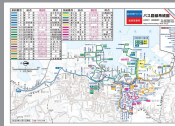
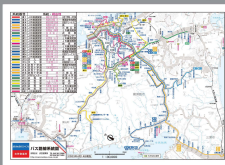
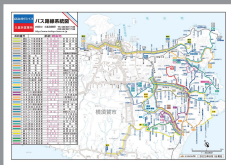

Yokosuka's Bus Maps

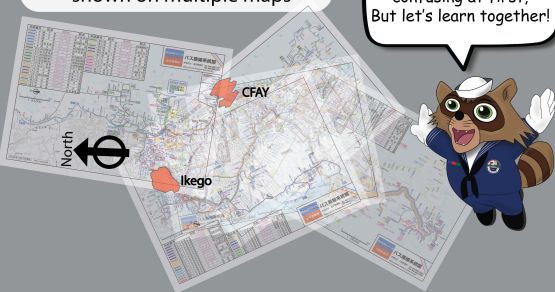
Each map covers a different section of the city



Bus Maps Connected

Many routes are connected and shown on multiple maps

I know it seems confusing at first, But let's learn together!



Reading a Bus Map

Find your start point and destination on the map then determine which line is best for your trip.

Bus stops are often used by more than one route, consider where you can transfer to another route if needed.

Dont be afraid to use a translation app!



Colored line

Shows a complete bus route that is featured on the map

Gray line

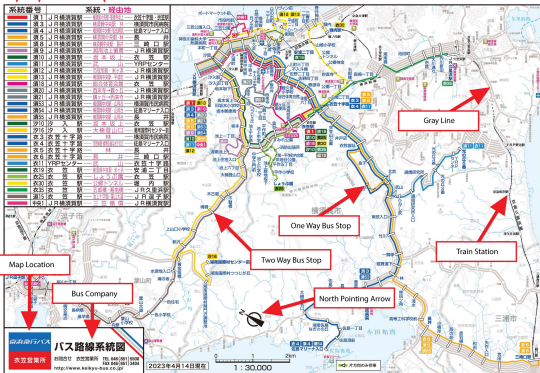
Shows a partial bus line that is featured on a separate map

Two Way Bus Stop

Indicates that the bus will stop in both directions
Every line that passes through the shape will stop at that location

One Way Bus Stop

Indicates that the bus will only stop in the direction of the arrow
Every line that passes through the shape will stop at that location



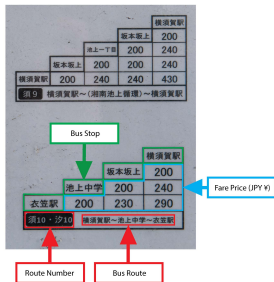
Reading Bus Tables

Fare Tables

This table is used to determine the cost of bus fare. Tables are posted at the bus stop.

How to use:

- 1 - Find the table that matches to your desired route (Red).
- 2 - Find the stop where you will board the bus (Green).
- 3 - Find the stop where you will exit the bus (Green).
- 4 - The square where your boarding and exit stops intersect will show the fare price (Blue).



Time Tables

A bus will depart that stop at every time shown on the table.

Each bus stop will have a time table posted somewhere visible.

The vertical axis shows the hour and the horizontal axis shows the minute.

Finding the Right Bus

Train stations and bus terminals with multiple bus stops often have maps that show the which busses stop at each station. The image to the right is the map from JR Yokosuka Station.

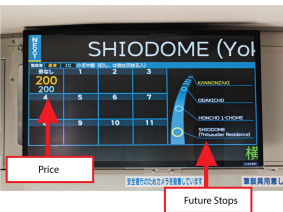
Normal bus stops will have a sign posted that shows the routes that stop at that location. Many stops will have multiple routes.

Each bus displays its route and route number on the front and back of the bus. See the examples below.

Make sure to check the route number on the bus. Just because a bus comes to the stop does not mean it is the right bus for you!



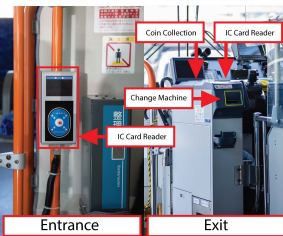
Riding the Bus



Prices and future stops will be displayed and updated on the TV at the front of the bus.



Press the Stop Button to alert the driver to stop at the next bus stop.



You can pay for your trip by putting cash in the collection machine when you exit the bus, or by tapping your IC Card on the reader when you enter and exit the bus.



IC Cards are prepaid cards that can be used for busses, trains, vending machines, and some stores.

IC Cards can be purchased and recharged at most train stations.

Use an IC Card to make traveling easier!
