Tax law enforcement will affect military registering their vehicles

Enhanced enforcement of a taxation law will affect Marines and Sailors concerning their motor vehicles' registration effective Jan. 1.

According to Crawford Collins, Onslow County Tax Administrator, an "ad valorem" tax on motor vehicles is in effect.

If military members claiming another state as residence are the sole owners of their vehicles, they need not worry about the law, as it will not affect them. However, if the members jointly own the vehicles with their spouses, the vehicles will be taxed for one half of their value.

The tax is 54 cents per 100 dollars of value. For instance, if a motor vehicle is valued at \$10,000, the tax would be \$54.

If their family members are the sole owners of their vehicles, claim another state as residence, but register their vehicles in North Carolina, it will be subjected to 100 percent taxation.

Collins advised that this is not a local initiative. It is sponsored by the state Department of Motor Vehicles, and will be strictly enforced.

"The Department of Motor Vehicles will refuse to reregister a motor vehicle if it has not been listed for tax purposes," he said.

"No matter when the vehicles are scheduled for their annual registration, servicemembers are advised to list the vehicles with the county tax ad-

ministrator's office between Jan. 1 and Jan. 31," said Lt. Col. Charles D. deputy staff judge advocate/Operations. "If the vehicle is not listed in that period, an additional 10 percent tax for late listing will be administered by county and possibly a \$100 fine."

Active-duty military members exempt from the tax thanks to the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act, which that military personnel stationed here orders need not be subjected to. Military members claiming Onslow County as their place of residence, however, are subjected to the tax.

So as the year comes to a close, New Year's resolutions are made, vicemembers are urged to list their vehicles as personal property for tax purposes at the county tax administrator's office at 39 Tallman next to the USO. For more information call the Onslow County Tax administrator's Office at 455-9700.

illery units reorganize

Artillery units will soon undergo a change in the Marine Corps, under its current plans to reorganize its forces to meet the requirements of protective memorandum 90-94, deactivates certain units while consolidating others. Changes will include the consolidation of the 10th and 11th Marines into the 10th Marine Regiment and the deactivation of three general support battalions and two of the M109s from the active force. Units being deactivated include November and December 1989, 5th Bn., 12th Marines in March 1989; 10th and 11th Bn., 5th Bn., both of 10th Marine Regiment, 5th Bn., 11th Marines, Oscar Bn., 12th Marines in October 1989. The consolidation of these units will become additional units of similar artillery units in the selected Marine Corps Reserve until fiscal year '92. The 10th Bn., 12th Marines and 4th Bn., 11th Marines, scheduled to "stand up" this year, will not be activated. To Maj. Larry Brown, MAGTF structure officer, War Fighting Center, Quantico, Va. 22134. He noted, however, that these artillery units, those mentioned above, are scheduled to be activated as reserve artillery in fiscal year '92. The 10th and 11th Marines will also be deactivated. The TAB 10th Marines, scheduled to activate this year, will be deactivated. The majority of personnel formerly assigned to these units will be incorporated into the regimental headquarters battery as the Counterbattery Radar. Some additional personnel will be

augmented into the communication, supply, motor transport and personnel sections.

The meteorological section of the direct support and general support battalion headquarters batteries will be deleted. They will move to the regimental headquarters battery to allow creation of a new meteorological section to accommodate introduction of the meteorological data system.

Additionally, the survey sections of all direct and general support battalions, as well as the regimental headquarters battery, will be reorganized to standardize the survey sections at the battalion and create an additional 4th order survey team at the regiment.

Another important change in the artillery field is the addition of a 4th forward observer team to each of the firing batteries of the direct support battalions. These Marines will provide needed observer support to the recently reorganized four-company infantry battalion.

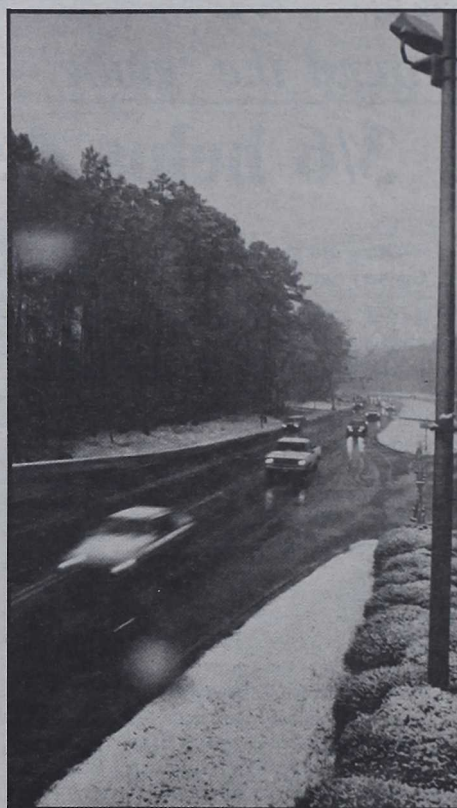
New range for Pendleton

A new \$3.75 million multi-purpose range complex being built at Camp Pendleton, Calif. is scheduled for completion in April.

The range, contracted by the Army Corps of Engineers, will be the first to be built at a Marine Corps Base and features moving pop-up targets in a realistic setting.

Designed for armored vehicles and infantry, the computer-operated range will feature four different paths with silhouettes of tanks and infantrymen. A new scenario can be created each time the range is used, which allows the element of surprise to remain intact.

The new range will "increase the Marines' combat skills and awareness," according to Maj. Ted Tolle, base training facility officer. "Use of the range

will give Marines an opportunity to engage moving targets, which hasn't been done in the recent past.

"The 2½-mile range is being received with great enthusiasm," said Tolle. Contract operation of the range is 2,800 hours per year, but the demand for use is in excess of 6,000 hours. Another range is being built at Twentynine Palms, Calif.

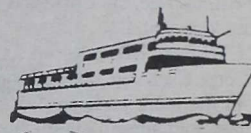

Sales of live Christmas trees up on base

Oh Christmas tree, Oh Christmas tree, Camp Lejeune does love you.

With Christmas tree sales up 25 percent at the Marine Corps Exchange this year, one could say the proof is in the plum pudding.

"We have sold almost 2,000 Christmas trees this year compared to the 1,500 that were sold last year," Vivian Hugeback, Christmas merchandise purchaser at the main exchange, said.

"The trees are shipped in from as far away as Nova Scotia," she said. "We have a large variety of trees. We sell Virginia pines, white pines, Scotch pines, red cedars, Frazier furs and balsam pines, which we affectionately call 'Charlie Brown Trees,'" Hugeback said. "Most people prefer the real Christmas trees compared to the artificial ones," she added.

"The people who come in to purchase trees claim the reason they want a real tree is because of the fragrant smell and memories the trees produce," Diana Fillpot, tree salesperson at the main exchange, said.

Many people get real trees because of tradition. "I get a real tree every year, because it's sort of a family tradition. It brings back memories of my youth," Capt. Michael J. Stroff, logistics officer for the Reserve Support Unit, said.

"I love the smell of the pine needles, but I don't like the mess they make," said Sgt. Joseph Lang, 2nd Recon Battalion, 2nd MarDiv.

"The mess of the needles is only a minor hazard compared to the existing threat of fires that the Christmas trees present," Fillpot said.

"In cooperation with the Camp Lejeune Fire Department, the main exchange passes out a very detailed flier on the prevention of Christmas tree fires," she said.

Below are some tips that may prevent these py holidays from becoming tragic:

□ Always water and soak your tree. Sugar aspirin dissolved in the water may aid your tree absorbing the water.

□ Cut off a chunk of the trunk at least one above the previous cut. Your tree will last longer way.

□ Support your tree well, keeping it away from spots in your home, such as fireplaces, heaters, stoves.

□ Do not place the tree in passageways or in case you have to get out of your home in a hurry.

□ Be sure to check your lights for frayed wires, loose connections or broken plugs.

□ Turn off the tree lights before you retire for evening.

□ Make sure your decorations and ornaments are noncombustible.

□ Have a fire extinguisher or garden hose hooked up during the holiday season. If a fire does start, do try to play Superman. Keep in mind that your family's lives are far more valuable than a material possessions.

□ If a fire should occur, get everyone out of dwelling first, then call the local fire department. This before attempting to fight the fire yourself. If fire occurs on base, pull the fire alarm or 451-3333.

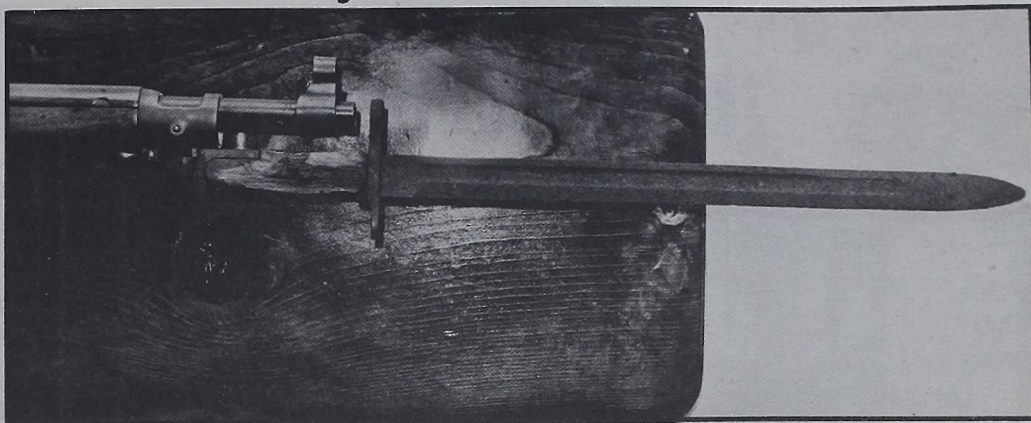

'03 Bayonet is returned home

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following story was written by lengthy research and subsequent articles by Agostino von Hassell.

A slice of 6th Marine history was carved out of and then buried into French soil northeast of Lucy-le-Bocage in June 1918 during a fierce battle for a two-mile stretch of woods of firmly entrenched Prussian troops.

The Springfield '03 rifle bayonet met its final place Dec. 14 when Agostino von Hassell lent it to Lt. Col. Sands Robnick and Sgt. Maj. Harold Overstreet at 6th Marines Headquarters, Camp Geiger.

Agostino von Hassell, who has researched and written about the 6th Marine's history, shared some of his Belleau Wood's history with regimental executive officer and sergeant major.

There is a road leading northeast from Lucy-le-Bocage to Bouresches, Hassell said, that is flanked on the left by a wheat field. Marines from 2nd Battalion, 6th Marines; 3rd Battalion, 6th Marines; and 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines, fresh off of the ship after a few weeks of training at Parris Island, S.C., and Quantico, Va., attacked the woodline at 5 p.m. on June 14. They never made it. Two more attempts by the 6th Marines standing above the chest-high wheat were equally futile.

The devastating German machine-gun fire had severed the wheat and the charging Marines.

Conventional Marine tactics against these seasoned trench-warfare troops, who were dug into foxholes 100 feet apart, would only yield more casualties. And memories of defeated French and English faces withdrawing to the safety of the countryside still haunted these young Marines. Yes, they were green and unseasoned under fire. They held no detailed plans or maps. They did, however, have an objective: take the woods from the Germans. And that is all they needed.

On the fourth attack across the wheatfield, the 6th Marines reverted to century-old, Indian warfare tactics of hiding behind rocks, moving smaller teams forward while others were providing cover fire and sniping on their bellies.

They earned every inch of every yard on that wheat field, Hassell said. Their brothers in 3/5 were doing the same during an assault on Hill 142 a few kilometers to the west. Close combat, confusion and mustard gas was the menu served to Marines, and they wanted more.

The enemy was stunned and impressed by these charging, hollering "madmen." Never before had they countered such recklessness and courage on any battlefield. The German Army's offensive to Paris, 56 miles away, was seriously challenged.

When the fresh Marines arrived, the French commander told them to "prepare entrenchment hundreds of yards to rearward." But he didn't know the 6th Marines didn't retreat into trenches; they took the fight to the enemy. The Germans were also surprised when Marine marksmen began hitting targets at 400 yards.

With water supplies running low and a relentless sun scorching the leathernecks, clothing was shed before Gunnery Sgt. Dan Daly yelled, "Come on, you sons-of-bitches. Do you want to live forever?" Military historian and author S.L.A. Marshall

wrote: "Here at Belleau Wood, the German commander was to risk all 'in a local dogfight.' And he had picked on the wrong people."

Marines overran the German foxholes, but they still had two more miles of woods to clear.

The woods were firmly in the hands of U.S. Marines on June 26. The French honored them by renaming the woods "Bois de la Brigade de Marine."

Equally significant at Belleau Wood was the Corps proving itself a valuable fighting force capable of fighting and winning battles with brigade-size units. Another winning concept was introduced — fire and maneuver using fire teams and rifle squads.

Marines such as Thomas A. Holcomb, Holland M. Smith, Lemuel C. Shepherd and Clifton B. Cates used lessons learned at Belleau Wood successfully during World War II. The Corps has strengthened and changed from battle-tested lessons through the years, but some things never change.

France's Champagne region boasts a few modern furnishings, but today's generation living in and around Belleau still remember what the Marine Corps did 71 years ago. And despite a valiant effort by thick vegetation to bury historical artifacts from the bloody battlefield at Belleau Wood, a few are exposed every year.

About the author . . .

Agostino von Hassell was born into a military family; his father was in the German Navy and his mother was of staunch Prussian decent.

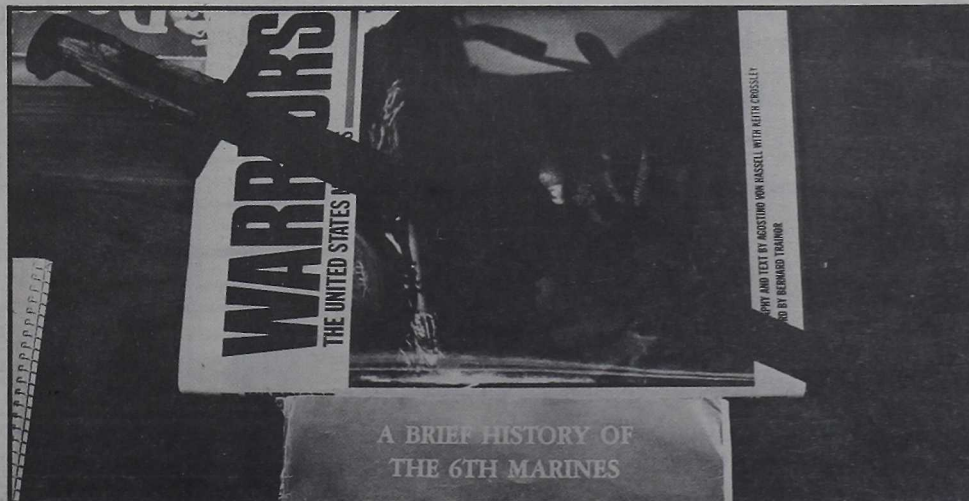
One of Hassell's grandfathers was a German ambassador to Rome. The other, a grand admiral, helped build the German World War I fleet.

"My mother's father, Lt. von Studnitz, fought with the German cavalry at Belleau Wood," Hassell said.

Both of his grandfathers, however, fought for the resistance during World War II and were later killed for their efforts.

Hassell was educated in Belgium, Rome, West Germany and the United States. He received a bachelor's degree in history from Columbia University in 1975. One year later he finished his master's in journalism.

Hassell has free-lanced for many European magazines and *Newsweek* from his New York City studio. He is currently working on his second book about Marines.

Last, but not least, it was time to cover any details on command and signal. Elf Lt. Martin handled that part.

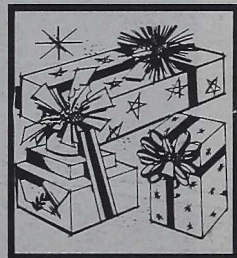
"The operation will kick off on your own initiative at about 0001 on 25 December," Martin said. "Upon completion of the toy delivery phase you will signal us when you are returning to base."

Lejeune All-Stars victors after coming from behind

Lejeune's All-Stars struck back to come from behind in the second half to beat a tough opponent 16-8 in the annual All-Star football game at Lejeune's Liversedge.

How did they do it? They had a 5-foot-10-inch, 200-pound kicker Lance Cpl. Brian Russell who nailed a 30-yard field goal at the onset of the fourth quarter to put Camp Lejeune back in the game.

Russell proved to be the winner after Cherry Point went into the game with a two-point deficit and a turnover early in the second half.

At the onset, the sparse crowd was told that the chilly air would be a detriment to the defensive battle as both teams' swarms produced a number of turnovers and near interceptions.

Lejeune team struck first gold as kicker Lance Cpl. Anthony Russell hit a 43-yard touchdown pass to tight end Cpl. Gregory Pierce. The extra point run failed, but Lejeune was on the board 6 to zip.

Through the remainder of the first half, neither team could muster much of an offensive threat, while on the other hand the ball Cherry Point defensive back Sgt. Bruce J. Mitchell and free

safety SH3 T. J. Mills seemed to be the players most on top of their game.

Through much of the first half, Mitchell's blitzing caused Lejeune quarterback Russell to hurry his passes while catching running backs before they reached the line of scrimmage.

Coming out of the locker room in the second half, the Cherry Point All-Stars appeared to have a renewed lease on life and a rosier outlook on the game.

Cherry Point quarterback Cpl. John F.

Meyers, unable to air the ball out, went to the ground as his team took advantage of a bad snap to Lejeune punter Heredos and recovered the ball on the Lejeune 16 yard line.

After the punt, tailback Lance Cpl. Chris A. Comerford took on the role of workhorse, punching through the Lejeune defensive line for four and eight yards before plowing around the corner and into the end zone for Cherry Point's only score. Meyers found tight end Sgt. Alfred Bowman Jr. in the right corner of the end zone for a two-point conversion pass and Cherry Point's only lead, 8-6.

Almost immediately, Cherry Point had another opportunity to score when second-string Lejeune quarterback Pvt. Jay Seffchick fumbled the ball right into Cherry Point linebacker Lance Cpl. Chris Manner's hands. Manner returned the ball for a touchdown, but the return was called back with the change of possession as the ball touched the ground.

Following the fumble, the Lejeune defense had to fight with their backs against the wall, and as they've proven over the past years, they rose to the challenge. The Cherry Point team had

the ball two plays before Lejeune defender Sgt. Jack Reid stripped the ball from tailback Comerford's hands and teammate Sgt. Keith Walker fell on it at the 11 for Lejeune.

Again, both offenses seemed to falter until early in the fourth period when Russell was able to move the Lejeune team into Heredos' field goal range. Following three consecutive pass attempts, Heredos entered the game and split the uprights to give Lejeune a one point margin and all the points they would need to win.

With the seconds ticking away, Cherry Point's Mills proved why he was an All-Star, swatting down Lejeune passes as well as being found near the bottom of the pile on most every running play.

Mills' one man show was not enough however, as Lejeune mounted another near scoring drive on the arm of Russell and a couple acrobatic catches by Grinder. The

Cherry Point defense did stop the drive on the goal line, and seemed to heighten the offensive momentum, but Lejeune's defensive back Lance Cpl. Gregory Pierce picked off a Cherry Point pass ambled into the end zone for some insurance points.

The defensive score with only seconds remaining gave the Lejeune Marines their 12th win in 13 games.

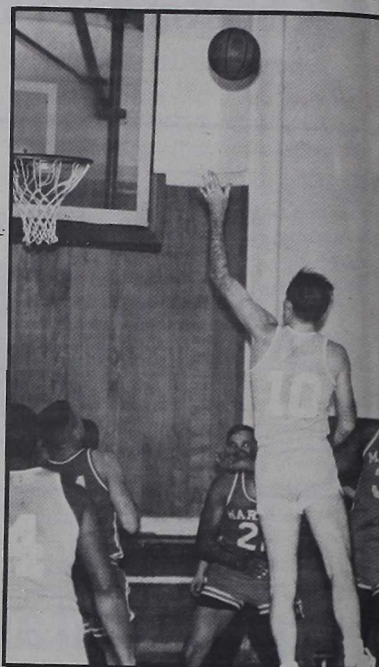

Marine Corps sponsored darts tournaments are few and far between according to Ron Biedenbach, assistant athletic director at MCAS New River.

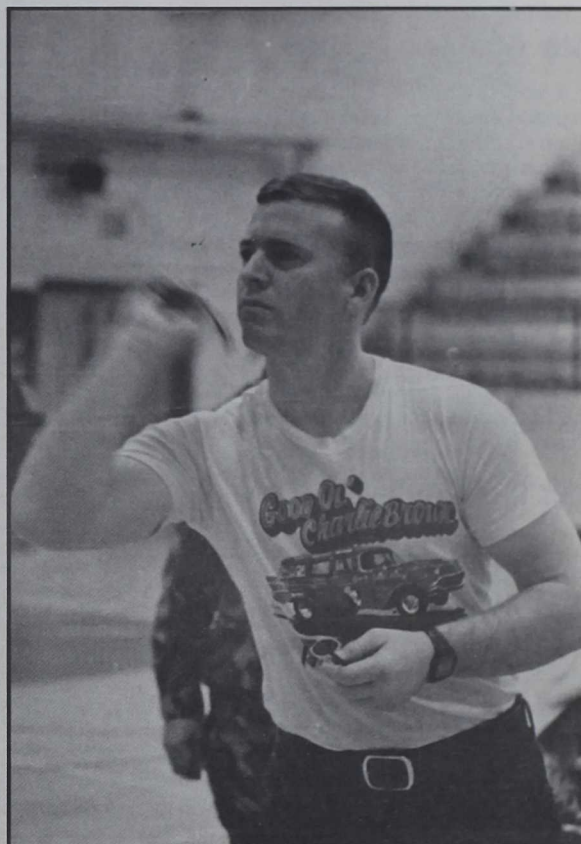

Martin admitted that winning the championship was no easy task.

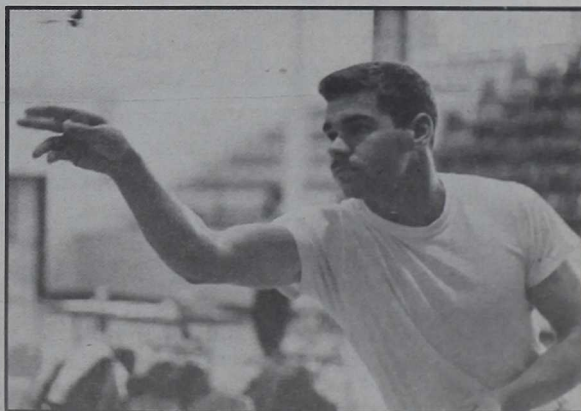
"It was a tough tournament with a lot of good players," said Martin.
