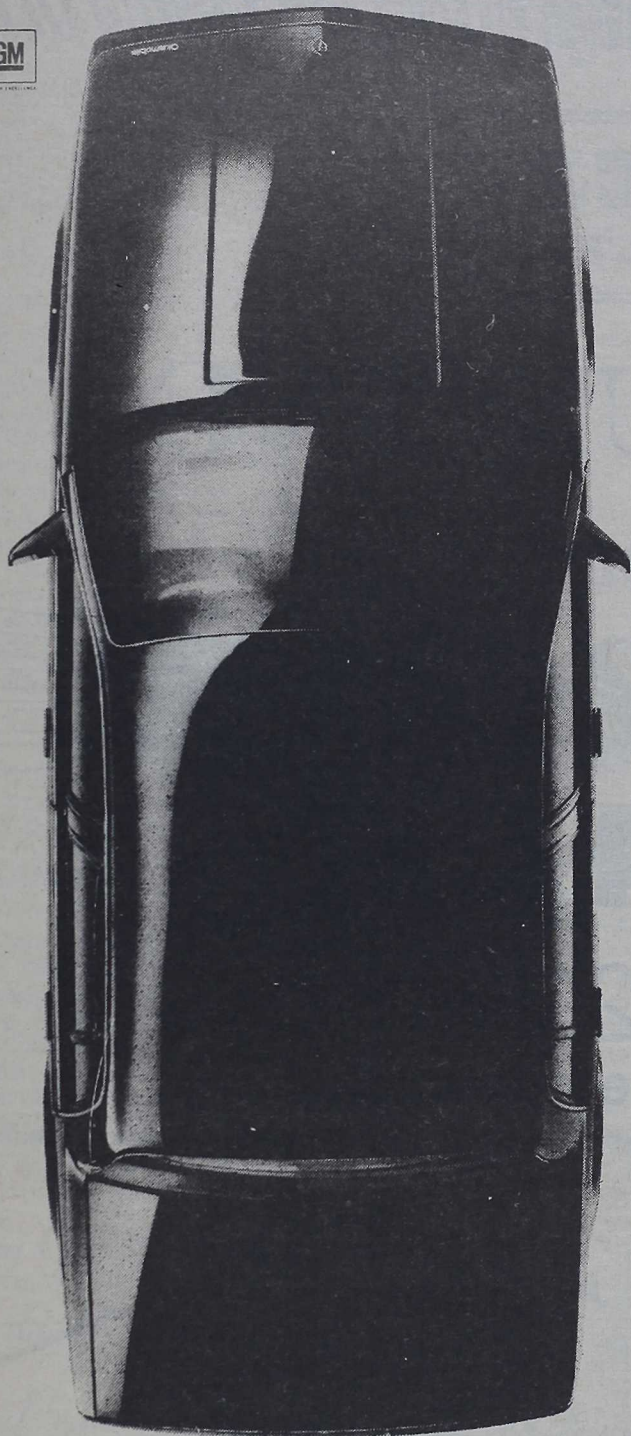

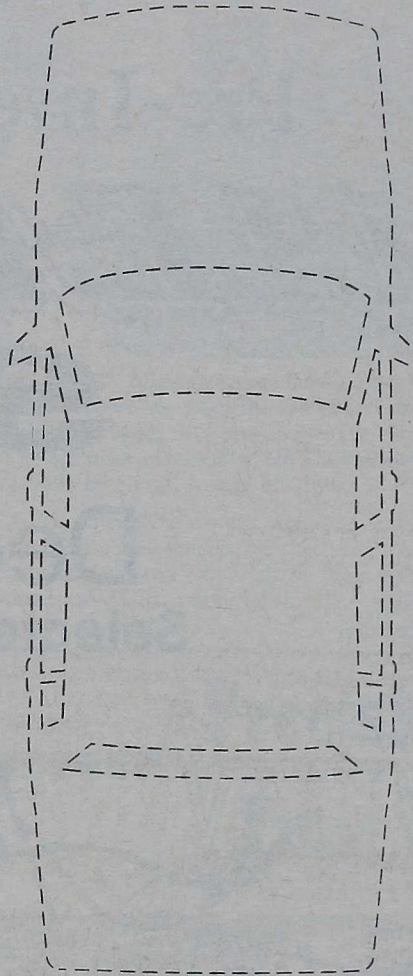

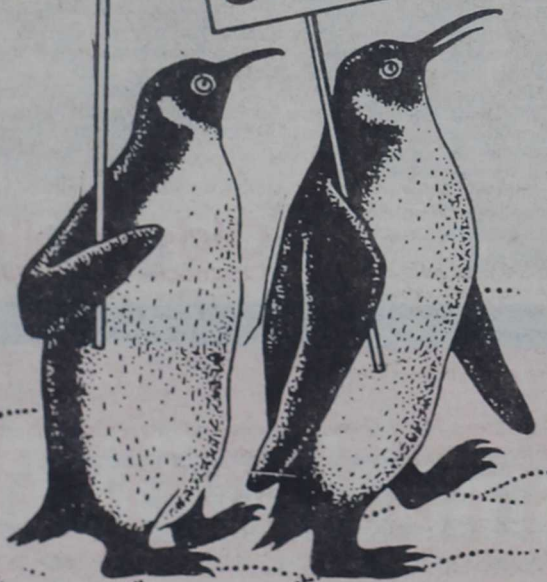

# 26th MAU completes 16-day training exercise

It was a scene all too familiar in today's world—Americans caught in the middle of a combat situation with no means to defend themselves and no way to get out.

This is the type of scenario that would be made to order for the Marine Amphibious Unit and their naval counterpart, the Amphibious Squadron. It is also the basic type of situation that faced the 26th MAU and PHIBRON-4 at the conclusion of their 16-day training evolution off the coast of North Carolina.

The entire training exercise began Dec. 1 with the departure of Marine Medium Helicopter Squadron-261 from New River to their new floating flightline aboard the *USS Inchon*.

The 26th MAU embarked Dec. 3 and PHIBRON-4 was assigned as the Amphibious Ready Group following increased unrest in the mythical country of 'Onslow.'

The rest of the 26th MAU, made up of Battalion Landing Team, 3d Battalion, 6th Marines, MAU Service Support Group-26; and Headquarters, 26th MAU embarked on Dec. 5 aboard the four remaining ships of PHIBRON-4 (*USS Nashville*, *USS Whidbey Island*, *USS Newport* and *USS Spartanburg County*).

On Dec. 9, the Commanding General, Fleet Marine Force Atlantic and Commander, 2d Fleet assigned the MAU as the Combat Landing Force with the PHIBRON as the Combat Amphibious Task Force. The unrest in 'Onslow' had escalated to the point of endangering the

lives of American tourists and embassy personnel.

Having collected vast amounts of information regarding 'Onslow' during the past few weeks, the intelligence sections of both units began to pass on what would be needed to form a plan, from defenses of 'Onslow' to the number of Americans caught in the middle.

Finally on Dec. 11 the execute order was issued and plans began to finalize.

Because of a simulated missile defense site, the ship could not get within 40 miles without risking attack. First priority would be to knock out this missile site.

Permission was given to insert a reconnaissance team on Dec. 13. They would provide needed site location information for a helo-borne assault using jeeps equipped with M-60 machineguns and the new MK-19 40mm grenade machinegun.

"It (the MK-19) is really a devastating weapon," said Lance Corporal Mike Hubbert, MK-19 Team Leader with Weapons Company, 3/6. "It can blow a hole almost one foot in diameter in any target."

During the early evening of Dec. 14, using the cover of darkness, stealth and a last-minute diversion, the four-jeep assault team from weapons Company, 3/6 fired on and destroyed the missile site.

As the Task Force moved to shore to evaluate the Americans, other elements of 3/6 set up an evacuation center on shore to process the evacuees before transporting them aboard the incoming LCUs back to the waiting Navy ships.

The last piece of the evacuation fell in-

to place as the embassy personnel were located, processed and loaded on the helicopters at the embassy which at the time had protestors demonstrating outside the gates to the compound.

The evacuees from the embassy arriv-

ed aboard the *Nashville* and as the sun rose the morning of Dec. 15, the evacuation was completed.

Ninety-five Americans, who twenty-four hours earlier were in harms way, were safely aboard the ships of PHIBRON-4.

## Prisoners make toys in support of reserve program

The Christmas season seems to bring out the best in everyone, including a group of prisoners at the Camp Lejeune Brig.

The prisoners have been making toys. Sergeant Barry L. Rocker, brig workshop supervisor, initiated the toy-making program, which will support the United States Marine Corps' Reserve Toys for Tots.

"The program is really beneficial in two ways. Making toys give the prisoners a broader perspective of how to build things and after the toys are finished they will bring happiness to children who might not have had a very merry Christmas otherwise," Rocker said.

The prisoners used their skills to make small and large rocking horses, rocking chairs, teeter-totters and doll cradles. All painting and decorating was also done in the brig workshop.

"Before we started making the toys, I brought in some different plans," Rocker said. "After looking them over, I chose things I thought kids would like to see under the tree. Then we went to work. To make the first large rocking horse one prisoner drew a horse, then another went to the saw, and using his idea, cut out a rough model. One of the Marines brought in a small rocking horse, and we used that as a model also.

"I built the first doll cradle and we did all of the painting ourselves," Rocker added. "I bought a coloring book and we copied the designs onto the cradles from

those patterns. The prisoners also stained the rocking horses and put the yarn manes on them."

All of the wood used to build the toys was free; the prisoners collected it from the landfill. Wooden crates, pallets, boxes . . . the prisoners found them and carried them back to the workshop. There the wood was planed and cut down to usable sizes.

"These guys really put everything they've got into this project," Rocker said. "A lot of the prisoners have kids of their own at home. This allows them to participate in the Christmas season, help put a gift under the tree for a less fortunate kid and learn new woodworking skills.

"The 20 or so prisoners who made the toys really enjoyed it. This is the first year we have done anything like this and it was a big success. The wood was free; we provided the initiative and labor. It was a great way to take part in the holiday spirit," Rocker said.

The toy-making program was fully supported and endorsed by Major E. N. Williams, commanding officer, Brig Co., Support Battalion, Marine Corps Base and Master Sergeant L. J. Ford, industries chief.

"Initially, we weren't sure how the program was going to go over," said Williams. "But the prisoners worked extremely hard to put the toys together in time for Christmas. They enjoyed it. What an excellent way to celebrate the holidays . . . to put a toy under the tree for a child!"



## Chanukah ceremony dates back to regime of Greco-Syrian King

Chanukah candles will glow at the Jewish Chapel and approximately 120 homes here and in the Jacksonville area in the celebration of the Jewish Festival of Lights.

Chanukah begins at sundown on Dec. 26.

The celebrations have both a political and historical origin. Chanukah commemorates the Hebrew struggle for religious freedom from the regime of the Greco-Syrian King.

In the year 168 B.C., Antiochus ordered that the temple in Jerusalem be used for pagan practices. The Jews, under the leadership of Judah Maccabees, rebelled and achieved victories which culminated in the reconquest of Jerusalem and the purification of the temple.

According to legend, all the oil for the holy lamps of the temple had been defiled

by the pagans. Only one untouched cruse of oil was found. The oil, a single day's supply, lasted for eight days.

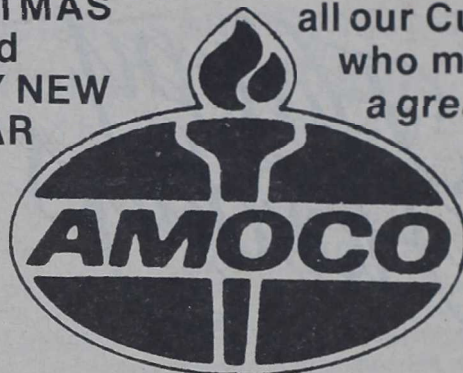
Chanukah is celebrated by lighting candles every night of the holiday, beginning with one the first night, until finally on the eighth night, eight candles blaze in the Chanukah menorah or candelabrum.

This progression is also a symbol of Judaism's belief in the gradual constant increase of intellectual light, and the victory of spiritual enlightenment over darkness. The holiday is observed with religious services, prayers, and hymns in Jewish Chapels, synagogues, homes, and religious schools throughout the world.

Jewish personnel stationed at Camp Lejeune will celebrate the Chanukah Festival Dec. 26 with a potluck dinner, a religious service, a magic show and refreshments at the Jewish Chapel, Bldg. 67, beginning at 7 p.m.

# Combat Readiness

## Marines find strengths, weaknesses during test

Artillery support is a key factor for a successful combat mission. Training must be intense and evaluation critical when determining the effectiveness of a battery. First Battalion, 10th Marines, 2d Marine Division, met the challenge of that task during their Marine Corps Combat Readiness Evaluation Dec. 16-18 at Tactical Landing Zone Crow. "We're being graded on every aspect of our mission," said Corporal Michael J. Dey. "The idea here is to show the evaluators we know our jobs if we ever have to set up in a hostile country."

The cannoneers began their three-day MCCRES with a sweep of the training area by an advance party. "Among other things, they determine gun positions, where fighting holes will be dug and where the fire direction center will be located," said Lance Corporal George Hinton. "Then we put nets up, dig in and run comm wire from each gun."

According to Hinton, the first round was fired down range at 8:15 a.m. the first morning of the MCCRES. For three days evaluators observed the performance of 1/10 as they endured cold temperatures and rain.

In order for effective firing, good coordination is needed between the forward observer, Fire Direction Center and the gun line. "In this case the forward observer designates targets, but in combat the call for fire could come from a rifle team, recon, ANGLICO, radar or an air observer. There are many different possibilities," said Gunnery Sergeant Chris Holley, noncommissioned officer-in-charge of the Fire Direction Center.

"Here at Camp Lejeune we can get a round downrange in about two-and-a-half minutes after the call for fire comes in to us."

During this time, 1/10 kept always on the alert and staged many reactionary drills. Once getting the call "react up" men fell into defensive positions ready to fire in case of an enemy attack.

The Marines of 1/10 take their training seriously. As the artillery regiment for the 2d Marine Division, the 10th Marines have been called upon to provide artillery elements serving in the 6th Fleet and also supplying cannoneers for the various exercises staged by the division. MCCRES is just another way for these artillerymen to display their combat readiness.

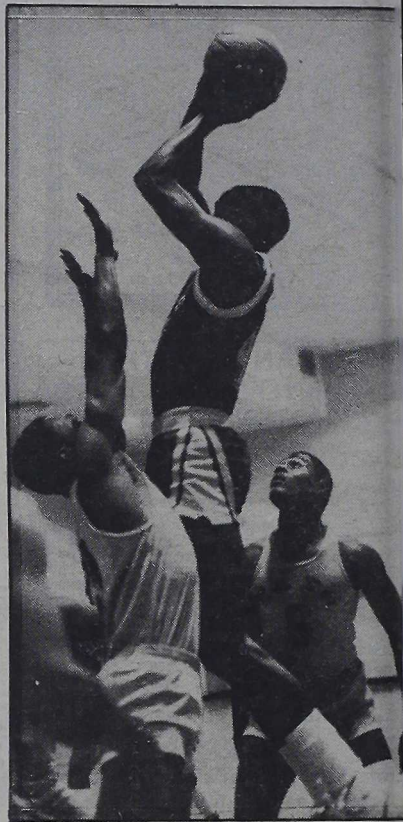

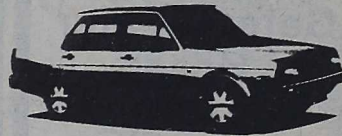

Seventeen-year-old Larissa models herself after the great Moroccan cross country runner, Said Aouita. He has several world records and the times he has lost has only been by seconds.

Larissa is a senior this year and plans to attend either Wake Forest or Duke University in the fall to study research biology and microbiology. While at college, she will be running for the team and completing her goal to someday finish a marathon.

At school, Larissa is the president of the National Honor Society, president of the French Club and captain of the Quiz Bowl.
