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

CPO Initiation

For 131 years, the Navy publicly announces the names of those chosen to advance to the rank of Chief Petty Officer. Following this announcement and jubilation, an initiation process commences unlike any other in the Armed Forces. Towards the end of last month and into this month, you have and will continue to see those Chief Petty Officer Selects alternating between running amok and huddled in a corner in heated but clandestine discussion. This initiation process is essential, as these CPO Selects have mere weeks to prepare to assume the mantle of one of the most difficult jobs the Navy has to offer – the responsibility of wearing the gold fouled anchor.



All events that take place as part of CPO Initiation have been in the works for months, discussed and planned in a forum environment in exhausting detail. These events provide invaluable training in deckplate leadership, institutional and technical expertise, professionalism, loyalty, character, active communication, a sense of heritage, and practicing the Warrior Toughness mindset.



MACHINERY REPAIRMAN FEATURE



AMERICA's Machinery Repairmen, or MR's, are responsible for fabricating some of the smallest parts of the ship with the biggest impact. As the secret backbone of the ship, they utilize many machines, such as a lathe machine, hydraulic press, pedestal grinder, and more. They can start with raw, unformed metal and transform it into vital equipment, such as fittings and adapters for High Pressure Air Compressor (HPAC), combat weapons elevator, 20k forklift, and other important equipment. "You can ask ten different machinists how to do a job, and you will get eleven different answers," said Machinery Repairman 1st Class Sierra Lozeau, far right, from Leominster, Massachusetts.







Although all the MR's share the same job, they all have different amounts of experience and various methods of conducting those jobs. Some were familiar with the occupation for their entire life, while others never imagined being engineers at all. Still, they press on with their hard work and take pride in their honed craftsmanship.

"My dad was a Machinery Repairman first class [...] and civilian side, he worked as a machinist," said Machinery Repairman 1st Class David Quintero, from Roswell, New Mexico, "I grew up with the MR rating and a machinist [background], so this is what I know and I love it."
