2018

- On **Oct. 1, 2018**, Naval Hospital Jacksonville became the first Navy MTF to transition to the Defense Health Agency (DHA). To complement transition, BUMED established **Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) Jacksonville**.

2019

- Additional NMRTCs were established at naval medical centers, naval hospitals, and clinics in **2019** and **2020**.



NMRTC'S EXPEDITIONARY MEDICINE SYSTEMS (EXMEDs)

- Navy **Expeditionary Medicine Systems (EXMEDs)** are the platforms assigned to and deployed from NMRTCs used to accomplish Navy Medicine's mission.
- EXMEDs **provide the modular, adaptive, and scalable capabilities** required to fight and win in a distributed maritime environment.
- Among the NMRTC-based EXMEDs are **Casualty Receiving and Treatment Ships (CRTS)**, **En-Route Care Systems (ERCS)**, **Expeditionary Medical Facilities (EMFs)**, **Expeditionary Medical Units (EMUs)**, and **Expeditionary Resuscitative Surgical Systems (ERSSs)**.
