- 97th Transportation Detachment (LCU 2013 / 2018) transfers authority to the 467th and 949th Transportation Detachments, Kuwaiti Navel Base in the Persian Gulf.

Durable Express

- In May, 1 SB created the Durable Express for the purpose of predictability and flexibility for the "Responsible Drawdown" of US Forces in Iraq.
- This convoy will consistently go to fifteen out of twenty-one Retrograde Property Assistance Team (RPAT) yards to load and transport retrograde cargo.
- Durable Express will ease the burden of overcrowded RPAT/MRPAT yards by ensuring a convoy will be available to carry retrograde equipment down to Kuwait on a weekly basis. Durable Express will be tailored specifically for transporting Class VII cargo.
- Durable Express will provide the same predictability as the Blackjack Express but allow more freedom to manipulate the composition of the convoy. It will backhaul 80% of the retrograde cargo identified throughout the IJOA and often drive over 700 miles to locations such as Marez, Speicher, Warrior, and Qwest.
- There is no question that the Durable Express will prove to be one the most critical pieces to the largest US retrograde operation since WWII.
- Since the 15th of May—we have conducted 24 Durable Express convoys equating to 412 flatbeds and 355 HETs for a total of 767 truckloads.

- This deployment marks the second deployment for the 39th MCB in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The battalion served a twelve month deployment and will be returning to Kaiserslautern, Germany. During the unit's deployment, they supported the movement of 53 deploying and redeploying brigades. Additionally, the unit developed and implemented systems that resulted in a drastic decrease in contracts required and saved \$770,000 over a 9 month period, as well as a host of other accomplishments.
- The 462nd MCB, commanded by LTC Michael L. Butler and CSM Marvin P. Smith arrived to the 1st Sustainment Brigade from Trenton, New Jersey. This marks the unit's first deployment to the CENTCOM AOR.

 The DURABLE Family is in the process of upgrading our Convoy Escort Teams from the M1151 HMMWV to the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected vehicle. The variant that will be issued to our Soldiers is known as the Caiman and it has a far superior force protection posture than the M1151 and will also increase our capability to support the responsible withdrawal of equipment from OIF.
