## Expeditionary Disposal

DLA Disposition Services provides combatant commands with the ability to exercise expeditionary disposal operations worldwide.

Disposition Services has the ability to rapidly deploy portable, scalable Expeditionary Site Sets (ESS) with standardized equipment and supplies and a highly capable Expeditionary workforce that is fully mission capable shortly after arriving in theater.

**Note**: the Request for Forces drives the response time for ESS deployment.

ESS provides an expeditionary DLA Disposition Services capability to the warfighter in austere, limited support environments.

The ESS is packaged for surface and air transportation.
The ESS has a deployable capability that is integrated into combatant command plans and the Joint Operational Planning and Execution System.
