#### Two Decades On, RIA Joins Community in Remembering 9/11 Attacks

Two decades have passed since the 9/11 terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001; one decade has passed since Rock Island Arsenal dedicated a memorial both to those who died in the attacks and who have given their lives in military service since. On Sept. 10, members of the RIA



community, and of the surrounding Quad Cities community of Illinois and Illinois, gathered at the memorial for a late morning ceremony honoring and remembering the victims of the attacks and the service members who have given their lives in combat in the past 20 years. The memorial consists of two small towers made of brick, symbolizing the twin towers of the World Trade Center that came down in the 9/11 attacks, and a replica of the Pentagon, which was also attacked that day. One of the brick towers is marked with a gold star, representing those who have died in military service, while the other is marked with a blue star, representing those continuing to serve today. A plaque at the memorial reads, "We will carry their legacy into the future and forever honor their selfless sacrifices in the name of freedom." During the ceremony, local first responders placed a firefighter's

helmet and a police officer's cap atop the brick towers, in honor of the first responders who gave their lives on Sept. 11 while trying to save others. Leonard and Brenda Luxmore, the parents of Bryant "B.J." Luxmore of New Windsor, Illinois, then carried and placed a wreath at the memorial; Cpl. Luxmore was killed in action while serving in Afghanistan in 2012. (More: www.army.mil/article/250149)

### 'Instantaneous Change': Rock Island Arsenal Changed Security Protocols Following 9/11

Rich Gonzalez, physical security chief, Physical Security Division, U.S. Army Garrison Rock Island Arsenal recalls the biggest changes that came after the terrorist attacks: "The largest and instantaneous change that everyone in the Quad-Cities and our workforce will always remember is that the Arsenal was an open post, meaning a person could drive onto the installation without an ID check; today a visitor's pass is required."While that was a huge change we have excellent security and in the wake of 9/11 and through the years the security has become more and more efficient to allow us to guard against anyone who would do us harm while allowing



visitors quick and speedy vetting to get a pass that will allow them access for a year. Those with a pass are encouraged to come visit anytime from dawn till dusk. We're part of the heritage of the Quad Cities, we're proud of that, we were before 9/11 and we still are now. I hope folks who might think that the Arsenal is 'Fort Knox' can know that while our security is top notch, you can visit and be part of the heritage and history that the Arsenal offers." (More:

## JMC, National Guard and Reserve Soldiers Move Munitions, Save Taxpayer Money with Operation Patriot Press

Joint Munitions Command, seven subordinate depots and more than 1,000 U.S. Army National Guard and Army Reserve Soldiers moved almost 9,000 tons of munitions as part of Operation Patriot Press this year, increasing both depot and Soldier readiness. The annual exercise, which ran from mid-May to the beginning of August, allowed National Guard and Reserve Soldiers to access hands-on, real-world training to improve their Army occupational skills, opportunities that are typically difficult for these troops to acquire. "Soldiers are actually able to do their jobs during Operation Patriot Press," 1st Lt. Michael Shoop, OPP



liaison officer for the 246th Transportation Battalion, Michigan Army National Guard out of Jackson, Michigan, said. "It's great experience for our newcomers and returning Soldiers to come practice driving longer distances and doing onload and offload procedures." The Soldiers transported munitions JMC already needed to move to other depots that are better aligned with respective installation capabilities for demilitarization and maintenance. #### Biden Calls Unity America's Greatest Strength on 9/11 20th Anniversary

Unity in America is the nation's greatest strength – reflected by a coming-together of U.S. citizens in the days and months that followed the greatest attack on U.S. soil by terrorists on Sept. 11, 2001, twenty years ago, President Joe Biden said. Speaking to the nation in a recorded address yesterday from the White House, the president addressed the nation and the families of the 2,977 people from more than 90 nations who were killed that fateful day at the World Trade Center in New York City, the Pentagon in Washington, D.C., and a countryside field in Shanksville, Pennsylvania — in addition to the thousands more who were injured.

#### Army to Create Independent Entity to Oversee Sexual Assault Cases


To better protect Soldiers from sexual harassment and assault, the Army will establish an office designed to make decisions to take action on such crimes, the service's top civilian leader said Sept. 7. "We have a moral responsibility to take care of our Army family like it's our own family," said Secretary of the Army Christine E. Wormuth during a livestream of the National Discussion on Sexual Assault and Harassment Prevention at America's Colleges, Universities and Service Academies. Under direction from the Defense Department, each of the nation's military branches will create similar offices amid growing concerns of sexual harassment and

#### **DoD to Observe Constitution Day, Citizenship Day**

The Department of Defense will observe Constitution Day and Citizenship Day, Friday, Sept. 17, to commemorate the signing of the U.S. Constitution in Philadelphia on that day in 1787. Specifically, Congressional Appropriations Bill H.R. 4818, P.L. 108-447, requires federal agencies to provide new employees with educational and training materials on the U.S. Constitution as part of the new employee orientation materials; and provide all federal agency employees educational and training materials on the Constitution. To assist in celebrating this event, training and educational materials will be provided to all DoD employees to encourage them to hold ceremonies and special programs. The Web site provides useful information and resources, including an interactive course that helps people learn more about the Constitution and how this landmark document continues to guide this nation. The Deputy Under Secretary of Defense for Civilian Personnel



Policy said in 2008 that we have a special obligation to understand and appreciate the Constitution and the role we each play in providing "for the common defense. Observance of Constitution Day and Citizenship Day is one way for each of us to take some time to reflect upon our civic duties, rights and obligations through a renewed appreciation of this document." ### DoD Extended Policy Guidance For Identification Card Operations During the Corona Virus Disease 2019 Pandemic

The Rock Island Arsenal DEERS/ID Card Office is operating at full capacity to serve our supported customers. We ask that customers continue to observe masking and social distancing to protect the many higher-risk personnel in the population we serve. For those customers unable or uncomfortable visiting the facility, the Department of Defense has extended the expiration dates of Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards. Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness: In view of the DoD's limited ability to return Identification (ID) Card facilities to normal operations while continuing to comply with local pandemic safety precautions, I am extending the temporary policy guidance at the reference for Uniformed Services ID (USID) cards that expired between Jan. 1, 2020 and July 31, 2021 only, through:

- Oct. 31, 2021: Dependents of Active Duty Uniformed Service members; Reserve and National Guard Uniformed Service Members and their dependents.
- Jan. 31, 2022: Retirees and their dependents; all other populations. USID cards that expired before Jan. 1, 2020 or that expire after July 31, 2021 have not been

#### **Building 212 (SE) Overhead Door Repair**

#### **Army Announces Implementation of Mandatory Vaccines for Soldiers**

The Army outlined its plan today to fully comply with the Secretary of Defense's order requiring all Service members to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The Army began implementing the Secretary of Defense's order on Aug. 24, following DoD and White House guidance. Before then, vaccines had been optional. "This is quite literally a matter of life and death for our Soldiers, their families and the communities in which we live," said Lt. Gen. R. Scott Dingle, the U.S. Army Surgeon General. "Case counts and deaths continue to be concerning as the Delta variant spreads, which makes protecting the force through mandatory vaccination a health and readiness priority for the total Army." While Soldiers who refuse the vaccine will first be counseled by their chain of command and medical providers, continued failure to comply could result in administrative or non-judicial punishment – to include relief of duties or discharge. Soldiers have the ability to request an exemption from receiving the vaccine, if they have a legitimate medical, religious or administrative reason. Soldiers who are pending exemption requests will not be subject to adverse actions until the exemption is fully processed. (More: www.army.mil/article/250277)

#### Army Tests New EFMP System, Targets Assignment Process For Select Families

The Army is currently piloting a new Exceptional Family Member Program online enrollment process to improve the assignment research and selection process for EFMP participants, G-9 officials said Thursday. Close to 300 Soldiers and family members are participating in the initial test of the integrated Army Enterprise EFMP system, or E-EFMP, from Aug. 27 through Sept. 30, said Paul Grossman, EFMP lead for Soldier and Family Readiness, Army G-9. The new system should reduce the time Soldiers and families dedicate toward investigating care and support options during the permanent change of station process, Sgt. Maj. of the Army Michael A. 



The Defense Commissary Agency's commissary on Rock Island Arsenal is open to eligible patrons Tuesday through Saturday 8 a.m. – 6:30 p.m. The Arsenal Island workforce is reminded that Commissary eligibility is restricted to authorized Commissary patrons as defined by Department of Defense Instruction 1330.17, DoD Commissary Program, to include active duty, Guard and Reserve

members, military retirees, Medal of Honor recipients, 100 percent disabled veterans, and their authorized family members. Veterans with a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) documented service-connected disability rating became eligible for commissary shopping effective Jan. 1, 2020. Please refer to this instruction for a complete list of authorized commissary patrons, including organizations and activities, along with qualifications and any exceptions such as access to U.S. commissaries overseas. Authorized Commissary patrons are encouraged to check out the Commissary to take advantage of recent services such as Click2Go (available Tuesday - Friday, 11 a.m. - 6 p.m.), and the Quick Lunch – Grab n Go Fueling Station located at the front of the store. Note: Please do not confuse <a href="DeCA Commissary eligibility">DeCA Commissary eligibility</a> with <a href="AAFES Exchange eligibility">AAFES Exchange eligibility</a>; the RIA Exchange became open to service-connected disabled veterans at the same time as the Commissary, but this year also became open to DoD CAC card holders.

#### **Rock Island Commissary is Conducting CLICK2GO**

Commissary CLICK2GO, the Defense Commissary Agency's new online ordering/curbside delivery service, is now at the Rock Island Commissary, according to Penny Callison, the store director. "This service really speaks to the needs of our customers who can now plan, order and pay for their purchases on-line and then just drive to the store to get them without having to get out of their vehicle," said Callison. Here's a brief rundown of Commissary CLICK2GO's features:

- Easy-to-use navigation and search functions to help customers plan healthy meals and take care of their family's needs
- Enhanced product information
- Robust recipe features
- Featured sales and promotions
- Upgraded mobile-friendly experience
- No service fee (it was waived on all orders for a limited time starting June 28)

First-time customers will need to create an account. In step with grocery shopping trends, DeCA is working to bring on-line ordering, payment and pick-up options to all commissary-eligible patrons. In early June the agency announced plans to expand Commissary CLICK2GO to all 236 commissaries worldwide, and the rollout status can be found on the agency's web site. "I encourage all our shoppers to access the CLICK2GO page on commissaries.com to learn more about it," said Callison. Customers use a computer or mobile device to make their orders online where they select from commissary products offered based on the store's stock assortment. After products are selected, the shopper selects a pickup time and pays for their order. At their appointed time they park in designated parking spaces where commissary workers bring their groceries.

#### **RIA Museum Closed For Renovation**

The Rock Island Arsenal transitioned from Health Protection Condition Alpha (HPCON A) to HPCON Bravo Plus (HPCON B+) effective Aug. 23. The decision to transition to HPCON B+ was made based on guidance outlined in the Secretary of Defense memorandum dated April 29, 2021, which takes into consideration increasing case rates and community transmission levels in and around the Quad Cities. Implemented measures under HPCON B+ includes enforcing social distancing in all gathering places, to include reduced gathering sizes to 40 percent normal capacity. Additionally, RIA is maintaining the current DoD indoor mask mandate applicable to the workforce, visitors, and contractors, for both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals, per the DoD memorandum dated July 28, 2021 – "Updated Mask Guidance for all DoD Installations and Other Facilities," stating installations must reinstitute mandatory use of masks indoors in geographic areas of substantial and high community spread of the COVID-19 virus as defined and publically identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
