Leaders discuss 201st Corps security

The 201st Corps commander, Brig. Gen. Raheem Wardak and Brig. Gen. Abdul Hakim, the 202nd shamshod commander recently hosted a regional security conference on Camp Pol-e-charki.

In attendance were: Maj. Gen Nasser Zeaee, coalition commanders from Bagram, Jalalabad, and Logar provinces, provincial police chiefs, occp commanders from ten provinces, regional border commanders, G2 and G3 representatives, and many coalition mentors.

The conference began with a recitation from the Holy Quran which was followed by a briefing from Col. Dour Mohamed Hamdard, the intel officer of the 201st Corps.

Additional briefings were provided by the counterterrorism officer, shamshod regional commander, and the G2 intel officer.
