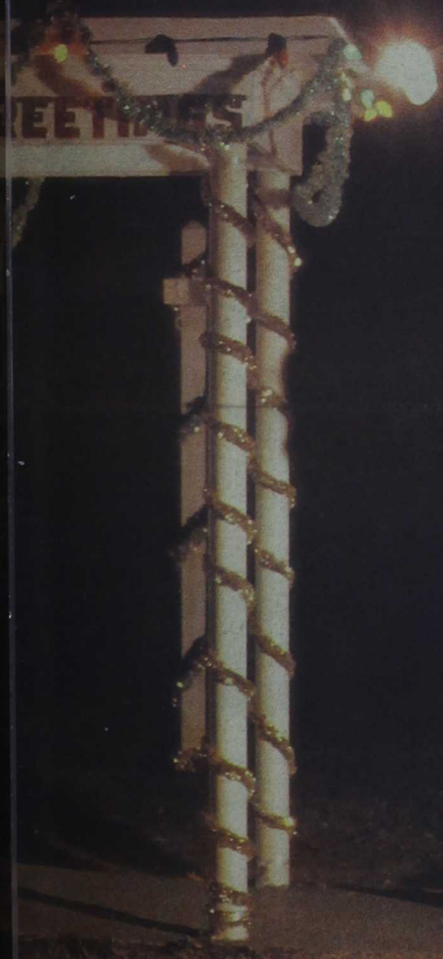
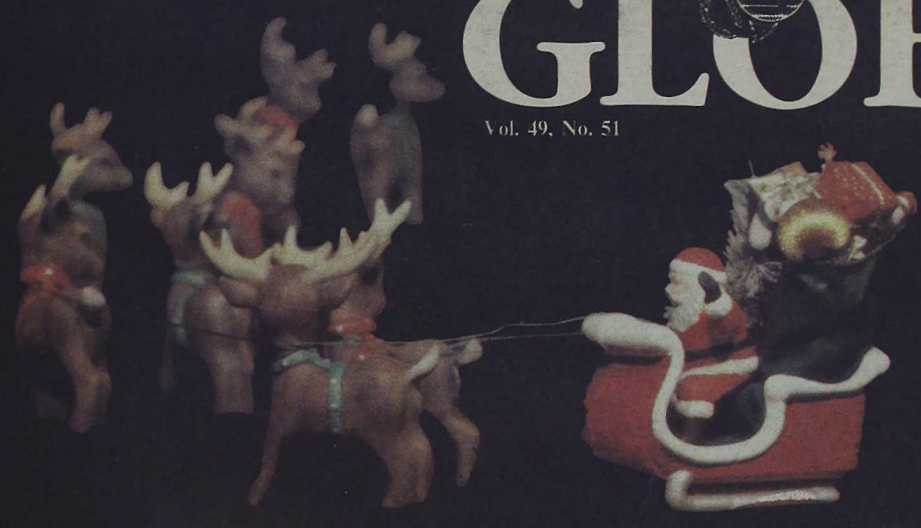

# CG's Corner...



The Personnel Support Activity Detachment here is supposed to be a "one-stop-service" activity for Navy personnel in the Camp Lejeune area. Why is the disbursing section only open for service to customers from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. daily?

Customer service hours at the Personnel Support Activity Detachment are from 7:30 a.m. to noon daily. The "one-stop-service" concept is not only for Navy personnel, but is also for the approximately 3,000 active duty and reserves throughout North Carolina. In addition, the PSD supports the recruiting commands, reserve centers and NROTC units. Work brought in during the morning by walk-in customers as well as that which is received in the mail and by phone must be processed as quickly as possible. Ultimately, almost everything that is produced affects

pay or entitlements, making accuracy of the information important. Both timely processing and accuracy would suffer if clerks were interrupted continuously throughout the day. Afternoons are used for such as maintaining and verifying records, and processing Leave and Earnings Statements, ordering and processing pay and training. If it is impossible to conduct business during normal service hours, an appointment can be made with a PASD Representative to be seen in the afternoon.

Service by appointment ensures proper processing with fewer interruptions. The PLRs can often be a problem or answer a question, saving time by reducing the number of individual customer contacts the detachment. The PSD welcomes your suggestions for improvement.

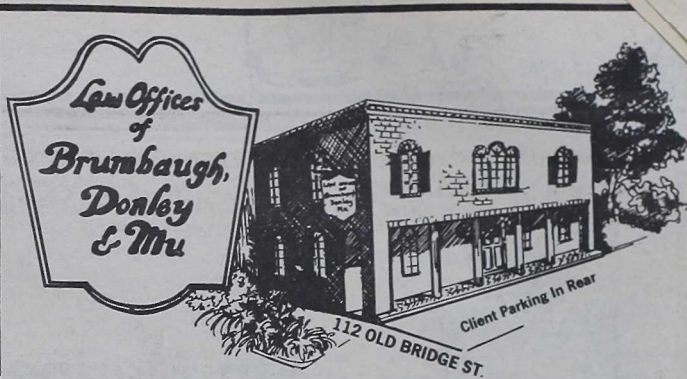

## 6th Marines go Dutch with Royal Netherlands exchange officer

The 6th Marines has had the opportunity to accomplish its mission with an international twist thanks to an exchange officer from Holland.

Major Axel R. Van Willigenburg is a member of the Royal Netherlands Marine Corps and has been stationed here for two years.

"I have come to cross train with our NATO allies. We are an elite group of 2,800 men with a mission of protecting the Northern European Flank and controlling terrorist action," said the Rotterdam native and father of two. "All Dutch

Marines are infantry Marines and this the U.S. Corps' bread and butter."

"The RNMC is so small because of its limitations. Out of 100 men that apply or get drafted, only two or three get accepted," Van Willigenburg said. "The physical tests to enter are the hardest. Even the slightest problem will prohibit someone from getting in. For example, no one with glasses or a hearing aid is allowed.

Once a recruit has passed that test, he still must face 16 weeks of formal training. If he is becoming a career officer, he goes through a three-year program and then goes to the Holland Naval Acad-

emy. Reserve officers train for nine months and then serve one year active. Officers are few--the ratio being one officer to every 125 Marines.

"We have an annual physical fitness test like our brother Marines here except for a few additional tasks," Van Willigenburg explained. "We have timed sit-ups and a four-kilometer run like here. The difference is that we also have a timed 600-meter swim, grenade throw for accuracy and a distance grenade throw."

Van Willigenburg feels that the Corps should become even tougher by upping their physical requirements. The Dutch Marines run everyday in boots and util-

"I have learned many things with the 6th Marines that I plan on taking back to Holland next July. The U.S. Marines are unique worldwide that they combine their combat and fire power logically, all wearing the same uniform," Van Willigenburg said.

"The Corps here should encourage more interservice exchange. It is sometimes necessary to look into someone else's kitchen to see how bread is cooked. It is a constant learning process."

## Tuition Assistance Program

The Tuition Assistance program allows students \$1,500 a year for education, according to ALMAR 283-87.

Prior to the message there were no tuition assistance expense limits.

Due to the Gramm-Rudman act, the Consolidated Education Center (CEC) is curtailing expenditures without a budget cut and helping limit deeper cuts in the future.

Some of the ways the CEC is doing this is by requiring service members to reimburse the Marine Corps for courses resulting in failures, voluntary withdrawals, incompletes and in those instances where the institution doesn't grant credit for a grade of "D". Involuntary withdrawal will be the only exception allowed. Otherwise, reimbursement must be made immediately.

Vocation and technical study leading to an applicable certificate or degree will be eligible for funding only if the course work is related to the service member's MOS. An MOS for which the service member might become eligible as a result of the program of study as verified by their commanding officer and the local education officer or career counselor is also acceptable.

Marines in poor academic standing will be limited to six semester hours or nine quarter hours or less.

Another change involves lower and upper division college studies. Lower division refers to the freshman and sophomore

years vice upper division junior and senior years.

The changes affect off-duty voluntary college studies at eligible degree granting institutions. Seventy-five percent of the cost of the tuition per course will be funded. Individual Marines may receive tuition assistance for a maximum of 65 semester hours or 96 quarter hours.

Graduate level study is also affected. Off-duty voluntary graduate level studies at eligible degree-granting institutions may be funded at 75 percent of the cost of tuition per course to a maximum of \$3,000 each fiscal year.

Enlisted personnel in the grades of sergeant and above may be funded at 90 percent of the cost of tuition up to the stated dollar limits each fiscal year.

Funding is also authorized for courses listed in the current DANTES independent study catalog. No others are authorized. The course must be completed within the time limit or one year, whichever is less.

Funding is not authorized for courses which can't be completed prior to EAS.

All applicants will receive information on the requirements for having a tuition assistance signed approval prior to the convening date of each course. Tuition assistance will be provided through the parent /detaching unit when practical. Maximum support will be provided to deployed Marines to facilitate correspondence course enrollment, access to DANTES testing and other needed education support.

# ID office centralizes: all cards issued at one place

The Central ID Card office, formerly the Photo and ID Card office, is undergoing changes.

In addition to a new name, already in effect, other changes will go into effect Jan. 1, 1988.

"A message came down from Headquarters Marine Corps to centralize dependent and retiree ID card issuance for entry in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) data base," said Staff Sergeant Robert D. Gray, NCOIC.

Other changes include issuing active duty cards to select units, dependent and retirees ID cards only at the Central ID Card office.

"They used to be issued at each reporting unit's personnel office and we'd supply the photo. We've now organized it so everything's done under one roof-except the DD1172, which is an application for an ID card. The DD1172 form can be obtained at any Marine or Sailor's personnel office," added Gray.

From there, the individual need only present him or herself at the Central ID Card office with a completed form. After entry in the DEERS data base a Rapids Form T1172-1 will be produced then an ID card with photo will be issued.

Retirees ID cards have also changed,

from grey to a universal blue, although the grey cards are still being honored. The universal color applies to any retiree in any branch of service. An additional space is provided on the card for the sponsor's branch of service.

Three misconceptions about ID cards still run rampant.

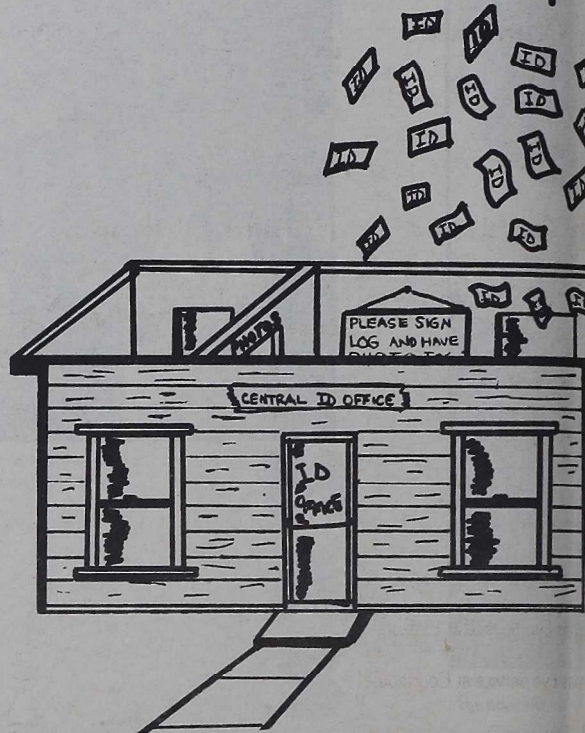
One misconception are the supporting documents required for retirees and their dependents to get ID cards. Documents required include: DD214 form, separation orders, marriage certificates, birth certificates, and adoption papers. The entire family must also be present for photo purposes.

Another misconception is the amount of time an ID card can be issued. Cards can be issued for anywhere from 30 days up to four years. Temporary cards can be issued for 30-90 days depending on a sponsor's location according to Gray.

Personnel incapacitated physically or mentally can have a card issued for an indefinite amount of time.

The other misconception is about children's ID cards. Generally, a child isn't issued a card until he's 10 years old. However other circumstances may warrant a card. Children of single parents and dual military parents are eligible for a card at any age.

A child may also be issued a card until their 21st birthday. Beyond the age of 21,



they warrant one if they're a full time student. The card is good for only one year, and before issuance, a statement of status as a college student must be submitted. Statement forms are available at the Central ID Office and need a signature from the college being attended.

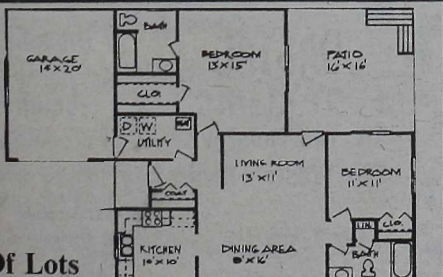

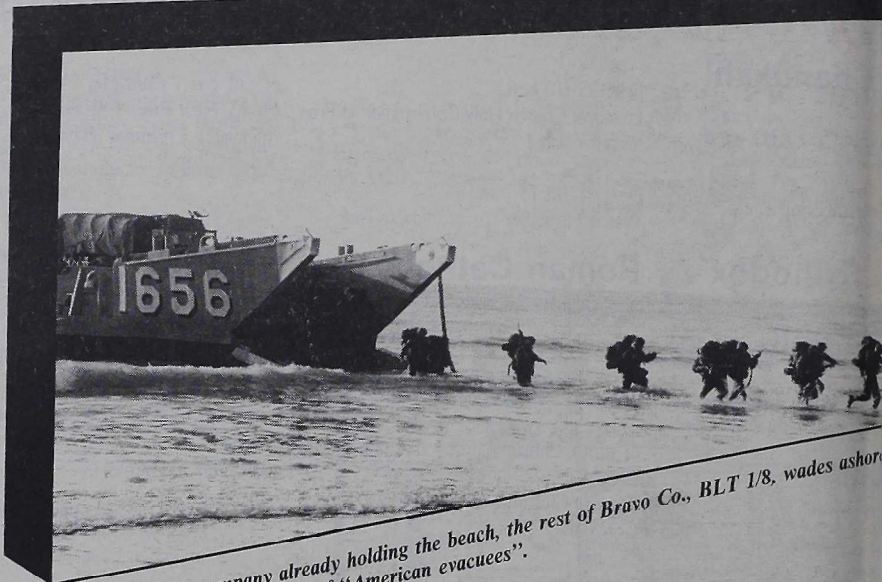

## 'Riptide' rips Lejeune as 26th MAU plucks the ambassador from peril

The 26th MAU and Amphibious Squadron Eight gathered together off Onslow Beach Dec. 1-4 in an exercise dubbed Operation Riptide.

For the first time since their return last July from the Mediterranean, the 26th MAU tested their ability to plan and execute an operation as a whole with the PHIBRON. With the MAU Command Element orchestrating, BLT 1/8, HMM-365 and MSSG-26 soon settled into their roles as the Landing Force poised off a fictitious island.

The tranquility of the island of "Onslow" had been shattered when an upstart major seized power, claiming to be "The Chosen One." The political situation turned turbulent as the "Chosen One" decreed "believers" and "non-believers" were not to associate. Having been declared a "non-believer" and literally thrown out of the major's palace, the American ambassador warned all U.S. citizens to stay off the streets and prepare

for possible evacuation.

Keeping this scenario in mind, the 26th MAU and PHIBRON Eight developed an evacuation plan. Combat Town was designated the gathering point for American citizens but The Chosen One wasn't going to make the evacuation easy.

Following a reconnaissance insertion, Bravo Co. slipped ashore in rubber boats to secure the beach and a bridge to delay The Chosen One's reinforcements, knocking out a radar site in the process. While helicopters carried Charlie Co. to secure two landing zones for the evacuation, AAVs carrying Alpha Co. were wading ashore, aimed for Combat Town. Tanks and artillery were soon providing the Sunday punch as AV-8B Harriers struck low, hard and fast overhead.

By-passing island defenses south of Combat Town, Alpha Co., backed by tanks, stormed in from the east and soon began the tedious chore of clearing the town building-by-building. Within five hours of Bravo Co. securing the beach, Alpha Co. was entrenched within Com-

bat Town and preparing to repel any counter-attack.

The gathering and evacuation of "American citizens" began soon after as teams from MSSG-26 arrived to brief, process, "tag" and get them to waiting helicopters.

Operation Riptide was designed to exercise many of the 26th MAU's capabilities and to test their ability to react to a crisis on short notice. It was also a test of their readiness, as evaluators and controllers judged and directed courses of action.

"From my end of things, I think it went pretty well," said Capt. James Welsh, Alpha Co. commander. "The evaluators also kept things as realistic as they could. We identified a few problem areas, but I think we'll get them ironed out pretty quickly. We've worked closely with the AAVs an average of three days a week since September, and I think that helped us in a lot of areas especially in continuing the action once we made contact with the enemy."

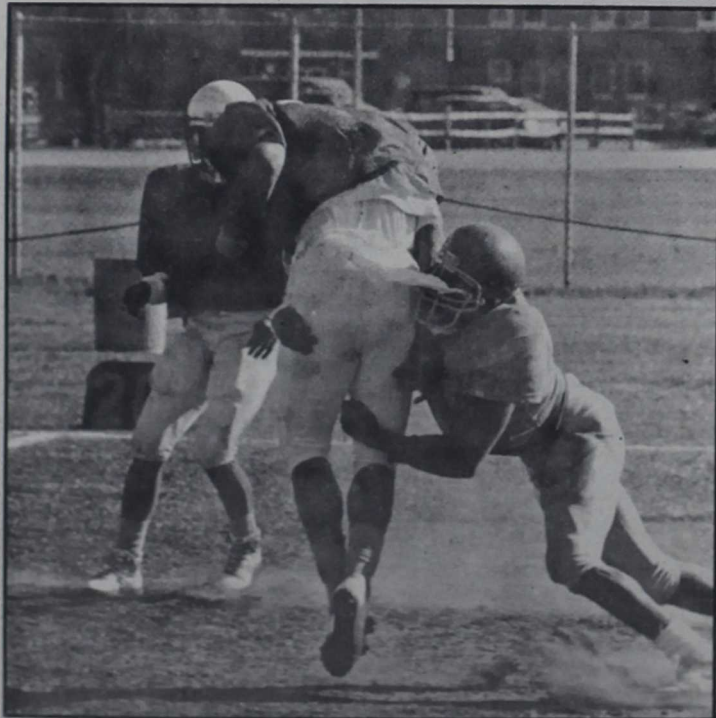
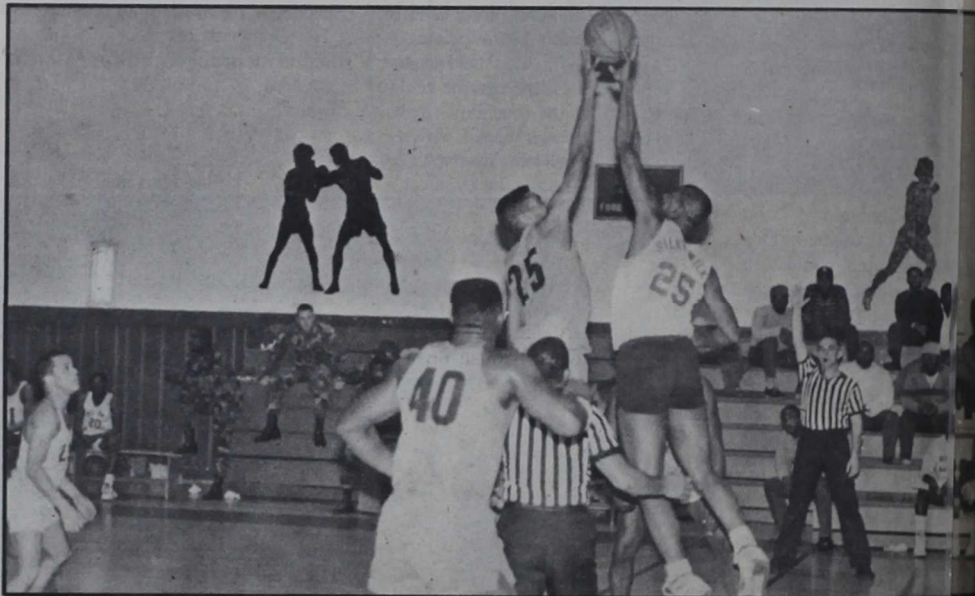
This win gives 8th Marines a record of 9-3 for the season and drops HqBn. to 8-5.
