



Welcome to Fort Leavenworth



Colonel Henry Leavenworth and the soldiers of the 3rd Infantry Regiment crossed the Missouri River in 1827 to establish Cantonment

Leavenworth. Eventually this isolated outpost would later become the "Intellectual Center of the Army". The Frontier Army Museum features a unique blend of horse-drawn vehicles, weapons, uniforms, and equipment to tell the story of the Frontier Army's role in the exploration and settlement of the West and growth of Fort Leavenworth.



The museum collection contains over six thousand artifacts used by the Frontier Army, as well as items related to Fort Leavenworth.



Programs and Services

The museum offers a range of soldier, DoD civilian, and school education programs, a reference and research collection, and general meeting space for ceremonies. Schools and tour groups are welcome and guided tours are available with prior coordination.



The galleries explore activities of the Frontier Army from the Lewis and Clark Expedition to the Pursuit of Poncho Villa into Mexico by General John Pershing (1917) known as the Punitive Expedition.
