## IRAQI POLICE

Maysan Federal Police Officers attended a four-day course on combatives, taught by U.S. Forces Federal Police Transition Team and Company D, 4th Battalion, 6th Infantry Regiment. The Federal Police were able to send six Officers to attend the course which covered hand-to-hand fighting techniques. The training focused on dominant body positions, transitions, arm bars, and chokes. During the course, the Federal Police requested extra training on sparring to help them meet test their skills. The course given to the shurta is the same course taught to U.S. Army recruits and leaders.

In Dhi Qar, Iraqi police leaders inventoried a huge cache found at an improvised explosives device factory in June 2009, in Nasiriyah in order to prepare for the upcoming legal trial for the suspects involved with the materials.

Proper documentation of evidence captured by police is important for the Iraqi legal system.





Over 300 Iraqi Soldiers were recognized for completing the three-week Commando Course at Camp Ur near Nasiriyah. Each commando received training on their personal weapon, weapons maintenance and individual and small unit tactics. # DEPARTMENT OF BORDER ENFORCEMENT

2nd Battalion, 11th Brigade of the Department of Border Enforcement shurta at the Al Maeul Out Post detained three men and a truck attempting to smuggle large amounts of fish and birds to a local market. The Department of Border Enforcement escorted the men and their vehicle to the 1st Commando Company Headquarters at the Umm Sa'ah Border Fort, where they were questioned by intelligence shurta. The DBE determined that the men were illegally fishing and hunting, and may have been using poison to capture the animals. 500 birds were confiscated and one man was arrested for the illegal hunting.

The DBE have again proven their dedication to enforcing the law and their ability to disrupt illegal activity in their area of operations.

The PRT engineers made a survey of the roads using the GPS devices and took measurements, photos and established an initial plan to get a good road. This road will make transportation easier for people who live in southwest Maysan.
