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AN ANALYSIS OF CIRO-PEARL INTELLIGENCE DERIVED 43 FROM GERMAN ARMY SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS BY SIGNAL DETACHMENT "D" DURING THE PERIOD 10 August 1944 - 12 May 1945.

SUMARY OF OPERATIONAL CTIVITY OF SIGNAL SECURITY DETACHMENT "D", COVERING THE PERIOD 1 SEPTEMBER 1944 TO 1 PRIL 1945

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#### 1. PURPOSE

This report is intended to summarize briefly the siga. nal intelligence mission assigned to Signal Security Detachment "D" and actions taken by that Detachment in the accomplishment of that mission. Although the Detachment began field operations as a unit in the middle of august 1944, 1 September was chosen as the starting point of this report since effective contacts with G-2 Section, 12th army Group Tactical Headquarters, and with the signal radio intelligence units in the field were firmly established by that date.

# 2. MISSION OF THE DETACHMENT

a. The mission assigned to the Detachment was the procurement of Signal Intelligence from the solution of enemy (German) medium and low grade tactical codes and ciphers for the aC of S, G-2, 12th army Group, the coordination and technical supervision of the Signal Radio Intelligence Companies and Signal Service Companies operating under units assigned to 12th army Group, technical liaison with adjacent army Group Signal Intelligence units and with those of higher headquarters, and the coverage of clandestine radio traffic for study by the Radio Security Service (British) and as required by the AC of S, G-2, 12th army Group. The latter mission, being somewhat separate and distinct from the provision of signal intelligence, will not be covered in this report.

The mission of the Detachment may be conveniently divided. into four distinct responsibilities:

(1) To Signal Intelligence Division, Ho ETOUSA.

(2) To G-2 Section, Tactical Headquarters, 12th army Group.

- (3) To Signal Radio Intelligence and Signal Service Companies, 12th Army Group.
- (4) To flanking army Groups (6th and 21).

c. The manner in which the mission was carried out, will be described in the sections of the report which follow.

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### 3. SIGNAL INTELLIGENCE DIVISION, HELDQUARTERS ETOUSA

a. Signal Security Detachment "D" was charged with the responsibility of enforcing the general signal intelligence policies of the War Department, Hq ETOUSA, and 12th Army Group, among the Signal Radio Intelligence units of 12th Army Group.

b. In addition, the Detachment provided the higher headquarters with the raw material and finished productions of all signal radio intelligence organizations of 12th Army Group.

(1) All signal intelligence and technical data were forwarded to the Signal Intelligence Division, OCSigO, Hq ETOUSA. This commitment included transmission to that office of all technical reports published by the Intelligence Branch of the Detachment (see Appendix C for a list of technical reports published by the Detachment). These reports were also disseminated to the Mediterranean Theatre of Operations, to British signal intelligence agencies in the United Kingdom and to the War Department, Washington, D. C., through the Signal Intelligence Division. Hq ETOUSA.

(2) Radiograms and teletype messages containing current information were prepared and transmitted at least twice daily. These messages reported all data collected by the Detachment in the course of its daily operations.

(3) Captured documents, received from signal intelligence units of 12th Army Group were processed, studies published, and copies forwarded to Signal Intelligence Division, Hq ETOUSL, for permanent files.

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4. G-2 SECTION, TACTICAL HEADQUARTERS, 12TH ARMY GROUP

a. Detachment "D" was charged with the responsibility of passing to the assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, 12th army Group, signal intelligence procured from the analysis of enemy low grade and medium grade (THUME, PEARL and CIRO PEARL) tactical traffic. This was accomplished in two ways.

(1) Direct telephone communication was available until 4 March 1945 when, due to the tactical situation, the Detachment operated too far in advance of Tactical Headquarters to allow unilization of metallic telephone lines. However, radio or teletype (or both) links maintained constant communieation from that date onwards. The appointment on 3 February 1945 of a liaison officer from the Detachment to G-2 Section also aided in the smooth flow and interpretation of signal intelligence.

(2) All pertinent technical reports published by the Detachment were transmitted daily to G-2 Section. These reports supplemented and enlarged upon the information already passed to G-2 Section by communication means described in paragraph a(1) above.

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b. A complete record of all signal intelligence, of immediate value only, transmitted to G-2 Section by telephone.
radio or teletype has been maintained by the Intelligence Branch of Detachment "D", but this record is too bulky for reproduction and inclusion in this report. However, for the sake of completeness, an estimate of the quantity of timely information reported during the period under review may be derived from the following figures:

c. It is not possible to evaluate the signal intelligence made available to G-2 Section, either in the form of immediately applicable information (i.e., location of Division or army ammunition, supply and fuel dumps, command posts, etc.), or in the form of confirmation of prisoner-of-war reports, large scale movements or intentions of major enemy formations and the appearance of new battle units in a given sector. As an approximation of the use made of the data received from Detachment "D", the CIRO PEARL, PEARL and THURB included in the daily G-2 ISUM are recorded in appendix 4 of this report. The G-2 ISUM was sent by teletype, operational priority, to the following headquarters:

d. It is of interest to note that an estimated 6,000 CIRO-FEARL messages were read during the seven-month period under discussion. Of these, 3238 messages from twenty-four different formations were published in CIRO FEARL/SSDD reports, which were transmitted to G-2, 12th army Group. It is of further interest that on the average either CIRO-FEARL, FEARL or THUME material, or all three, were included in one out of every three G-2 ISUNS.

### 5. SIGNAL RADIO INTELLIGENCE AND SIGNAL SERVICE COMPANIES 12TH ARMY GROUP

a. The mission of Detachment "D" in connection with the signal radio intelligence units of 12th army Group was subdivided into three categories:

> Reporting of Signal Intelligence of Immediate Value to army and Corps G-2's

(a) All technical signal intelligence of tactical value, particularly CIRO-PEAPL, was transmitted daily by the most expeditious means to the Army Signal Radio Intelligence Companies. Appendix B contains intelligence extracted from technical messages sent to the field units during a typical month. This intelligence was used in two different ways:

(1) It was reported to army and Corps G-2's.

(2) It was employed as a basis for allocating intercept and direction-finding coverage priorities.

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(b) The most convenient means of transmission of technical signal intelligence to the field units was radio, teletype and courier. Two radio broadcasts were made daily, one in the morning and one in the early evening to establish coverage priorities and to assist in the preparation of technical reports for the respective G-2 Sections. Technical signal intelligence was also transmitted by the same means at any hour of the day or night when the urgency of the information

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(2) Consolidation of Technical Material of all Field Units

(a) All technical data from the signal radio intelligence units of 12th Army Group were consolidated daily with those obtained by the two intercept units directly responsible to Detachment "D" and with data received from intercept units of the two flanking Army Groups (6th and 21). Items of immediate value were transmitted along with intelligence described in paragraph a preceding. In addition, all such data were published in greater detail in reports of the Intelligence Branch (see Appendix C) and dispetched to the field units.

(b) The daily publications of the Branch not only aided the field units in the normal execution of their missions, but provided the only means of maintaining technical continuity on enemy formations during the frequent moves of the field units. This was particularly true when army and Corps fronts were radically altered, resulting in an entirely new, and frequently unfamiliar, group of enemy units facing them.

> (3) Supervisory Control Over Operations of Signal Radio Intelligence Field Units

(a) Policies concerning operations emanating from higher headquarters, or those arising from within Detachment "D" from time to time, were distributed and enforced. Aid in complying with the policies was provided in the form of directives, special technical reports, and by conferences at the Detachment headquarters. Also frequent liarson visits to the field units were made by technical experts from the Intelligence Branch.

### 6. FLANKING ARMY GROUPS

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Continuous liaison was maintained with 21 and 6th Army Group signal radio intelligence agencies both by personal visits and by radio teletype and telephone communications on a twentyfour hour basis. All technical reports published were exchanged with those two organizations.

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AN ANALYSIS OF CIRO-PEARL INTELLIGENCE DERIVED FROM GERMAN AR Y SIGNAL COMMUNICATIONS BY SIGNAL SECURITY DETACHMENT "D" DURING THE PERIOD 10 AUGUST 1944 - 12 MAY 1945

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The mission of Intelligence Coordination Section, Intelligence Branch, Signal Security Detachment "D", included the processing of all textual material derived through analysis of German Army mediumand low-grade ciphers and codes which were passed on the 12th Army Group front during the period 10 August 1944 - 12 May 1945. This process embraced translation, interpretation and reporting. Evaluation of message content was accomplished through reference to files and records which contained current, collateral information about the enemy. It is with the evaluation of CIRO-FEARL Intelligence that this report is concerned, and particularly with the levels of information which were found to characterize CIRO-FEARL transmissions.

Examination of more than 6000 CIRO-PEARL texts during the period under review has shown that the major part of all information derived can be placed roughly into four main categories: (I) Information concerning unit locations and dispositions, (II) Situation reports and operational directives, (III) Troop movements, and (IV) Status reports, including a variety of unit statistical information observed in numerous message pro-formae. In the paragraphs which follow, consideration will be given to a number of selected items of CIRO-PEARL Intelligence representing and illustrating information stemming from the four classifications above. Information derived from PEARL and THUME will not be included in this report.

I. INFORMATION CONCERNING UNIT LOCATIONS AND DISPOSITIONS.

Some 4000 CIRO-PEARL messages of operationally important interest were reported to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, 12th Army Group in Signal Security Detachment "D" daily ISUMS. Of those items which were republished in the G-2, 12th Army Group, nightly ISUM to interested American and British agencies, over ninety percent were concerned with enemy Command Posts and Order of Battle. The fact that CIRO-PEARL analyses produced Order of Battle Intelligence about German divisions, often in as few as eight to twelve hours after message inter-

ception, placed an extremely high premium on the dissemination of such information.

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A. FORMARD AREAS.

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1. Unit Commend Posts -

The period during which CIRO-PEARL produced the maximum intelligence, both in quantity and in quality, occurred during the German "Ardennes Offensive", 16 December 1944 to 2 February 1945. Messages from thirteen divisional and similar formations in and near the "Bulge" area were read. The formations were, 1 SS PZ DIV "Leibstandarte SS Addif Hitler", 2 SS PZ DIV "Das Reich", 10 SS PZ DIV "Frundsberg", 12 SS PZ DIV "Hitler Jugend", 11 PZ DIV, 116 PZ DIV, 130 PZ "LEHR" DIV, 341 Stumgeschuetz Brigade, 766 Volksartillerie Korps, I SS PZ Korps, XIII Armee Korps, Wehrkreis VI and an unidentified armored division. The divisions listed represented the bulk of the armored and mobile formations employed by the Germans during the Ardennes operations and constituted the major threat to Allied forces. Consequently, the CIRO-PEARL intelligence gained from these formations not only indicated accurately the trend of operations carried out by all enemy units within the "Bulge" but also provided G-2 with reliable information at a time when other intelligence sources were relatively unproductive or non-eristent.

130 P2 "LEHR" DIV provided the most noteworthy example of continuous information during this period, particularly in the matter of divisional element CP's. CIRO-ELARL messages of 17 January 1945 have been selected to illustrate examples of high priority division and division element CP locations:

> 130 PZ LEHR DIV Ic (Intelligence): "DIV Ic located at <u>WEILER</u> (GSGS 4042/P 7268) on 17 Jan."

> PZ GREN REGT 901: \*Attempt communication with FGR 901 at WANDEBOURCY (P 642683) immediately...\*

PZ GREN REGT 902:

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"Kp/Pi Btl 130, for delaying action, will be with PGR 902 in the future and will move into <u>TAVIGNY</u> (P 6469)."

PZ PI BTL 130: "New Btl CP is at LEHRESAUEHLE (P 718668), 1.5 km SE of HOFFELT (P 7068)..."

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Heeres PI BTL 207 (attached to 130 PZ LEHR DIV): Send an empty truck immediately to MAULUS UEFLE (P 777676), 2 km S of BINSFELD (P 7870), to the CP of Heeres PI BTL 207 ... "

#### 2. Unit Dispositions -

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Often, CIRO-PEARL provided intelligence concerning the sectors which enemy units occupied or were to occupy. Information of this sort held a high value from an order of battle point of view. Messeges which announced Main Lines of Resistance, Outguard Lines of Resistance, Sector Boundary Lines, Sector Junction Points ad Neighboring Units frequently afforded G-2 a clear and reliable estimate of a specific enemy situation.

#### a. Main Lines of Resistance -

During the period wien Third US Army was thrusting southeastward from the Siegfried Line north of the Moselle River to the line: Rhine - Moselle Rivers (6 to 13 warch 1945) and, successively, while other forces of Third US Army and elements of Seventh US Army were driving to the Rhine through the Saar Palatinate (13 to 24 March 1945), 6 SS Gebirgs Jaeger DIV "Nord", newly arrived on the Western Front from Finland via Denmark, was making a determined stand just south of Koblenz. Its sector occupied the corner formed south of the confluence of the Phine and Moselle Rivers. Accurate, large-scale maps made possible the pinpointing of the divisional MLR as given in a text sent by SS Geb Aufkl Abt 6/6 SS Geb DIV Nord on 13 March reading: "American units are briding the Moselle along the MLR: BRODENBACH (GSGS 4346/ L 7980)- 'PT 281'(L 779791)- 'PT 315' (L 755778)- 'PT 316' (L 752766)-MUENDE ERBOCK (L 7375)-TREIS (L 6875)". Three days later, on 16 March, with American armored units encircling the sector, SS Geb Jg Regt 11 "Reinhard Heydrich"/6 SS Geb Jg Div Nord announced the divisional sector as enclosed by the line: "SCHAFBERG (unl)-BAFFENHECK (L 8482)- NE of UDENHAUSEI (1 8380)-BU CHHOLZ (1 8578) .

#### b. Outguard Lines of Resistance -

In early September 1944, when the German Armies were rapidly retreating through Eastern France and Belgium to the Siegfried Line, 2 SS PZ Div "DAS REICH" was retiring southeastward from the line: DIVANT-LIEGE, Belgium. On 7 September 1944, the Div Ia (operations) of 2 SS PZ DIV announced to Div elements that: "The Allies have presumably

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reached LIEGE from the West. 12 55 PZ DIV "Hitler Jugend" now has its furthest forward <u>Outguard Line of Resistance</u> west of HAMOIR (GSGS 4042/ K 4305)". The usefulness of this information at a time when Allied elements were feeling out an otherwise confused situation in the LIEGE area was immediate.

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## c. Boundary Lines -

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Also of extreme value in the reconstruction of enemy Order of Battle, boundary lines between enemy units, or between elements of enemy units, were announced in CIRO-PEARL on numerous occasions.

After the reduction of the Falaise Pocket in Northern France (16 to 22 August 1944), messages from 2 SS PZ DIV "Das Reich" on 24 August revealed much that was unknown concerning its exact whereabouts during its retreat toward the Seine. One message read:

•SS PZ Grenadier Regt 3 "Deutschland" is at ELEEUF (GSGS 4042/1019); SS PZ Grenadier Regt 4 "Der Fuchrer" is in the FORET D'ELEEUF. Boundary Line (between regiments): railroad. Front and reconnaissance to the southeast. Artillery located east of BOSC-ROGER EN ROUMOIS (M 0598). Reconnaissance battalion with DIV reserve at LE THUIT (several in area)."

#### d. Neighboring Units and Junction Points -

Contributing futher to the order of battle of an enemy sector was CIRO-P.ARL Intelligence relating to formations adjacent to a particular unit under observation and to the points of junction between such units. The following paragraphs, concurred with the relationship of 15 PZ Grenadier Div to its neighboring units at the beginning of operations east of Metz and Nancy, France, in September 1944, are quoted from CIRO-PEARL/SIGISUM/SSDD:

#### Messages of 15 September 1944:

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"At 1526 hours Gen. Lt. RODT (GG, 15 FG DIV) declared to Div Ib, 553 Inf Div that Flak Abt 200 <u>would hold its present position</u> and would defend itself to the last shot. Flak Abt 200 was reported subordinated to Inf Regt 1120/553 Inf Div. RODT requested a report on the number of machine guns still in use within the division sector that morning. Division radioed to 553 Inf Div at 1745 hrs explaining that of 38 mac ine guns set up, presumably at night, 32 remained in the morning."

#### Messages of 20 September 1944:

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DIV (15 PG Div) informed Hptm. SCHWERMANN of a Div element "that the junction with the 'left neighbor' was not to be made at the RR line: LUNEVILLE (Q 00)-MONORL SUR SEILLE (Q 01), but along line: LUNEVILLE-MARKINVILLER (V 19). At 1354 hrs the personality above, SCHERMANN, announced that the 'left neighbor' was I/PZ Regt 2102/102 PZ Brig and that this fromation had taken up the junction, mentioned above, at 1430 hrs."

#### B. REAR AREAS

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Material presented in the foregoing paragraphs has dealt entirely with enemy dispositions in forward areas. Feculiar to CIRO-FEARL Intelligence has been the additional information provided by units and echelons in the rearward areas, the importance of which often has surpassed that derived from formations in the line. Information, concerning the specific locations of motor fuel, ammunition and rations supply dumps, lines of communication, divisional repair shops, medical collecting points and dressing stations as well as replacement and training areas has not only been of immeasurable value to the Allied tactical air forces but also of value in completing the picture of enemy Order of Battle. Indications of intended redeployment at the MLR have frequently been obtained from announcements made by rearward formations.

1. Supply Dumps -

CIRO-PEARL announcements concerning the location of vital enemy fuel, ammo and food stores parallel in large measure those designating unit CP's. Throughout the campaigns in France, the Low Countries and Germany, Intelligence of this sort was eagerly anticipated.

a. Ammunition Dumps -

During the Ardennes Offensive the following message from 130 PZ Lehr Div radio supply channels announced on 8 January 1945:

"The Heeres Munilager, AOK 5, Gruppe von Manteuffel, is at STEIN, 5 km SW of MOCHAMPS (GSGS 4346/F3369); it will close down at 0200 hrs 9 January. Therefore, the following must be requisitioned immediately:

> 7.5 cm HE ammo, type 34 - for 7.5 cm Kw. K. 7.5 cm HE ammo, type 34 - for 7.5 cm PAK 048 Hy pointed MG ammo"

b. Fuel Dumps -

During the rapid retreat of the German armies in France and Belgium in September 1944, 9 PZ Div CIRO-PEARL co.munications



of 28 September announced the location of a large fuel and ammo dump:

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... in the forest 3 km from VILLERS-COTTERETS (GSGS 4042/S 6387)." (Note - the above mentioned dump was the largest supply dump captured intact in France. Two German general officers were surprised at breakfast when Allied annored forces took the area under command.)

c. Ration Dumps -

A text from 130 PZ Lehr Div on 5 December 1944 stated:

"Rations for 4 days may be drawn on 6 December in BRENBCHELBACH (QSQS 4346/Q 76)".

2. Lines of communication -

Of importance to the Allied Tactical Air Command were frequent messages revealing dispositions of enemy lines of communication. On 28 September 1944, 9 PZ Div announced the L of C for RGR 10 as: • CHERY (GSGS 4042/0 0225)-CHALANDRY (0 0527)-POULLY (0 0228).\*

3. Medical Dressing Stations -

Although of no stricly tactical value, intelligence concerning the location of enemy medical units has contributed to the compilation of enemy Order of Battle. The following message was sent on 3 January 1945 by 1 SS PZ Div "ISSAH" in the period immediately following the relief of Allied airborne troops at BASTOGNE during the Ardennes Offensive:

"HVP (main dressing station) is no longer at ALLERBORN (GSGS 4042/P 6661) but at ESELBORN (P 7564). Advance dressing station is at BRACHTENBACH (P 6959)."

1 SS PZ Div was in the process of redeployment when the above message was sent and the localities mentioned indicated more clearly much of the divisional redisposition.

4. Repair shops -

The locations of enemy repair units, especially heavy ordnance workshops and field tank repair shops, have also figured as priority targets for Allied air attacks. The following text was sent on 20 January 1945 by 130 PZ Lehr Div:

... 3rd Tank Repair Co located in area of BITBURG (GSGS 4346/L 1353)."

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5. Replacement and Training Units -

Often CIRO-PEARL messages from rear area divisional elements revealed the structure and location of enemy replacement and training units, particularly division field replacement battalions. On 23 November 1944, 11 PZ Div sent a series of messages dealing with the availability of replacements while that division was engaged in operations in the SAAR area. The messages included:

4346/Q 4844) because of proximity of enemy.

•... additional replacements may be obtained 10 km ENE of SAARALBE: (Q 4844) at KULHAUSE: (Q 5747). 50 men must be delivered to II Bn in GRUNVILLER (Q 4449).

a. Field heplacement Battalions -

While 15 PZ Grenadier Div was engaged in combat in the Siegfried Line north of AACHEN during November and December 1944, its CIRO-PEARL communications afforded a wealth of information concerning element dispositions. On 6 December the divisional staff section IIa (officers' Affairs) requested of the Feld Ersatz Bataillon a status report pertaining to the organization of (a) The divisional combat school and (b) The Field Repl Bn as of 4 December. The reply to Div IIa read:

(a) Combat school now located in GELLEP (GSGS 4346/ ▲ 2605). Strength: 1 Off. 48 NOOs. 15 ORs.

(b) Field Repl Bn: HQ in LANKLATULY (A 2601). Strength: 4 Off. 8 NCOs. 36 ORs.

1 Co now with R/T course of instruction at advance observers school and A/T Escort Co in OSTRATH (F 2292). Strength: 5 Off. 43 NCOs. 156 ORs.

2 Co with course of instruction for snipers in KREFELD-OPPU: (A 2104). Strength: 2 Off. 21 NCOs. 72 ORs.

3 Co is in STRATUL: (A 2503). Strength: 21 Off. 136 NCOs. 4(?)(?) ORs.

4 Co is engaged in course of instruction in KREFELD. Strength: 5 Off. (7)4 NOOs. 128 ORs.

Situation as of 4 December: Newly arrived March Bn not included in this account. 1 Co will be transferred to LANKLATU. whenever the vacating of its present locality is intended."

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This text reveals that the Repl and Training area of 15 PZ Gren Div was some distance to the north and east of the division - information of value to the Allied Tactical Air Command.

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b. Wehrkreis Training Units -

During the entire period under review an intermittent source of intelligence was an administrative radio network of Wehrkreis VI whose headquarters was in MUENSTER (GSGS 4346/A 97). The units and formations subordinated to this command were largely replacement and training elements which provided the bulk of supplies and replacements for SS PZ AOK 6, the 6th SS Armored Army, which contributed the heaviest impetus to the Ardennes Offensive in December 1944 and January 1945. On the initial day of the offensive, 16 December, CIRO-PEARL messages from Wehrkreis VI announced the following CP's:

6. Billeting Areas -

Occasionally, units withdrawing from the MLR into reserve announced the locations wherin they were to be billeted. 2 SS PZ Div "Das Reich" provided an excellent example of a message announcing new quartering and billeting areas for a Regiment on 14 October 1944. 2 SS PZ Div was retiring into the PRUEM (GSGS 4346/L 07) area, and one (unidentified) PGR announced:

"The following movements will be carriedout into the new billeting area.

- a. Regt HQ and HQ Co to move into BERLINGEN (L 28)
- b. 6, 7 Cos to move from DREIS (L 38) into ZILSDORF (L 28)
- c. III Bn to move into DOCKWEILER (L 38)
- d. 10 Co to move into DREIS
- e. 11 Co, repair and fuelling echelon to move into KIRCHWEILER (L 28)
- f. 12 Co to move into HINTERWEILER (L 38)
- g. 13 Co and 14 Co/TROSS II to move from GEES (L 28) and BERLINGEN into NEROTH (L 27)

h. 16 Co to move into GEES."

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#### STITUATION REPORTS AND OPERATIONAL DIRECTIVES -II.

During the ten-month period under review, it was observed that the CIRO-FEARL Intelligence of widest scope and greatest interest originated in messages involving enemy situation reports and field orders. It was noted that whenever the enemy was retiring rapidly or otherwise engaged in extremely fluid combat, the need of subordinate energy units for precise and current information concerning their immediate situation (and also concerning the disposition and condition of Allied forces in or out of contact) elicited numerous detailed and accurate Sitreps and operational directives on the part of headquarters, generally at division level. Sitreps originating with Division Ia (operations) and passed down to lower commands included not only information concerning friendly and enemy troops, but also specific orders and directives which were to take effect as a result of the situation indicated. Intelligence concerning Allied disposition was most reliably reported in divisional Ic (Intelligence) reports and in Sitreps emanating from divisional reconnaissance and artillery elements.

#### .A. DIVISION IS SITREPS AND FIELD ORDERS

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130 PZ Lehr Div provided many excellent examples of CIRO-PLARL Sitreps in messages intercepted during the Ardennes Offensive. The texts below were sent on 23 December 1944, when the division was driving westward across northern Luxembourg into Belgium:

- 1308 hrs. Div Is to CG, 130 PZ Lehr Div: "The Oberbefehlshaber ACK 5 (5th Panzer Army) has again ordered a quick thrust to ST HUBERT (GSGS 4042/F 3161). OFENROHR is to proceed to GERIMONT (F 4258)."
- 1725 hrs, Div Ia to CG, 130 PZ Lehr Div: "Fourth U S Armored Div is advancing along line: RE-MAGNE (F 3956)-ST HUBERT (P 3161). SCHLUESSELBLUME (codename for IV/PA & R 130) to take up the line: RE-MAGNE (P 3936)-MOIRCY (P 3858)-VESQUEVILLE (P 3259)-ST HUBERT (P 3101), leaving protection on the flank. From there advance toward ROCHEFORT (F 2076) with advance Bn."

On the same day, 23 December, at the northern flank of the German salient, 116 PZ Div a nounced its dispositions and intentions for an impending attack in a Field Order. The following messages were sent by Div Ia: .

> "The Division is to launch an attack on HUTTON (GSGS 4042/P 3687) and will pull out during the night of 23/24 December leaving protecting forces."

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"As protecting forces the following will remain in the present MLR: a Bn of PGR 156 a Bn of GR 1130 (560 Inf Div) 2 Assault Gun Companies 1 Hy Howitzer Batt with sufficient ammo all (of these elements) to be under comd of C.O. Bn/PGR 156. "The following will pull out at last light: PZ Regt 16 FGR 60 PGR 156 3/PZ FI Bt1 675 I/PZ A R 146 III/PZ A R 146 (LOS 1 Hy How Batt.) distribution of these units (in convoy) to be: A. Gruppe BAYER (oberst.) PZ Regt 16 PGR 60 PZ A R 146 3/PZ PI Bt1 675 B. Gruppe GROLLMANN (Maj, FGR 156) FGR 156 (6 5 1/FGR 156) III/PZ A R 146 ( I Hy How Batt.) Route of March: BEFFE (P 4385)-DOCHALPS (P 4984)-SAMREE (P 5082)-LAFOCHE (P 4580). Further orders to be issued there. Order of March: Gruppe BAYER Gruppe GROLLMANN C.O. is at fwd Div CP." In more recognizable Sitrep style, the following message was sent by 15 PZ Grenadier Div during the rapid retreat of German

Forces across eastern France into Alsace and Lorraine during September 1944: Div Ia stated on 26 September -

\*1. Our right neighbor has penetrated to north point of the lake 1 km E of BURES (GSGS 4042/Q 11).

2. WILDSAU (unid unit codename) is forming a junction with 113 Panzer Brigade at the narrowing of the road between the lake and the canal, on the north bank of

the canal. Combat outposts are located in the Ferme Michelet (unl.) and in HENALINIL (Q 10)

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3. The forces becoming free, and until now actively engaged further east, are to be used for the reinforcement of the Western Front of the forest. 1 Kp is to be taken out as reserve.

4. Communications are to be maintained with the right flank of 113 PZ Bde by reconnaissance troops east of BURES.

5. Increased reconnaissance is to be advanced by reconnaissance troops as far as the line: BAUZELONT (Q 10)-BIENVILLE (Q 00) daily."

"Request through 3 FG Div exact decision as to disposition of the tanks. Tentatively assemble tanks and motorized elements in HANN SUR NIED (Q. 04) until exact decision is reached."

#### B. DIVISION IC SITREPS

After 4th U S Armored Div had relieved the 101st U S Airborne Div at BASTOGNE, 26 December 1944, during the Ardennes offensive, 1 SS PZ Div "ISSAH" took up a position on the eastern side of the corridor leading nort to BASTOGNE and attempted to seal off the Allied route of supply in a thrust to the west. On 6 January 1945 the Div Ic (Intelligence) of 1 SS PZ DIV sent a Sitrep reading:

> \*Enemy picture in front of our sector: Last night there was no prevailing security. Firm enemy strongpoints established as far as 500 meters south of church at LUTREBCIS (GSGS 4042/P 564529) and from sector maar LA-TANNERIE MILL (P 572508) around VILLERS LA BONNE EAU (P 574503).

Presumably, enemy has no intentions of attacking for the present in front of our sector. Our reconnaissance unit was able to advance through a break in the line west of PT 475 (unl) to the south on road "T" at PT 405 (unl) and from there to the west via SCHLOSS LOSANGE (P 556526) without making direct contact with the enemy. To the east and west of the road there were several unguarded vehicles with heavy machine guns and large calibre machine guns.

At present there is enemy rifle and arty fire as heretofore.

The western edge of VILLERS LA BONNE KAU was found to be mined.

Query: How is situation at ISCHPELT (P 65)-DONFHOLZ (P 6453)?"

1. Reconnaissance Reports -

Communications from reconnaissance elements have often accurately described the situation at the MLR both as to disposition of enemy and of Allied troops. Although the greater number of reconnaissance Sitreps were derived through PEARL analyses, CIRO-PEARL also produced its share, usually in texts of greater accuracy and length. The following series of messages were selected from the transmissions of two German armored divisions, 116 PZ and 130 PZ Lehr Divisions, during the Ardennes offensive.

116 PZ Div Rcn elements 23 December 1944:

- 1200: "Apparently 20 tanks at MARCOURAY (P 4482), possibly out of gas...Bridge at MARCOURT (F 4285) blown. Locality free of the enemy. The Regt is to block the road: BEFFE (P 4385)-MARCOURT in the area of 560 (Inf Div); blocking has already been begun by 8/GR 1130/560 Inf Div."
- 1245: "Strong enemy infantry attack with tanks from MY (P 3990) repulsed. Enemy is attacking MELINES."

1310: "Enemy attack on MELINES repulsed. Further strong enemy pressure."

1340: "Relief of FGR 60 will be taken care of by I/ GR 1130 (560 I.D.). C.O. to report personally at PGR 60."

1440: "MARCOURT free of the enemy. Bridge blown at MARCOURT. Ostensibly, 20 to 30 enemy tanks are there. Roads have been blocked. Tanks have been ordered to surrender"."

 (This message referred to the tactical envelopment of U S "Task Force Hogan", a part of 33 Armored Regt/U S 3rd Armored Div. Eventually this force was able to find American lines, but tanks were wrecked and abandoned.)





130 PZ Lehr Div Rcn elements 24 December 1944:

0925: "Attack toward ROCHEFORT (P 2177) gaining slowly on the ground."

1000: "Send vehicles only north of BASTOGNE (P 5558). Roads south of BASTOGNE may be impassable."

1045: Bridge at ROCHEFORT blown.

1055: "Main Dressing station in ST HUBERT at cathedral."

1110: "Fighting egainst strong enemy resistance. ROCHE-FORT is taken; the existing bridges have been blown. Send bridging column forward."

1147: "Set up advanced PW cage at ROCHEFORT."

1305: "Our own bombing attack on BASTOGNE was observed today at 0930 hrs."

1550: "About 1530 hrs our own bombing attack and low flying attack took place at BASTOGNE."

1635: "Large formation of Luftwaffe observed over BASTOGNE. 178 enemy transport planes are dropping supplies of all kinds."

2. Artillery Reconnaissance Reports -

While most intelligence pertaining to divisional artillery operations was derived from PEARL sources, as in the case of reconnaissance unit reports, some CIRO-PEARL texts were read which also provided coverage of artillery observation. The CIRO-PEARL message below is contemporaneous with the reconnaissance messages preceding and differs from them only in subject matter. It was passed on 23 December 1944 by an unidentified formation which was engaging American forces in the Siegfried Line just north of the salient created by the Ardennes offensive.

Daily Report of 23/12:-

Continued strong enemy arty activity during the night in arty sectors: BUTGENBACH (GSGS 4346/ K 9104), BERG (K 9205), WEYWAERTZ (K 8805), NID-RUL (K 9006), ELSENBORN (K 9207), ELSENBORN LAGER (K 9008), SOURBROD (K 8610), ROBERTVILLE (K 8507).

Estimated enemy armo expenditure: over 1500 rds.

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# Recombitered target areas:-

In target area 404, tanks at (GAUSS KRUEGER: 14820/91980 - LAMBERT: K 914073).

- In target area 405:
- 6 Light Hows at target 405 exactly.
- 2 Hy Cannon at (GAUSS: 13100/93150 LAMBERT (K 892098).
- 2 Hy Cannon engaged 4 km N of XHOFFRAIX (K 8108)

In target 405 violent infantry and tank battles north of KUNGELBERG . . . (part missed). Concentration of fire exactly on mortar positions north of RR station at WEYWAERTZ and strong infantry in area BUTGENBACH.

During the night there was motor vehicle and tank traffic on road: KALTERHERBERG (K 9214)-ELSENBORN (K 9207).

Isolated wehicle concentrations were dispersed by fire concentrations."

#### III. TROOP MOVEMENTS

From CIRO-PEARL analyses, numerous announcements of enemy unit troop movements came to light during the campaign in the West. Although most intelligence items of this nature dealt with localized redispositions and MLR readjustments, several notable instances of large scale and fairly long term troop movements appeared, involving formations up to the size of a division.

For the purposes of this report the mail movement of the armored and heavy weapons elements of 10 SS PZ Div "Frundsberg", from their rest and refit area in Holland southward to join the main body of the division, will be considered. A series of CIRO-PEARL communications pertaining to this rail movement were read from 13 to 19 December 1944, at the time when the Ardennes offensive was g tting under way. Just previous to this period the PZ Gren Regts (differ heavy weapons companies) of 10 SS PZ Div were attempting to hold back the Allied drive northeast of Aachen. The rest of the division, including: SS PZ Regt 10; SS PZ AA 10; 1/SS PZ Pi Btl 10; 1, 2/IV/SS PZ A R 10; 13, 14/SS PGR 21, 14/SS PGR 22 and III/SS PGR 22, was refitting in Holland, in the area of RUURLO (GSGS 4346/A 1387).

On 13 December the first indication that an important rail movement was in the offing appeared in a text addressed to Ostubaf. PAETSCH (C.O. SS PZ Regt 10) which read:

"By personal command of the Div C.O., the detraining point for 8 companies (of the PZ Regt) will be RR station at RHEINDALEN (F 0484). Empty RR cars will arrive here in 2 to 3 days. Loading of anno will be regulated."

By 15 December, the starting point of the rail movement became known in a message of that date announcing:

SURE

"The first empty train for PZ Regt has arrived at ELTEN (E 9264). Chief Railway Transport officer at TERBORG (A 0669) still has no orders from the General of Transport Command in ESSEN for the moving of all elements."

It was clear, then, that a large scale train movement from ELTEN to RHEINDALEN was shortly to be affected and that most of the divisional armor and heavy weapons were to be involved, - a prize forewarning to the Allied tactical Air command. However, flying weather was bad during this period and the plans for the train movement continued to progress.

Un 16 December, D-Day for the Ardennes Offensive, a CIRO-PEARL message from 10 SS PZ Div stated:

"... 10 SS PZ Div is to be placed in service farther south."

This announcement coincided with the withinswal from the MLR of SS PGRs 21 and 22 and with the train movement about to take place - information which indicated the reconstitution of the division as one unit.

Continuing CIRO-FEARL analyses for 18 December revealed that the entrainment of Div elements had already begun at ELTEN according to schedule. At 0305 hrs, 18 December, Starf. SANDER (C.O. SS  $\triangle$  R 10) reported to Div Ia:

"Loading order received tonight. Empty trains coming in rapidly. In addition to PZ Regt, Flak Cos - 14/SS PGR 21 ad 14/SS PGR 22, and (IG Co) 13/SS PGR 21 are to be loaded."

At 0755 hrs, 18 December, a message to Ostubaf PAETSCH read:

"5, 6, 7 Cos/PZ Regt - Transport No. 164361 left ELTEN 17 December at 0253 hrs. HQ Co, 1, 2 and 8 Cos/PZ Regt - Transport Nos. 164362.-63.-67 were dispatched, 17 December, at 1812 hrs."

Announcements that entraining operations at ELTEN were rapidly nearing completion appeared in CIRO-PEARL texts of 19 December. In one message of 0256 hrs, from an Ustuf SANDER at RUURLO to Div Ia, full in-

formation was finally gained pertaining to the designations of all Div elements participating in the movement operation. The message stated:

> Everything with the exception of Flak (IV/35 PZ & R 10) rear echelon has entrained. To depart during the evening:

SS PZ Regt 10 (2000 8 Co) SS PZ AA 10 1 Kp/SS PZ Pi Btl 10 1, 2 Batt./IV/SS PZ A R 10 -13 Kp/SS PGR 21 13, 14 Kpn/SS PGR 22 III/SS FGR 22 -

Three trains have already left. The remainder loading tonight and leaving early 19 Dec.

No information was obtained concerning the detraining at RHEIN-DALEN of Division elements involved; and consequently, it cannot be ascertained whether the entire movement was finally successful. It was possible, however, to report in good time on the development of the train movement by virtue of almost immediate CIRO-PEARL analysis for each day's messages.

#### IV UNIT STATUS REPORTS

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A prolific source of CIRO-PEARL In telligence was found in communications which contained a variety of unit status reports. The major part of these reports was transmitted in pro-forma fashion. Consequently, detailed study had to be made in the case of each individual message in order that exact interpretation could be effected. Unit Status Reports transmitted in CIRO-PEARL messages fell into four distinct categories: A. Tank States, B. Weapons states, C. Strength Reports and D. Supply Reports. The examples below which illustrate each of these categories, or any of their subdivisions, represent the most typical cases.

A. TATE STATES.

Armored and mobile formations often supplied CIRO-FEARL Intelligence concerning the state of their ability or preparedness to commit armor to battle. In August 1944, 10 SS PZ Div "Frundsberg" was striving to extricate itself from the fast closing Falaise Pocket. On 17 August, SS PZ Regt 10 sent the following tank state report:

> "Tank State: Available for operation: 1 FKw III 5 FKw IV 4 Assault guns - 17 -



Available within 14 days: 1 PKw III 5 PKw IV 3 Assault Guns

Available after 14 days: 14 PKw IV 17 Assault Guns"

#### B. WEAPONS' STATES.

In a fashion similar to tank states, status reports on the state of weapons' efficiency within an enemy unit ofter provided intelligence of importance. The following message was originated by SS PZ Jaeger Abteilung 2 of 2 SS PZ Div "Das Reich" on 18 September 1944 during the withdrawal of the division into the Westwall at PRUEL (GSGS 4346/L 07):

C. STRENGTH REPORTS.

By far the greatest number of unit status reports emanating from CIRO-PEARL dealt with the strength of enemy units. Strength reports included (1) personnel strength reports, (2) casualty reports and (3) Replacement reports. Often, various of these reports were combined, depending upon the pro-forms employed by particular enemy units.

1. Personnel Strength Reports -

Proof of the depleted strength of **SS** PZ Regt 10 of 10 SS PZ Div at the time of its attempt to escape from the Falaise Pocket was revealed in a message of 18 August 1944 announcing the strength of the entire regiment as:

Another typical strength return was announced by I Battalion of Regiment LAUBSCHER (SS PGR 21) of 10 SS PZ Div on 31 October 1944:

2. Casualty Reports -

341 Sturngeschuetz Brigade, while heavily engaged in the defense of the KOELN plain, requested on 12 December 1944 that all batteries furnish a survey of casualties sustained from "date of initial employment" until 12 December. One battery replied:

3. Replacement Reports -

Early during the Ardennes offensive 130 FZ Lehr Div began to sustain heavy losses, both in men and in equipment. CIRO-PEARL Sitreps indicated to a large extent, the sort of losses sustained. Occasionally, itemized loss and replacement reports appeared, which afforded a more exact appreciation of events. The message below was sent to the C. Sig. C. of the division on 24 December 1944:

> As far as can be ascertained: Total loss: 3 field telephones 2 pack telephones Personel loss: 2 telephone NOOS 2 telephone ORS

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- Most urgently needed personnel:
  - 2 Officers
  - 3 Radio NCOs
  - 18 Sending Operators

  - 10 Telephone ORs
  - 15 Radio car operators

#### D. SUPPLY REPORTS.

Intelligence concerning the enemy supply picture was always at premium value. CIRO-PEARL produced numerous items of supply intelligence, many of which were derived from characteristic message proformae. These proformae dealt predominantly with the fuel and ammunition status of enemy units. Req isition requests also appeared in proforma supply messages which, in themselves, offered valuable information concerning the state of supply.

1. Fuel and Ammunition Reports -

SS PZ Regt 1 of 1 SS PZ Div "ISSAH", while engaged in heavy combat in the Ardennes, filed the following fuel and anno report with the Div Ib (supply) on 12 January 1945:
