CPT Hiram Gascot III comes from Fayetteville, North Carolina. He graduated A&T State University in 2018. After earning his commission through ROTC, he completed the Field Artillery Basic Officer Leaders Course and was subsequently assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 8th Cavalry Regiment (2-8 CAV), 1st Armored Brigade Combat Team, at Fort Hood, now known as Fort Cavazos, Texas. During his time with 2-8 CAV, he served as both an Assistant Battalion Fire Support Officer (FSO) and a Company Fire Support Officer.

In 2020, CPT Gascot deployed to the Baltic States as part of the European Determence Initiative, where his unit was primarily tasked with deterring Russian aggression against NATO Allies along the borders of Russia and Belarus. Following this deployment, he was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 82nd Field Artillery Regiment (1-82 FA), where he served as a Target Acquisition Platoon Leader and later became the Assistant Operations Officer (AS3) for his battalion. In 2024, Captain Hiram Gascot transitioned to the Military Intelligence Branch.

CPT Gascot's military education includes graduating from the Field Artillery Basic Officer Leaders Course, the Joint Fires Observer Course, Target Mensuration, the Military Intelligence Officer Transition Course, and the Military Intelligence Captains Career Course. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Applied Mathematics and is currently studying online at the Wildwood Center of Health Evangelism to become a Lifestyle Coach. He is married to Mrs. Dayana Gascot and is the father of two children. The family also has a dog.
