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Understanding Danger Ready 2

FORT RILEY, Kansas - Preparations continued for the 1st Infantry Division's Danger Ready 2 exercise at the F/1 Aviation Regiment Hangar at Fort Riley, Kansas, Oct. 26, 2023.

Officers and noncommissioned officers working within headquarters elements of the Big Red One briefed U.S. Army Col. Brandon Smith, the division chief of staff, summarizing exercise standards of operations and plans in regards to the approaching combat simulation.

As the day closed off, Danger Ready 2 had the division move on from its prepatory phases on toward the training and execution stages, such as the soft start exercise. 
"Being mission ready, being ready to deploy in order to succesfully accomplish a mission is probably the best thing to take away from Danger Ready Two."
