In front of a giant American flag with Black Hawk helicopters in the background, the ceremony began with a welcome from Hogan.

"After I graduated from high school, I enlisted in the Army," said Hogan. "You can be all you can be just

Hogan spoke about the importance of service and the sacrifices military members make. He also congratulated the students on their decision to join the Army.

"Thank you for taking the step forward," he said. "Each one of you has taken an opportunity to serve your country; success endures."

Hogan also thanked the families present for enabling the new Soldiers to succeed. Telling them, "These young leaders are the lifeblood of the Army."

## **CCAD Sergeant Major Guest Speaker at LyondellBasell**

With the theme, "Communication is Key," LyondellBasell refinery held its 2023 Global Safety Day June 20, and Corpus Christi Army Depot Sgt. Maj. Jon Trawick was the guest speaker.

Global Safety Day celebrated 514 accident-free days at LyondellBasell refinery. Upon entering Corpus Christi, one will observe the magnificent oil refineries. At night the refineries are a scintillating vision.

During his remarks, Trawick shared the history of CCAD and talked about modern-day operations, focusing on how safety is incorporated into every step of the process.

"The depot is an organic facility to the Army and that's important because, without the depots, the government must rely on profit-driven original equipment manufacturers," Trawick said. "We are the nation's insurance policy, providing assurance that our sustainment will keep pace

with the nation's demand."

Army civilians and Soldiers must also take annual safety training with communication being the key factor in any given situation.

Trawick continued, "To be an effective communicator, you must empathize and relate to the workers around you. This can be accomplished by listening to understand, also known as active listening," Douglas McBroom, Lyondell site coordinator and health, safety, and environmental specialist said, "This event is hosting 450 facility employees and contractors across the Coastal Bend. The sheer importance of communication between the sender and the receiver could result in a fatal accident if proper 'how copy' (feedback) isn't acknowledged."

Trawick echoed McBroom's comments on the importance of communication.

The theme for the panel was 'Grit Makes Great Leaders', on the basis that nurturing a wide span of awareness provides the ability to' see things whole.'

In the spirit of sharing informational successes, employees are the best authority on everyday work practices. Benson said, "Receiving that information from the employees is the key to making your organizations more efficient."

There are opportunities and challenges that all employers face when attracting and retaining a skilled workforce. One of the collaborative methods that CCAD uses comes from shop floor level employees who have ideas for program improvement. "We strive to have a culture where we want workforce input to complement a data-driven decision," said Benson. "We find this to be the optimal approach to yield both qualitative and quantitative decision driving information."

today represent the best future Soldiers of Kingsville, Texas' area of recruiting operations," said "Capt. Christopher Palme, commander of the Corpus Christi recruiting company.

"They provide a single geographical snapshot of why the U.S. Army continues to strengthen its force through diversity and inclusion of people and thought.

This is happening all over the country. This how we win the day and prepare to win tomorrow's wars."

After meeting the educational requirements, passing a physical exam and signing a contract, the new recruits will begin their journey with 10 weeks of boot camp at either Fort Moore, Georgia, Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, or Fort Jackson, South Carolina.

Regardless of where they go, they are eager to learn the skills they will need to be successful in the military, as they are the leaders who will shape tomorrow's Army.

Alex Elijah Gonzalez's mother, Stephanie Morales, beamed with pride as her son, who leaves for boot camp June 10, stood at attention.

"We have eight grandsons in our family; Alex is the very first member of our family to enlist to serve in the military," she said. "He is eager to get his education benefits and pursue a Bachelor of Science degree while doing his duty to our country as a cargo specialist."

Gonzalez, the salutatorian of his graduating class, said, "I have wanted to join the Army since I was 13 years old. I have a great support network — my recruiter, Sgt. Miranda and my family."

Gonzalez's friend Omar Garcia will also train as a cargo specialist, learning the skills of cargo documentation, securing cargo, manually loading and unloading, and operating material handling equipment, like cranes and forklifts.

Garcia confidently explained, "If the Army needs to move it, whether it's mail or equipment, I'll be the one operating the crane."

Reflecting on the day, Palme said, "What could be better than spending a Saturday morning at CCAD, with Col. Hogan and his team, multiple Army aircraft, Army Soldiers, future Army Soldiers and Army families, all committing and recommitting to serving this great country?"

The U.S. Secretary of the Army, the Honorable Christine Wormuth, said the Army set a goal this year to bring in 65,000 recruits, which would be 20,000 more than in 2022. Recruits must be between the ages of 17-35 to enlist in the active-duty Army.

A former Army veteran, season ticket holder, and No.1 Hooks fan has a memorialized permanent purple seat reserved only for purple heart recipients. It was named for John Joslin, a retired lieutenant colonel who served 27 years on active duty and was a decorated veteran — earning the Purple Heart, Legion of Merit, Soldier's Medal and Bronze Star Medal. Joe Martinez, section 120 manager, who served as an Army specialist in the late-1960s and deployed to France, said, "Until John's health failed, he never missed a game and always sat in this seat."

Joslin served two combat tours in Vietnam throughout his career and was stationed abroad in Korea, Germany and Italy. He held numerous positions; most notably being assigned to the Office of the Chief of Staff of the Army.

Whataburger Field, in partnership with the Port of Corpus Christi, assists with pre-deployment and post-deployment units by allowing military units to stage Apache and Black Hawk helicopters and other military equipment in their parking lot. This activity, also known in the U.S. Army as Reception, Staging, Onward Movement, and Integration is crucial to set conditions for successful because combat commanders can effectively leverage all available assets and enter the training exercise ready to fight and win. Since Hurricane Harvey hit in 2017, more Army equipment has gone through the Port of Corpus Christi after the flooding at the Port of Beaumont.
