Celebrating our Sailors, Marines

Some of our command's military team members received Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals (NAM) from our Commanding Officer, Capt. Douglas S. MacKenzie, during a ceremony Dec. 6, 2022 at Naval Air Station Sigonella (NASSIG), Italy.

NAM awards are bestowed upon Navy and Marine Corps personnel for outstanding achievement or meritorious service rendered specifically on behalf of the U.S. Navy. The following Marine and Sailors were awarded NAMs for specific achievements and superior performance of duties.

Marine Corps Sgt. Jeremy Williams was recognized for his performance while serving as custodian of postal effects and supervisor at NASSIG's Fleet Mail Center between March 2021 and March 2022. According to his NAM citation, Williams' attention to detail earned a score of 'outstanding' during the fiscal year 2022 postal assist visit, and he was specifically recognized for his technical knowledge.

Logistics Specialist 2nd Class (LS2) Lance Smith was recognized for his "superb leadership, exceptional managerial skills, and impressive teamwork" while serving as leading petty officer at NASSIG's Fleet Mail Center between March 2021 and March 2022. According to his NAM citation, Smith "led 24 personnel in the safe receipt and processing of 1.28 million pounds of incoming mail and 240,000 pounds of outgoing mail, resulting in 100 percent accountability for all cash funds, stamp stock and money orders with zero discrepancies."

LS2 Emily Wheeler was recognized for her performance while serving as logistics support representative and cargo leading petty officer at our command's cooperative security location at Defense Munitions Crombie, Scotland between April 2022 and July 2022. According to her NAM citation, Wheeler "played a key role in coordinating and expediting 584,000 pounds of cargo and 77,000 pounds of mail to 15 deployed units, including two

carrier strike groups and an amphibious readiness group in the U.S. Fifth and Sixth Fleet areas of responsibility, enhancing the Navy's mission readiness and morale".

LS3 Colt Murray received his NAM for "providing outstanding logistical support to 36 deployed units while serving as logistics support representative between December 2019 and October 2022, enhancing the Navy's mission readiness in the U.S. Fifth and Sixth Fleet areas of responsibility. Murray's citation also recognized him for his performance of duties as a mail clerk, "helping boost the morale of over 4,500 base personnel by processing 350,000 pounds of mail with 100 percent accountability".

News from Site Sigonella | Celebrating our Sailors

Lt. Tianhao Shi and Logistics Specialist 1st Class Vanessa Alvarez were recognized by our Commanding Officer, Capt. Douglas S. MacKenzie, for completing the NAVSUP Master Logistics Support Representative (LSR) Training Program, during a ceremony Dec. 6, 2022 at Naval Air Station Sigonella, Italy.

LSRs are responsible for acting as the focal point for all aspects of shipboard support in the local area. This certification program establishes a baseline of standard knowledge for journeymen and master LSRs across the NAVSUP enterprise.

As the site's logistics support officer, Shi provides leadership and oversight of the logistics operations in sustaining the U.S. Sixth Fleet and NATO operations.

"A qualified master logistics support representative is the most desired asset for each Navy afloat warfighter," Shi said. "This training allows me to provide value-added logistics support and coordination in the most complex environment, ensuring our Warfighters receive all necessary logistics services."

As the site's Logistics Support Center leading petty officer and lead LSR, Alvarez leads a team responsible for the coordination and timeliness of all movement of cargo, mail and provisions to ships operating in the U.S. Fifth and Sixth Fleet areas of responsibility.

"Master LSR is the highest qualification for the logistics support representative title," Alvarez said. "It's something I wanted to achieve at this command, and sooner than most. I wanted to be qualified in enough time to have a year left so I can train and qualify others before my departure. To me, having this qualification is the highest honor as an LSR."

In their roles, Shi and Alvarez oversee the processing of surface and air movements and customs requests for cargo, mail, provisions, and ships' merchandise. In fiscal 2022, their team provided logistics support services for more than 53 port visits, which was a 212 percent increase from fiscal 2021.

Coordinating more than 49 Military Sealift Command ship in-port replenishments at the Augusta NATO pier, their team ensured mission readiness to 36 deployed ships, including the Kearsarge Amphibious Readiness Group, Harry S. Truman Carrier Strike Group (CSG) and George H. W. Bush CSG, totaling more than 12,000 pallets of cargo, 24 million gallons of DFM/JP5 fuel and 821,000 pounds of mail, which is equal to 80 percent of all mail to the U.S. Sixth Fleet.

NAVSUP prepares fleet mail centers across U.S. Naval Forces Europe-Africa for holiday season

Every year, hundreds of postal professionals assigned to NAVSUP FLCSI process approximately 13 million pounds of mail at fleet mail centers located across Naval Forces Europe-Africa (NAVEUR-AF) for ashore and afloat Navy warfighters, DOD personnel, and their family members.

Of that volume, more than a million pounds of mail and packages on average are processed during the holiday season alone.

"In order for our postal teams to effectively manage the sharp increase in mail and packages during the holiday season, good planning is critical," said Vic Gonzalez, NAVSUP FLCSI's postal program manager.

Planning for the 2022 holiday season, in part, meant that NAVSUP FLCSI's postal teams augmented their workforce with volunteers and reservists on active duty orders who assisted with unloading mail trucks, sorting mail and delivering packages to customers.

"Our postal personnel are not normally able to take leave during the months of November and December because of the increased mail volume," Gonzalez said. "Even with a fully staffed postal workforce, there is still a need for additional help, and our Reserve Component and post office volunteers definitely helped make a difference."

Besides augmenting their FMC workforce, another way NAVSUP FLCSI postal teams prepared for the 2022 holiday mail season was to perform a continuous process improvement (CPI) review in early December with the command's mail control activity (MCA) team operating at Rome Fiumicino International Airport.

"Our major goals during the CPI self-assessment review were to empower our MCA Rome team to identify barriers to productivity and fix problems at the lowest level using proven problem-solving tools" said Antonio Fiorini, NAVSUP FLCSI CPI manager. "Our command's CPI efforts demonstrate our command's ongoing commitment to "Get Real Get Better" by fostering exceptional performance and increasing mission readiness in all of our mission sets, especially fleet mail center operations."

Another way NAVSUP FLCSI's postal teams prepared for the 2022 holiday season is by communicating to its customer base with announcements through NAVEUR-AF's public affairs offices. Announcements pertained to recommended mailing dates and resources for using the military postal service, such as knowing how to correctly complete the mail customs forms.

"To be effective with communicating important information to our postal customer base about using the military postal system, we needed to be early, accurate and clear with our messaging," Gonzalez said.

Fleet support operations require a high level of coordination and communication amongst the division’s logistics support representatives (LSRs) and internal FLCSI divisions such as contracting, transportation, hazardous materials, and fuels. Outside the command, Fleet support works with other NAVSTA Rota departments and tenant commands in addition to the individual entities being serviced.


