
Gricignano Mayor Visits NSA Naples Support Site, Discusses Partnership

Deputy Commander, Military Sealift Command Visits Naples Based Area Command

NAPLES, Italy – Deputy Commander, Military Sealift Command (MSC), Rear Adm. Mark F. Haigis visited Commander, Task Force 63 (CTF-63) / Military Sealift Command Europe and Africa (MSCEURAF) in Naples, Italy as part of a regional tour of area commands Dec. 6, 2024.

During the visit, Haigis received briefs from various staff departments to gain a stronger understanding of region-specific challenges and best practices. Members of the staff highlighted areas such as Readiness and Sustainment, Reserve Force Support and integration with allies, partners and other units across the theater.

“Considering the broad scope of responsibilities managed by the MSC – 63 team, it’s important to keep higher headquarters up to speed on the challenges we face as well as the unique opportunities we have to integrate with not just 6th Fleet units, but other partners and allies in the region,” said MSCEURAF Deputy Commodore, Cmdr. Natalie Frantz.

Haigis emphasized the important role local area commands such as MSCEURAF / CTF-63 play in the supply and sustainment of U.S. and allied forces in the region.

“Having the area commands work hand-in-hand locally with the fleets they support has an outsized impact on mission accomplishment,” said Haigis. “Our area commands having these processes established makes it all that much easier for the maintenance and scaling of our capabilities when the need arises.”

MSC directs and supports operations for approximately 140 civilian-crewed ships that replenish U.S. Navy ships at sea, conduct specialized missions, preposition combat cargo at sea around the world, perform a variety of support services, and move military equipment and supplies to deployed U.S. forces. Celebrating its 75th anniversary in 2024, MSC exists to support the joint warfighter across the full spectrum of military operations, with a workforce that includes approximately 6,000 Civil Service Mariners and 1,100 contract mariners, supported by 1,500 shore staff and 1,400 active duty and reserve military personnel.

NSA Naples Hosts Multi-Command Emergency Vehicle Operation Course

Off-Base Housing:

Security Deposits Transitioning to Electronic Payments

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

At the direction of higher headquarters, Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT), NSA Naples is transitioning to electronic fund transfer (EFT) for off-base housing security deposit to ensure that our personnel living off-base can expect the same processes and standards they would experience at all other DoD bases across the world.

If you're stationed in the Naples area, residing off-base, and paid your security deposit in cash, it will be returned to you electronically and you will pay it back to your landlord electronically. The housing office will contact you to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable our personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

Electronic payment removes a layer of bureaucracy allowing tenants to receive their security deposit directly from the landlord instead of going through NSA Naples housing office. Quick and easy.

Furthermore, electronic payment is more convenient than taking a trip to the ATM to get cash and more secure than carrying cash around. Going electronic will also reduce and/or eliminate the potential for cash drain at installation ATMs.

In the modern era, electronic payments are the preferred method of monetary transactions for every other overseas station and keeps an electronic transaction history, vice dependence on paper payment receipts.

This change will ONLY affect tenant personnel residing off-base that have executed private lease agreements through the NSA Naples Housing Service Center (HSC) prior to 10 June 2024.

Personnel PCSing out of Italy by December 2025 will be grandfathered in and not be affected by this new policy.

The housing office will contact all concerned to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

Your Questions Answered

What if the landlord refuses to return the deposit?

A landlord who fails to return the deposit to a tenant would be subject to immediate removal from the NSA Naples housing program. It is an extremely rare occurrence to see a landlord who fails to return a security deposit back to tenant here in Naples. Per the lease agreement, and in rare instances where security deposit dispute between tenant and landlord cannot be resolved through informal meeting with the housing office, either party will have all remedies available to them under the law. As a DoD personnel, if you are not getting the legal help you need, you should always engage your chain of command to escalate the issue through appropriate channels.

Will the security deposit be returned in Euros?

Deposits are electronically returned in Euros if you provide account information that includes an IBAN number linked to a Euro bank account. If a tenant has a U.S. bank account, they will receive the money in dollars. Most personnel that own a community bank account have reported that it makes security deposit, rent, and bill payments to Italian landlords much easier. Other personnel are known to use the wire transfer service known as Wise. As for the exchange rate, this fluctuates on a daily basis and each tenant may realize a positive or negative difference between transactions depending on when the transaction occurs.

Is it my responsibility to inform my landlord about this policy change?

No. The housing service center will explain the policy change to each landlord.

Radon Action Month: Radon Management at NSA Naples

On-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are in compliance with the Navy Radon Program.

January is Radon Awareness Month. National Radon Action Month aims to increase the public's awareness of radon, promote radon testing and mitigation, and advance the use of radon-resistant new construction practices. This edition of Naples Navigator provides a snapshot of radon management at NSA Naples.

While NSA Naples has a known overall potential for elevated radon levels, classifying the installation as a Radon Potential Category (RPC) 1 according to the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP), the installation is complying with NAVRAMP testing and mitigation policies at government owned/controlled units.

NSA Naples is currently conducting radon testing as part of the NAVRAMP. Radon measurement devices were deployed from 5-23 August 2024 by qualified environmental contractors in non-residential rooms and buildings and unaccompanied residences across the installation.

To ensure accurate testing results, DO NOT remove, disturb, or cover the devices during the testing period. It will take approximately 15 months to collect and process the survey data (around November 2025). NSA Naples will notify the community once results are received and it will be posted on the installation's official website.

What If Testing Reveals My Office Space/Residence has Elevated Radon Levels?

The health and safety of all is top priority. If the radon testing identifies elevated radon levels at any actionable level in your space or residence, the installation will immediately notify tenants. Although radon exposure is the second-leading environmental cause of lung cancer death (after tobacco smoke), the benefit of screening for lung cancer has not been established. Currently, no effective, community-wide medical screening tests are recommended for the medical prevention or early diagnosis and treatment of radon-induced lung cancer.

The U.S. Preventive Task Force Services does now recommend annual low-dose chest CT scanning in asymptomatic adults aged 50-80 who have a long smoking history regardless of any radon exposure. If you ever received notification that your home or office space had elevated levels of radon above the EPA and Navy action level (4 picocuries per liter [4 pCi/L] or higher), or have health concerns about exposure to radon, please contact your medical provider.

Current Situation of Radon Management for On-Base Housing, Government Owned/Controlled Units

NSA Naples on-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are in compliance with the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program. That is, they are either tested or mitigated or currently being tested like in the case of non-residential rooms, buildings and unaccompanied residences stated above.

Current Situation of Radon Management for Off-Base Housing

Personnel that live off-base have entered into a private contract with their landlord, therefore limiting the scope with which the U.S. government may intervene or have control over said contract. However, DoD personnel living off-base can work with their landlord to test for and mitigate radon, if desired, at their own expense. The lessee may work with the lessor to address any identified issues, as outlined in Section 19 of the NSA Naples housing lease.

RPC1 Explained!

As mentioned earlier, NSA Naples has a known overall potential for elevated radon levels, classifying the installation as a Radon Potential Category (RPC) 1 in accordance with the NAVRAMP.

Does RPC1 mean all buildings at NSA Naples have high radon levels?

No. RPC1 is simply the level assigned when even one unit or building is found on the installation with a radon level over the minimum threshold of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L). During the last radon testing (2022-2023) which focused on residential buildings owned or leased by the Navy, radon was detected at concentrations over 4.0 pCi/L in four (4) out of 291 units tested. Note that the RPC1 classification is not related to the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA).

The EPA and Centers for Disease Control (CDC) state there is no safe minimum level of radon exposure, however, at 4.0 pCi/L they recommend mitigation. The NAVRAMP takes that recommendation a step further, requiring that Naval installations implement and complete mitigation measures within a two-year timeframe for levels between 4 and 20 pCi/L. It is important to understand that radon levels can fluctuate over time and with changes in the environment and the building itself.



In-Focus: Water Quality in Naples

Drinking Water On-Base

One of Naples Public Health Evaluation's enduring processes is water safety which seeks to ensure that drinking water at all NSA Naples installations is tested and monitored routinely to ensure the water is fit for human consumption. The drinking water is tested in accordance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Italian and Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) monitoring requirements on a daily, monthly, quarterly, and annual basis to ensure compliance with standards and be able to declare the water is fit for human consumption.

For instance, in 2024, NSA Naples collected 496 drinking water samples and performed over 6,300 tests in three categories: **Chemical**, more than 3,700 tests looking for over 180 chemical parameters; **Bacteriological**, more than 700 tests looking for over 5 Microbiological parameters; and **Field Measurements**, more than 1,800 tests looking for six field parameters. The tests looked specifically for 191 contaminants in five major groups: microbial contaminants; pesticides and herbicides; inorganic contaminants; organic chemical contaminants, and radioactive contaminants.

The health and well-being of all personnel and families in Naples is the base's top priority. Routine testing ensures compliance with drinking water standards that are required to declare the water as fit for human consumption. The base is committed to keeping the military family fully informed through timely dissemination of credible information with complete transparency.

Water Sources, Testing, Treatment

The drinking water Consumer Confidence Reports (CCR) outlines all the water sources, testing and treatment process for NSA Naples installations: Capodichino, Support Site, SATCOM Lago Patria, Carney Park, and Gaeta Olde Mill Inn. The CCR is an annual on-base water quality report that a water system is required to provide every year to its customers. This is just like any public water system in the United States. The CCR helps people make informed choices about the water they drink. Drinking Water Off-Base

Unlike on-base, the water quality cannot be verified at each off-base location or residence. As a precautionary measure, all personnel who live off-base are provided with bottled water for consumption. Bottled water is provided through housing lease provisions for all personnel living off-base. What Is Naples Public Health Evaluation (NPHE)?

The Naples Public Health Evaluation is a comprehensive study of the health risks associated with potential exposure to chemicals in the environment resulting from the area's waste disposal practices. The Campania region of Italy has experienced numerous challenges associated with trash collection, open burning of uncollected trash and illegal waste disposal practices. In response to health concerns expressed by U.S. Navy personnel in 2007, the Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT) contacted the Navy and Marine Corps Force Health Protection Command (NMCFHPC) to conduct a comprehensive public health evaluation to assess the potential health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Naples area. The NPHE was conducted from January 2008 to June 2011.

What did the Navy learn from NPHE?

Through the Public Health Evaluation, the Navy has been able to identify and address public health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Campania region. The Navy established new health-protective policies and took immediate action to protect the health of U.S. personnel and their families. **Many of these health-protective policies remain in place, as enduring processes, to ensure continued health protection beyond the life of the study.**



Fact Sheet: Water Consumption for Off-Base Housing



If you rent a property in the economy, it is important to know about POTABLE WATER. The rental unit must be supplied with city water. **It is also extremely forbidden to supply the property with well water.** The penalty will be the immediate termination of the contract.

The landlord will provide potable water **every month** and must obtain receipts from the tenant.

The landlord will choose how to supply the water: either with bottled water or installing a water cooler system. In both cases, the company must be one of the NSA Naples-approved service sources, please see below:

- Acqua Minerale San Benedetto S.p.A
- Acque Minerali d' Italia S.p.A
- Culligan Vicenza AAFES Water Plant
- Gran Guizza S.p.A San Pellegrino S.p.A
- Acqua Vera San Pellegrino S.p.A
- Levissima Plant Spumador S.p.A



The landlord will provide the necessary amount of bottled water and/or containers of water for the cooler according to family composition, as indicated in the orders, **four liters per day per person as per NSA Naples guidelines. Bottled Waters should be used for drinking/cooking purposes.**

Economy Housing Comment Cards

When transitioning to economy housing, it's important to make sure the home you are moving into is a good fit for you. Housing provides a comment card to every tenant upon move-out, which allows prospective tenants to review feedback from the previous tenant. You can review these comments to gain insight into the home's condition, but please note that these comment cards can only be viewed at the Housing office. Be sure to schedule an appointment to come in and review them before making your final decision.

If you're preparing for a move, we strongly encourage you to fill out a comment card for your current home. Your feedback is vital in helping future tenants and ensuring ongoing improvements.

Should you encounter issues with your home that you can't resolve on your own, please don't hesitate to contact Housing. We are here to advocate on your behalf with the landlord. However, please note that we are not a legal service, and if you run into legal issues, we recommend reaching out to legal for assistance.

TLA Process is Changing-Now Easier to Navigate!

We're excited to announce that the Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) process is becoming more streamlined and easier to navigate. Housing has introduced a new TLA form, created through our housing database, designed to simplify the steps for service members and families seeking reimbursement. Here's how the process works:

2. Form Generation: Once we receive your documents, we'll generate the TLA form for you directly from our housing database.
3. Sign and Return: After we've created and signed the form, you'll need to review, sign it and send it back to housing and your CPPA to complete the process.



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Feeding Stray Animals is Prohibited On-Base

Per NAVSUPACT NAPLES INSTRUCTION 10570.2H CH-1, all personnel who live and work on base are prohibited from feeding stray animals. This policy is in place to ensure the safety, health and well-being of both the community and our environment. Feeding stray or feral animals on government property is strictly prohibited and punishable under Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ). Additionally, civilian personnel, NA TO personnel and all dependents violating the regulations established in this policy are subject to administrative action.

Pest's on Support Site

Keeping pests out of your home is crucial for maintain a healthy living environment. Pests such as cockroaches, rodents and other insects can bring health risks and cause damage to your property. Fortunately, there are several steps you can take to prevent infestations and ensure your home stays pest free.

1. Keep Your Home Clean

A clean home is one of the best deterrents against pests. Regularly sweep, vacuum, and wipe down surfaces to remove food crumbs and spills that may attract pests. Don't forget to clean behind appliances and under furniture where food can accumulate unnoticed.

2. Proper Food Storage

Store food in sealed containers, especially items like grains, cereals, and snacks. Pests are drawn to easily accessible food sources. Keep fruits and vegetables in the refrigerator, and promptly discard any food that's past the expiration date.

3. Call the Help Desk When Necessary

If you notice pests in your home that you cannot eliminate, please contact the help desk. Resolving the issue may require multiple appointments, especially in the case of rodents.

We care deeply about the health of our residents and are committed to protecting you. Please don't hesitate to reach out to the help desk if you're unable to resolve the issue on your own.

The Housing Early Assistance Tool (HEAT) assists Service Members and their families in applying for housing Navy wide. HEAT allows Service Members and their families to get the housing application process started at one or more Navy installations online before or after they receive their permanent change of station orders. HEAT is available to any Service Member at all Navy installations. HEAT creates an easy user experience to connect with your destination. Spouses can use the application as well, needing only minimal information about their Service Member. A housing referral professional will be in touch within 2 business days.

New Italian Traffic Laws in Effect Since Dec. 14, 2024



Driving while using a cell phone:

Fine from 250 up to €1,000 and automatic suspension of the driver's license (DL) for 1 or 2 weeks. If this same violation is committed more than once within a two-year timeframe, the suspension of the driver's license will be from 1 to 3 months and a fine of up to €1,400 and a deduction of 10 points from the DL.

Seat belt violations:

Driving without a seatbelt or against the traffic flow: a fine of up to €1,400 and the suspension of the DL can go up to 3 months

Parking violations:

>>Parking in disabled reserved spots: fine from €165 to €660 for motorbikes and from €330 to €990 for cars.
>>Parking in spots reserved for public transportation vehicles: fines of up to €328 for motorbikes and up to €660 for cars

Speeding violations:

Speeding: if the speed limit is violated more than once in a city center within one year, there will be a fine of up to €1084 and the suspension of the DL from 15 to 30 days.

Electric scooters:

Helmet use is now mandatory for everybody. Until now, it was only mandatory for minors. Insurance and tags are also mandatory. These scooters cannot drive on sidewalks, cannot drive against the traffic flow, and can only circulate on city streets with a speed limit that does not exceed 50 km/h. *NOTE: The installation is working to provide additional guidance on how to register and insure e-scooters. We will communicate this information to the community when available.*

Abandonment of animals:

To the existing provision of the criminal code (art. 727); a further paragraph has been added: if the animal is abandoned on the road or next to one, the punishment is from €1,000 euros up to €10,000. Also, vehicular homicide and vehicular serious injuries now have a provision increasing the punishment in case the accident was caused by an abandoned animal (provided that the owner is identified).

Driving Under the Influence (DUI):

When someone is convicted of DUI, a specific code (either 68 or 69 depending on the situation) has to be added to the driver's license issued in Italy. Please note that when it comes to our service members, we obtain jurisdiction in basically 100% of the cases, so there will only very rarely be a conviction in Italy, but this provision may apply to civilians and dependents although, given that their DLs are not issued in Italy, we don't know if the Italian Ministry of Transportation is going to come up with some additional provision specifically aimed at our civilians and dependents. The changes also provide that whoever has been convicted for DUI (requiring code 69) needs to install, at his/her own expenses a device, called alcolock, which prevents the car from starting if alcohol is detected. A specific decree issued by the Ministry of Transportation must be issued to establish the technical specification of the device. It will take six months for the device to be issued.

Driving on Controlled Substances:

The big novelty here is that it is not necessary anymore that the driver's psychophysics state is altered by those substances but it is enough to be charged with this violation if you drive after taking those substances even without being intoxicated. If the law enforcement conducting the assessment has found reasons to think that the driver has taken those substances, they can proceed to take a sample of the driver's saliva. If the driver was involved in a car accident, a sample of saliva must always be collected. A specific decree issuing the guidelines on collection procedures must be issued before this provision enters into force.

Definitions and Recommendations

If exhibiting symptoms of an infectious respiratory disease, including colds, influenza, and COVID-19, should not come to the workplace or conduct official travel until symptoms have begun to resolve. Symptoms of an infectious respiratory disease may include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.

Commanders and supervisors should permit symptomatic individuals to utilize situational telework when possible.

It is highly recommended to remain up-to-date with all vaccines as they become available.
