Sturgis Stadium is named for three generations of Army officers. Col. Samuel D. Sturgis, who fought in the Indian Wars from 1846 to 1886, his son, Maj. Gen. Samuel D. Sturgis, Jr., who served from 1884 to 1925. General Sturgis' son, also named Samuel D. Sturgis, Jr., was a Lieutenant at Fort Riley with the 9th

Mounted Engineer Squadron. In 1933, he commanded a troop that constructed the bowl now known as Sturgis Stadium.
