I.C.E. COMMENT

COMMENT: Whenever I walk through Gridley Tunnel, there are cars going much faster than the speed limit. Maybe base security needs to sit outside the tunnel and check for speeding. What is going on with the bushes at the end of the intersection? The stop line was moved back to the original spot when the road was repaved, making this

a safety hazard again. I still see people running the stop sign or just not knowing what to do because they cannot see around the bushes.

RESPONSE: The Gridley Tunnel was designed for one-way vehicle traffic; but through the years, pedestrians and bicyclists have been allowed to use the tunnel. We have

received numerous ICE complaints that the tunnel is an accident waiting to happen. The only way to ensure pedestrian or bicyclist safety is to eliminate vehicle traffic in the tunnel or to prohibit pedestrian and bicycle traffic. The tunnel is used by vehicles and pedestrians as an access point from the housing area to the waterfront. We are looking at various

options to ensure safety, but no decision has been made at this time. We ask all vehicle operators to obey the 20 kph speed limit in the tunnel. We ask that all pedestrians and bicyclists walk/ride in a single file line through the tunnel and be aware that you are not the only person using the tunnel. We appreciate your support of the traffic safety program.
