
Forward optical fabrication keeps Soldiers in the fight

FORT DETRICK, Md. — In a combat setting, situational awareness is everything. Being able to see clearly, no matter the situation, is a crucial part of staying ready to fight and win against an adversary. That's why the U.S. Army has optical fabrication capabilities positioned in forward locations, such as in Germany and Korea, to provide quick-turn services on various products that keep service members ready to go, including prescription glasses, gas mask inserts, flight goggles and various types of eye protection. “Service members overseas can technically order glasses through state-side vendors, but this process is often slower and less efficient, leading to delays that could impact readiness and operational effectiveness,” said Staff Sgt. Anthony Perez.
