Active, Reserve train together for common goal

The loud din of a Muslim prayer in the background, Soldiers from the 744th Engineer Company and the 3rd Brigade Combat Team, 1st Infantry Division, advanced into a building to search materials used to make roadside bombs.

Fortunately, their lives were not in danger as this was part of their training at the National Training Center in Fort Irwin, Calif., August 5.

"Bravo Team! Clear the rooms upstairs! Check to see if anyone is hiding up there," yelled Sgt. Tanner Nelsen, combat engineer

and team leader with the 744th Eng. Co., of Ogden, Utah, to his crew as they cleared the building.

Nelsen and fellow Soldiers have been training along with Active Duty Soldiers from the 3rd Bde., based in Fort Knox, Ky., to prepare his unit for deployment to Afghanistan.

"This training will be helpful to our unit, the practical exercises provide really good training, and here they have access to equipment that the reserves don't," said Nelsen. "I didn't know so much could be hidden in such tight spaces."

The 744th Eng. Co. rarely has an opportunity to train with Active Duty units with such realistic simulations. But for this particular

simulation Soldiers had the unique opportunity to search buildings in a desert atmosphere with actual interpreters and role players from Iraq and Afghanistan.

"This was my first experience going inside of one of the buildings they have here, but I think it's head and shoulders above the training we've had in the past if only by having actors here who are native to the country we are going to," said Cpl. Jacob Hunsaker, a Logan, Utah, native and combat engineer with the 744th Eng. Co. "I think the environment they have created here makes it feel a lot more realistic than other training places I've been. That's really going to help us out a ton," he added.

The practical exercise was even more realistic by incorporating religious memorabilia and other items to provide an atmosphere similar to what Soldiers from the 744th Eng. Co. may encounter.

“We’re working in buildings that have the language and religious items in the houses so we can learn how to work with those,” said Hunsaker.

The main objective of this search training is to prepare Soldiers identify potential threats and combat the manufacturing of Improvised-Explosive Devices. The training accomplishes this at its core by training Soldiers on what to look for in vehicles, homes and throughout neighborhoods.


“This class was designed based on the terrorist war in Ireland ... Soldiers will be able to leave here and train their platoon so they can actually non-kinetically knock on a door, talk to the head of household and systematically search the building,” said Gary Nielsen, retired Calvary scout and Tactical Site Exploitation/Search instructor at NTC.

Soldiers participating in this type of training are taught to employ unique modalities to conduct the most effective search possible, which will be useful for the 744th’s deployment to Afghanistan.

“If you use the same process every time you conduct a search, you’re less likely to miss something, so it’s better to do the step-by-step process so you know that you got everything,” said Nelsen

(In Afghanistan) we’re working on not only finding that triggerman and getting rid of that IED but also finding the bomb makers, finding where their caches are so we can attack the network, get those bomb makers out and unearth the caches,” said Hunsaker, “If you get one bomb maker you could take a thousand IEDs off the road.”

Search training prepares Soldiers to identify clues in and around a house that may provide an idea of what the home owner does. In the past, this type of training was not always as in depth.

“You can look back on your career and your time in Iraq and realize that you missed a lot when you were out there because when I deployed to Iraq we had no training on actual searching,” said Nelsen. “When I deployed, we just piled all the stuff in the middle of the room.”

“We’re learning here what we need to do to collect evidence properly,” said Hunsaker. “With biometric systems we’ll be able to track people and determine if they have been involved in an attack.”

“So, now when we find command wires or find an IED we’re going to be looking to find evidence from the IED instead of detonating it, which will change how we react to finding an IED than maybe we did before,” Hunsaker added.

The 744th Eng. Co. will soon deploy to Afghanistan to perform route clearance operations and this training provides an opportunity to not only learn to identify

IED predators but to also work alongside Active Duty Soldiers in a simulated training environment.

“It’s cool to get different sides of the spectrum; (Active Duty Soldiers) have a different story to tell than I do and they do this more often than I do. I think both of us bring something new to the table,” said Nelsen.

Soldiers from the 3rd Bde. also benefited from combined training at NTC.

“The reserve Soldiers know a lot of infantry essentials so we were able to easily work as a team,” said Sgt. Nicanor Amper, calvary scout with the Apache Troop, 4th Squadron, 3rd Bde. 1st. Inf. Div., “They know what they’re doing.”

While this isn’t the only training Soldiers from the 744th Eng. Co. will participate in during their time at NTC, it’s one of the most important.

“I’m learning to find IEDs better so that we can protect more Soldiers,” said Hunsaker.

Blackhorse medics provide life-saving training

The sound of bullets flying through the air danced around them while the echoing booms of explosions rocked the ground they stood upon. Two Soldiers saw a comrade on the ground unconscious, their next actions could determine whether he lives or dies.

This scenario was played out during Combat Life Saver Course training at Fritz Field on Fort Irwin, Calif., Aug. 5. The training was provided by medics from the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment's Regimental Aid Station.

"Today, we're conducting an STX (situational training exercise) lane for our CLS training," said Spc. Kathleen Jones, Regimental Headquarters and Headquarters Troop, 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment. "This is the validation; this is where the Soldiers put all the pieces together on what it is like to actually save somebody's life out there on the battlefield."

Jones, a medic at the Regimental Aid Station, said the training is valuable because it saves lives. The Soldiers used the lessons they learned in the classroom environment and applied them to training mannequins.

"Monday and Tuesday were spent in the classroom," Jones, a native of Austin, Mont.,

said. "Yesterday they practiced the individual hands-on skills. And today, we're evaluating their overall performance."

To simulate a combat casualty, Jones and other medics squirted fake blood on training mannequins. The sounds of bullets and explosions

emanated from speakers. The instructors yelled out commands for the students and voice-acted as real casualties would. The students battled midday heat, stress and eventually fatigue.

"There's no giving up," said Pfc. Anthony Green, 719th Transportation Company, New

York National Guard. "This is hard stuff, but no matter what, don't stop."

Some of the lessons learned covered in the four-day class included basic First Aid, needle chest decompression, field dressing and tourniquets. During the training, all the lessons learned were applied while in the middle of simulated combat zone.

"The major things we want them to know are TC3, tactical combat casualty care. That's basically where we're Soldiers first," Jones said. "We always fire back and at that point you move out to your casualty."

Jones added that the CLS training were not only valuable for Soldiers, but the lessons learned can be applied outside of the military.

"It is important because you can put all the skills that they are learning here into their everyday life," Jones said. "Also it's a matter of keeping their skills up; everything is constantly changing in the medical field so it's important for them to stay with the current medical training."

Green, a native of Brooklyn, N.Y., said he not only learned valuable skills, but he also learned a little more about himself.

"I learned that I can do the job if I need to," Green said. "I can save a life."



916th Soldiers, Fort Irwin Fire Department train for worst case scenario

When faced with a chorus of pained screams for help, good teamwork can make the difference between saving lives and wasting time. That was the principle behind a vitally important training exercise held recently at a Fort Irwin training area where combat life saver (CLS) trained Soldiers of the 916th practiced working alongside the newly enhanced Fort Irwin Fire Department paramedics and firemen in mass casualty scenarios.

“This training grows the relationship between Army medics and combat life savers teams and the newly enhanced civilian emergency medical services (EMS) here on Fort Irwin in order to perform at the highest level of preparedness for a worst case scenario, post wide mass-cal. Considering the catastrophic cost if people don’t know how to react, it’s important the Army and civilian EMS get used to working together,” Maj. Jose Galvan, General Support Aviation Battalion (GSAB) executive officer said,

The World Health Organization (WHO) defines mass-casualty as “an event which generates more patients at one time than locally available resources can manage using routine procedures. It requires exceptionally emergency arrangements and additional or extraordinary assistance.”

A large part of mass casualty crisis management is partnerships like the one Fort Irwin recently made with the Inland Counties Emergency Medical Agency (ICEMA), that allow for an increase in the quality of care and number of patients that can be helped at a given time.

Added capabilities like advanced life support (ALS) by having a fire department paramedic ride along with the Fort Irwin air ambulance unit, are recent changes that demonstrate the various organizations commitment to constantly improving the quality of services for the Fort Irwin family community.

Further, in the event it was necessary, patients can now be directed straight to a higher level of care instead of having to use precious time being re-transported from Weed Army Community Hospital, the receiving hospital for Fort Irwin paramedics who would receive medical guidance from doctors at their base station, the Loma Linda University Medical Center.

“Moulaging casualties correctly for any type of training is important because it realistically depicts the injuries seen on the battlefield,” said Cpl. Madelyn Swenor-Valdes, the Training and Orderly Room noncommissioned officer-in-charge for Headquarters, and Headquarters Detachment, General Support Aviation Battalion, who painstakingly applied the moulage “injuries” on Soldier “casualties” like Pvt. Burton Pope.

The lifesaving skills of the 916th CLS Soldier and Fire Department teams were tested as they handled, en mass, the illusionary injuries created by Cpl. Swenor-Valdes and the imagination of the scenarios creator, Staff Sgt. Michael Bishop, ranged from simple abrasions through gunshots and limb amputations.

Every part of the exercise was closely observed and evaluated by Soldier flight medics with the 916th Air Ambulance Detachment, like Sgt. Robert Dorris.

“Overall the training went very well and I look forward to doing many more of these training exercises, eventually including various other Fort Irwin resources,” said Dorris, who also conducted after action reviews immediately following each iteration on the training lane in order to ensure things that went well continue, and any weaknesses that were identified could be fixed during the next.

The main question going into this exercise wasn’t if the various entities knew their roles, but if they could execute them while working together as a team.

After this exercise, it appears the Fort Irwin family community should be pleased to know they’ve got a great team of emergency medical service providers who will provide world class help if there’s ever a need.

Leaders tours Edison's Customer Technology Center

Col. Chevallier and his Operation Battle Blackout Energy Partners were invited to SCE's Customer Technology and Applications Center (CTAC), on July 29, to tour their new Smart Energy Experience. The Smart Experience is designed to help customers learn more about how Smart Grid technologies, researched at Southern California Edison, are creating a smarter, cleaner reliable system for delivering energy to their customers. The smart grid will empower customers to better manage their energy use and reduce their carbon footprint through the use of smart energy devices, plug-in electric vehicles and distributed energy resources at customer's premises. The Edison Smart Connect meters communicate with SCE and customers through a secure two-way wireless network. This means they can send and receive energy use and cost information from their home to the utility and back again.

"I was fortunate to get a sneak preview and I'm very impressed. SCE has done a remarkable job creating this new environment. It looks great and provides a showcase for SCE technologies that will help create a cleaner, smarter electric grid and enable us as customers to better manage our energy use," Col. Chevallier said.

The Operation Battle Blackout Partners were given a complete tour of the center, and then had lunch with SCE Vice President Lisa Cagnolotti, who briefed the team on how the Smart Meter installation project was going. The event concluded with an update on rates by SCE Account Manager Peter Giannotti, who stressed the importance of the Operation Battle Blackout Program.

Col. Chevallier reiterated the importance of energy savings at Fort Irwin and noted that "we are asking these soldiers to save electricity and they are complying. What incentives are we going to provide to these soldiers for their efforts? How do we acknowledge the contractors on the installation for their efforts? There is more work for all of us to make this program more successful"

Back to School (Bus) Awareness

Know and obey school bus laws


If you fail to stop for a school bus with RED LIGHTS FLASHING & STOP ARM EXTENDED you will be cited and fined.

CAUTION: The majority of children killed in pupil transportation are not killed on the bus, but OUTSIDE the bus. Many are struck by motorists who fail to stop for the flashing red lights and extended stop arm. This area around the stopped school bus is often referred to as the "DANGER ZONE."




AMBER LIGHTS

A school bus driver activates the WARNING amber signals atop the bus 150 feet before stopping. When the amber lights flash, you should immediately prepare to stop your vehicle. If the speed limit is more than 45 MPH, the driver must give 300 feet of warning.




RED LIGHTS & STOP ARM

You **MUST STOP** for a school bus when the red lights atop the bus are flashing and the stop arm is extended; this means that children are getting on or off the bus. Stop at least 20 feet from the bus and remain stopped until the lights are turned off.



HAZARD WARNING LIGHTS

Always exercise caution when approaching a stopped school bus. You are not required to stop when the hazard warning lights are flashing but should proceed with caution because students may be getting on or off the bus.



COMMON MISTAKES BY MOTORISTS Violations that endanger our children



You are turning from any lane and from any direction onto a street where the school bus is stopped, the red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended. Stay stopped in your original lane, before the turn is made, until the lights are turned off and the arm is withdrawn.



On a two lane roadway you must stop for a stopped school bus displaying red lights and extended stop arm.



(LEFT) When approaching a school bus from behind with flashing red lights and extended stop arm you may **NOT** pass the bus on **EITHER** side.

(RIGHT) On a two lane roadway you must stop for a stopped school bus displaying red lights and extended stop arm.

GENERAL SAFETY TIPS

Common sense, situational awareness, and trusting your instincts will reduce your risk of being sexually assaulted. Following the tips below will also decrease your chances of being attacked. Be aware of situations where you can become the perpetrator.

- Consume alcohol in moderation. Do not leave your beverage unattended or accept a drink from an open container.

- When you date someone, communicate clearly with that person to ensure he or she knows your limits from the beginning. Both verbal and nonverbal (body language) communication can be used to ensure the message is understood.
- If you go on a date with someone you do not know very well, tell a close friend what your plans are. Remember what consent is. No means No...not maybe!
- Always have extra money to get home. Have a plan for someone you can call if you need help.
- If you feel uncomfortable, scared, or pressured, act quickly to end the situation.

- Say, "Stop it" and leave or call for help.
- Remember **BYSTANDER INTERVENTION!** When you go to a party, go with a group of friends. Arrive together, watch out for each other, and leave together. Do not allow yourself or your friend to be isolated with a person you or they do not know or trust. Plan your outings and avoid getting into a bad situation.
- Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Walk only in lighted areas after dark.
- Keep the doors to homes, barracks, and cars locked.

- Know where the phone is located.
- You have the right to say "No" even if you:
 - Say yes, but change your mind
 - Have had sex with this partner before
 - Have been kissing or "making out"
 - Are wearing "provocative" clothing


