

# Security Deposits Transitioning to Electronic Payments

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

At the direction of higher headquarters, Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT), NSA Naples is transitioning to electronic fund transfer (EFT) for off-base housing security deposit to ensure that our personnel living off-base can expect the same processes and standards they would experience at all other DoD bases across the world.

If you're stationed in the Naples area, residing off-base, and paid your security deposit in cash, it will be returned to you electronically and you will pay it back to your landlord electronically. The housing office will contact you to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

This higher headquarter directed security deposit policy change aligns NSA Naples with all other DoD bases across the world and will enable our personnel to experience the convenience of electronic payments.

Electronic payment removes a layer of bureaucracy allowing tenants to receive their security deposit directly from the landlord instead of going through NSA Naples housing office. Quick and easy.

Furthermore, electronic payment is more convenient than taking a trip to the ATM to get cash and more secure than carrying cash around. Going electronic will also reduce and/or eliminate the potential for cash drain at installation

In the modern era, electronic payments are the preferred method of monetary transactions for every other overseas station and keeps an electronic transaction history, vice dependence on paper payment receipts.

This change will ONLY affect tenant personnel residing offbase that have executed private lease agreements through the NSA Naples **Housing Service Center (HSC)** prior to 10 June 2024.

**Personnel PCSing out of** Italy by December 2025 will be grandfathered in and not be affected by this new policy.

The housing office will contact all concerned to sign two acknowledgement forms and a lease amendment to complete the process and go electronic.

### Your Questions Answered

What if the landlord refuses to return the

A landlord who fails to return the deposit to a tenant would be subject to immediate removal from the NSA Naples housing program. It is an extremely rare occurrence to see a landlord who fails to return a security deposit back to tenant here in Naples. Per the lease agreement, and in rare instances where security deposit dispute between tenant and landlord cannot be resolved through informal meeting with the housing office, either party will have all remedies available to them under the law. As a DoD personnel, if you are not getting the legal help you need, you should always engage your chain of command to escalate the issue through appropriate channels.

Will the security deposit be returned in Euros?


Deposits are electronically returned in Euros if you provide account information that includes an IBAN number linked to a Euro bank account. If a tenant has a U.S. bank account, they will receive the money in dollars. Most personnel that own a community bank account have reported that it makes security deposit, rent, and bill payments to Italian landlords much easier. Other personnel are known to use the wire transfer service known as Wise. As for the exchange rate, this fluctuates on a daily basis and each tenant may realize a positive or negative difference between transactions depending on when the transaction occurs.

Is it my responsibility to inform my landlord about this policy change?

No. The housing service center will explain the policy change to each landlord.

# Radon Awareness: 5 Things You Need to Know

On-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are in compliance with the Navy Radon Management Program.

#### Where does radon come from?

Radon is a naturally occurring, radioactive gas that is odorless, colorless, and tasteless. Radon gas is released from rocks and soil and can move to air, groundwater, and surface water.

#### How will I know if there is radon in my house? Can I smell it?

No, radon is odorless, colorless, and tasteless. The only way to detect radon is through testing. policies at government

#### How can I test my home if I live in a government owned/controlled unit?

In compliance with the Navy Radon Assessment and Mitigation Program (NAVRAMP), NSA Naples on-base residential and non-residential units, including off-base Government leased units are either tested or mitigated or currently being tested. If you ever receive notification from the base that your home or office space has elevated levels of radon above the EPA and Navy action level (4 picocuries per liter or higher), or have health concerns about exposure to radon, please contact your medical provider.

#### How can I test my home if I live off-base on the economy?

Personnel that live off-base have entered into a private contract with their landlord, therefore limiting the scope with which the U.S. government may intervene or have control over If you have specific questions about your home said contract. However, DoD personnel living off-base can work with their landlord to test for and mitigate radon, if desired, at their own expense. The lessee may work with the lessor to address any identified issues, as outlined in Section 19 of the NSA Naples housing lease.

#### What are the health impacts of radon?

Although radon exposure is the second-leading environmental cause of lung cancer death (after tobacco smoke), the benefit of screening for lung cancer has not been established. Currently, no effective, community-wide medical screening tests are recommended for the medical prevention or early diagnosis and treatment of radon-induced lung cancer. The U.S. Preventive Task Force Services does now recommend annual low-dose chest CT scanning in asymptomatic adults aged 50-80 who have a long smoking history regardless of any radon exposure.

While NSA Naples has a known overall potential for elevated radon levels, classifying the installation as a Radon Potential Category (RPC) 1 according to NAVRAMP, the installation is complying with NAVRAMP testing and mitigation owned/controlled units. RPC 1 is simply the level assigned when even one unit or building is found on the installation with a radon level over the minimum threshold of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).

# Naples Public Health Evaluation **In-Focus: Food Safety in Naples**

#### Food Inspection On-Base

One of Naples Public Health Evaluation's enduring processes is food safety, which seeks to ensure that food sold at the Commissary on U.S. Naval Support Activity, Naples Support Site is safe to eat and undergoes a rigorous process by the U.S. Army Veterinary Command (VETCOM) who serve as the local food inspectors before entering the store to be sold. The Commissary has labeled the fresh produce to inform shoppers of the area from which the produce is grown. Much of the produce in the Commissary is from Germany and Northern Italy.

#### Continuous Food Safety Monitoring

Food provided on base is monitored on an ongoing basis. The U.S. Naval Hospital Naples Preventive Medicine routinely inspects all dining facilities on base to ensure that food is properly stored, maintained, and prepared.

In accordance with Department of Defense Directive 6400.4, VETCOM ensures inspectors are stationed in the Commissary and consistently monitor food products; all food products are from VETCOM-approved sources that have been inspected; buying from approved sources is required for all meat, dairy, eggs, prepared vegetables and bottled water (fresh produce is exempt in Western Europe); proper facility sanitation; personal hygiene practices of food service workers; and education of food service managers and employees about food safety.

#### Food Inspections Off-Base

The U.S. Government does not inspect restaurants or supermarkets off-base. Italy has a system in place to inspect Italian food facilities, markets, and suppliers. However, the health and well-being of all personnel and families in Naples is the base's top priority. VETCOM inspects Italian food manufacturing facilities producing food that is supplied to U.S. military installations.

#### Food Safety Tips

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services provides valuable sanitary practices that can apply wherever you live in the world:

- Wash fresh fruits and vegetables thoroughly with potable water prior to eating or cooking.
- Immune-compromised people should consume only cooked fruits and vegetables.
- Use separate cutting boards, plates and utensils for uncooked and cooked meats to avoid cross-contamination.
- Use a food thermometer to make sure meat is cooked to a safe temperature.
- Refrigerate hot or cold leftover food within two hours of being served. Keep leftovers for three to four days when properly refrigerated.

#### What Is Naples Public Health Evaluation (NPHE)?

The Naples Public Health Evaluation is a comprehensive study of the health risks associated with potential exposure to chemicals in the environment resulting from the area's waste disposal practices. The Campania region of Italy has experienced numerous challenges associated with trash collection, open burning of uncollected trash and illegal waste disposal practices. In response to health concerns expressed by U.S. Navy personnel in 2007, the Commander, Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (CNREURAFCENT) contacted the Navy and Marine Corps Force Health Protection Command (NMCFHPC) to conduct a comprehensive public health evaluation to assess the potential health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Naples area. The NPHE was conducted from January 2008 to June 2011.

#### What did the Navy learn from NPHE?

Through the Public Health Evaluation, the Navy has been able to identify and address public health risks for U.S. personnel living in the Campania region. The Navy established new health-protective policies and took immediate action to protect the health of U.S. personnel and their families. Many of these health-protective policies remain in place, as enduring processes, to ensure continued health protection beyond the life of the study.

# Your Health: Facts for Families in Naples

About: Food On and Off-Base

The U.S. Navy is committed to ensuring our families are safe while serving our country at home or overseas. The following information is provided as part of a wide-ranging effort to understand the health risks of our personnel and families living in Naples, Italy. A comprehensive Public Health Evaluation was conducted to assess potential short and long-term health risks associated with living in the Naples area (see left panel). In line with our commitment to continually share important health information, we encourage you to review the following information.

In 2007, numerous reports of high dioxin levels and other chemicals in air, water, and soil created a concern amongst the U.S. Navy community that foods grown in the Campania region could be contaminated. Articles in newspapers and in some Italian scientific journals alleged links between adverse health effects and the toxic waste dumps in the Campania region. These articles implicated locally grown vegetables, fruits, and mozzarella di bufala as possibly contaminated foods.

As part of the Navy's overall efforts to be protective of the health of U.S. military and civilian personnel and their families in Naples, the Navy and U.S. Army Veterinary Command (VETCOM) conducted an investigation of foods produced in the Campania region and sold in the Naples Gricignano D'Aversa Navy Commissary (Commissary). The food study was performed in February 2008.

VETCOM is the Department of Defense executive agent for food safety and quality assurance and is responsible for providing direct assistance to all DOD agencies requiring support with respect to food safety and food defense.

Although there are multiple layers of health protection already in place for U.S. personnel purchasing food items at the Commissary, the presumed higher potential for environmental contaminants to be present in the Campania region led the Naples Public Health Evaluation team to conduct a food study. The study went beyond routine inspections of food products by performing various laboratory analyses, which are normally not mandated by VETCOM. Foods grown locally, particularly fresh fruits and vegetables, received a closer look.

Using the above criteria, an assessment of the Commissary was conducted. Products that met the food study criteria and were thus evaluated in the study included:

- · Artichokes · Celery · Spinach
- · Cabbage · Carrots
- · Chicken
- · Mushrooms

# Naples Area Security Working Group Convenes to Foster Local Law Enforcement Collaboration

The Naples Area Security Working Group (NASWG) recently gathered onboard U.S. Naval Support Activity (NSA) Naples to explore opportunities for strengthening partnerships with local law enforcement agencies and other security entities in the Naples area.

This quarterly meeting brought together a diverse group of security experts, including representatives from Navy Region Europe, Africa, Central (EURAFCENT), NSA Naples, the U.S. Consulate Naples, NCIS, and several Italian law enforcement agencies including the Carabinieri.

"NASWG is an enduring collaborative approach to reduce property crimes of opportunity for Naval Support Activity and supported commands, Joint Forces Command Naples, and U.S. Consulate community members," said Lt. Cmdr. Dary Sampy, NASWG chair and NSA Naples security officer.

"The working group collects reported crime data and perform trend analysis to create products which will educate and inform the community on crime statistics and prevention techniques." The NASWG is a key component of the Naples Area Security Committee (NASC). The NASC plays a vital role in promoting a safer community through education, awareness, information sharing, and policy development. The NASC is comprised of two main bodies: the Naples Area Executive Steering Council (ESC) and the NASWG. The ESC, which includes senior leaders from the U.S. Consulate in Naples, NAVEURAF, Allied Joint Force Command, and NSA Naples, provides strategic guidance on policy development.

One of the NASWG's flagship initiatives is the quarterly Naples Area Crime Trend Report. This report provides valuable insights into crime trends and patterns in the Naples area, enabling community members to stay informed and aware of their surroundings. By regularly monitoring and analyzing crime data, the NASWG helps to ensure that community members, prospective personnel and families can make informed decisions about their safety and security.

The group encourages community members to never leave valuables unattended and in plain view inside homes/vehicles and to Lock windows and doors especially at night and when not in the house.

## Bulk Trash Pick-Up on Support Site

Support Site residents have the convenience of scheduling bulk trash pick-ups to remove larger items, such as discarded holiday decorations, worn-out furniture, and other bulky materials that have accumulated during the festive season. This service aims to simplify the process of waste disposal and contribute to a cleaner, more organized neighborhood.

To take advantage of this service, follow these steps:

- 1. Schedule Your Pick-Up: Please contact the trouble desk at +39-081-811-4285/4286 DSN: 629-4285/4286 or submit a request on our community website here: Family Housing Service Request to schedule a bulk trash pick-up, which are usually conducted on Mondays and Fridays. This ensures that our waste management team can plan routes efficiently. If you have any special instructions for the pick-up team, such as the need for extra assistance or the presence of hazardous materials, please communicate this during the scheduling process.
- 2. Prepare Your Items: Place your bulk trash items at the designated pick-up location on the scheduled day. Make sure items are easily accessible and do not obstruct sidewalks or roadways.
- 3. Separate Recyclables: Take a moment to separate recyclable materials from non-recyclables. This helps in our commitment to sustainability and environmentally friendly waste disposal practices.

# Moving To The Economy After A Year Living On-Base

#### **How to Terminate Your Stay in Government Quarters**

If you plan to leave base housing for any reason, including a Permanent Change of Station (PCS), it is required to provide a 30-day notice. For those interested in moving to the economy, please be aware that you must complete 12 full months in your assigned government quarters before moving off of Support Site. You can make the request 60 days prior to your 1 year mark. Once eligible, your first step is to email <a href="mailto:naples\_housing@us.navy.mil">naples\_housing@us.navy.mil</a> to request approval. After placing a house on permanent hold, you will need to contact Family Hosing to schedule an intent to vacate appointment. If you do not schedule this appointment it may delay you moving out of government quarters.

1<sup>st</sup> Appointment at Housing Service center The Assignment office is located at the Support Site Family Housing Building 2072 and is open Monday through Friday, from 7:45 a.m. Until 3:45 p.m. Contact the office at DSN 629-4930 to schedule your first appointment.

Bring a copy of your PCS orders to this first appointment. You will complete an "Intent to Vacate" notice and schedule your preliminary and final inspections. The Assignment Counselor will arrange for loaner furniture to be delivered and picked up.

2nd Appointment at your Apartment During the pre-inspection of your home, the Housing representative will inform you of what will be expected at the final checkout, as well as take notes of needed repairs. During the preinspection, be sure to ask any questions you may have concerning items that have been lost or

This inspection will take approximately 60 minutes. Please make arrangements to keep this pre-inspection appointment. Missing the appointment

will slow up the vacating process.

#### 3rd Appointment at your Apartment

You must have a final inspection of your home in order to complete your requirements for vacating government quarters before PCSing. To complete the final inspection it is important to have all personal property removed prior to your scheduled appointment.

At the final inspection, a Housing representative will examine the residence in the following areas: condition and cleanliness of quarters; and inventory, condition and cleanliness of government equipment, appliances and loaner furniture. During the final inspection, you will sign a memorandum indicating the date that you passed your final inspection and vacated quarters.

Following your final inspection you will need to report to the Assignment Office for your final BAH and signature of the check-out sheet.

### How Sponsors Can Assist Prospective Gains with Housing Needs

As a sponsor, it's essential to assist your incoming personnel by ensuring they complete the Housing Early Assistance Tool (HEAT) application. This proactive step allows them to select their base housing prior to their arrival with your help. To facilitate a smooth transition, please contact us two weeks prior to their arrival date to schedule an appointment with Family Housing for showings of available apartments. During this appointment, you can pick up the keys and view the apartments. Additionally, you have the option to video call the incoming service member to assist in their selection. Once an apartment is selected, we will schedule loaner furniture to be delivered, enabling them to completely bypass Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA). This streamlined process ensures a seamless move-in experience for your incoming personnel.

### Housing In-Brief

While area orientation is held at the Support Site Theater every other week, please note that housing offers its own brief during the alternate weeks at our Family Housing Office. Don't wait to check-in with housing. You are required to check-in within 3 days of arrival. We are here to support you! Be sure to also take advantage of our HEAT application for a smoother process.

## **Housing Early Assistance Tool**

The Housing Early Assistance Tool (HEAT) assists Service Members (SM) and their families in applying for housing Navy wide. HEAT allows SM and their families to get the housing application process started at one or more Navy installations online before or after they receive their permanent change of station orders. HEAT is available to any SM at all Navy installations. HEAT creates an easy user experience to connect with your destination. 

# Smoking in Government Quarters

Smoking is strictly prohibited inside all government buildings, including Unaccompanied Housing (UH) facilities. This ban extends to balconies as well. Additionally, the use of hookahs, e-cigarettes, and vapes is also prohibited. If you are caught violating these rules, you may face disciplinary action.

Smoking not only poses serious health risks but also creates fire hazards and affects air quality for others. According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, smoking remains the leading cause of preventable disease and death, responsible for over 480,000 deaths each year in the U.S. alone. Secondhand smoke exposure can cause heart disease, lung cancer, and respiratory issues in non-smokers.

Please respect these regulations to ensure a safe and healthy environment for everyone.

The Interactive Customer Evaluation (ICE) system is a web-based tool that collects feedback on services provided by various organizations throughout the Department of Defense (DoD) including here at NSA Naples. # Do I get a response after submission?

Generally, if you provided contact information at the time of submitting an ICE Comment, it will be responded to within two weeks.

#### **Response to your ICE Comment**

COMMENT: I called the emergency housing number on 12/26 around 6:40 pm for a gas issue with our stove. I was told that since it was an Italian holiday that there was nobody working and I would have to call back in the morning. Please advise what or who should we call for emergency housing issues if it happens to fall on an Italian holiday.

RESPONSE: ON-BASE HOUSING: In the event of an emergency such as fire or gas leak, the Housing Office advises on-base residents to call NSA Naples emergency dispatch at (+39) 081-568-4911 from a cell phone or 911 from a DSN phone. DO NOT call 911 from a cell phone. The Fire Department will respond and address the issue. If the Fire Department confirms there is a gas leak, then they will close the gas valve and the housing contractor will address the issue on the next workday. For on-base housing non-life threatening emergencies, call (+39) 338-946-2227.

OFF-BASE HOUSING: In the event of an emergency such as a fire or gas leak, the Housing Office advises off-base residents to call NSA Naples Emergency Dispatch at (+39) 081-568-4911 from a cell or commercial phone. For non-life threatening home emergencies for off-base residents, call (+39) 081-568-5638/5639. In turn, Emergency Dispatch will call the on-call an economy housing representative who will immediately address the issue.

#### All Respiratory Illnesses

#### To Return to Work, you must be:

- 1. Fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medications with symptoms improving
- Wear a well-fitting mask for 5 days after symptoms started while indoors, keep a distance from others, and enhance hygiene practices

NEGATIVE TESTS ARE NOT REQUIRED TO RETURN TO WORK ROM IS NO LONGER REQUIRED FOR COVID-19 IF YOU ARE SICK, STAY HOME!

#### Definitions and Recommendations

If exhibiting symptoms of an infectious respiratory disease, including colds, influenza, and COVID-19, should not come to the workplace or conduct official travel until symptoms have begun to resolve. Symptoms of an infectious respiratory disease may include fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, or diarrhea.

Commanders and supervisors should permit symptomatic individuals to utilize situational telework when possible.

It is highly recommended to remain up-to-date with all vaccines as they become available.


