


Fort Riley's Victory Week: Units celebrate history, Victory with competitions

Historic Places

Building 214 Custer Avenue, like many others in this area, was constructed as barracks. It opened in 1903 along with its neighbor building 212, and building 208. In fact, these three buildings are

nearly identical except for the porch structure that was retained on the exterior of bldg. 214. Most barracks built during this time period included a porch or balcony structure that was later removed.
