-- FLOATING FORTRESSES OF HEALTH--HOSPITAL SHIPS AT WAR, 1941-1975



- Navy hospital ships have long served as important mobile medical facilities
 that could be positioned near combat zones to provide care to wounded
 personnel.
- In World War II, the Navy had 15 active hospital ships in operation.
- During the Korean War and Vietnam War, helicopters played a significant role in casualty evacuation. The hospital ships Consolation, Repose and Haven were the first ships to be equipped with helo-decks.
- Collectively, Navy hospital ships have earned a total 80 battle stars for their service in World War II, Korea and Vietnam.



Active: 1920-1946

Honors and Awards: 5 battle stars

Notes: Served as a base hospital in the Atlantic Theater before service in the Pacific

Honors and Awards: Navy Unit Commendation (NUC) and 7 battle stars

Notes: First responder at the attack on Pearl Harbor, Dec. 7, 1941



Active: 1943-1946

Conflict: World War II (Leyte Gulf and Okinawa)

Honors and Awards: 2 battle stars

Notes: Received a direct hit from a Kamikaze plane at Okinawa (April 1945)



Active: 1944-1946

Conflict: World War II (Leyte Gulf and Okinawa)

Honors and Awards: 2 battle stars

• Notes: Between 1944 and 1945, Hope sailed 51,000+ miles and treated 8,400+ patients

Conflict: World War II (Leyte Gulf and Okinawa)

• Honors and Awards: 2 battle stars

Notes: Served as a station hospital in Jinsen, Korea after the war

- Honors and Awards: NUC and 4 battle stars
- Notes: Prior to conversion into hospital ship was the troop transport USS Henderson

- Honors and Awards: NUC and 4 battle stars
- Notes: Prior to conversion into hospital ship was the troop transport USS Chaumont

Active: 1944-1946

Conflict: World War II (Invasion of Southern France)

Honors and Awards: 1 battle star

Notes: Served in both Atlantic and Pacific theaters of war during World War II



Active: 1945-1947; 1950-1957

Conflicts: World War II / Korean War

Honors and Awards: 9 battle stars (Korean War) and Korean Presidential Unit Citation

• Notes: Served as Joint Task Force One hospital ship for Operation Crossroads



Active: 1945-1947; 1950

• Conflict: World War II

Honors and Awards: 1 battle star

Notes: Sank in San Francisco Bay on Aug. 25, 1950 after collision with freighter



Active: 1945-1946

Conflict: World War II (Third Fleet operations against Japan)

Honors and Awards: 1 battle star

• Notes: Ordered to the Palau Islands in August 1945 to receive survivors of USS Indianapolis



Active: 1945-1955

Conflict: World War II / Korean War

Honors and Awards: NUC and 10 battle stars (Korean War)

Notes: First Navy hospital ship fitted with a helo-deck (1950)



Active: 1945-1950; 1950-1954; 1965-1970

Conflict: World War II / Korean War / Vietnam War

Honors and Awards: 2 NUCs and 18 battle stars (9 Korean War / 9 Vietnam War)

• Notes: During the Vietnam War, she treated 9,000+ battle casualties and 24,000+ inpatients



Active: 1945-1946; 1966-1971; 1972-1975

Conflict: World War II / Vietnam War

Honors and Awards: 12 battle stars (Vietnam War)

Notes: Served as a base hospital in the Atlantic Theater before service in the Pacific



Active: 1945-1946

Conflict: World War II (Okinawa and Third Fleet operations against Japan)

Honors and Awards: 2 battle stars

Notes: Used in the care and medical screening of repatriated POWs after the war

Did you know?

Battle stars were awarded to Navy ships for meritorious participation in battles or for sustaining damage during combat conditions. The Consolation, Haven, Repose, Sanctuary, and Solace are the most decorated hospital ships in history having collectively earned 56 battle stars or 70 percent of all battle stars awarded to Navy hospital ships.



USS Solace was awarded the Navy Unit Commendation (NUC) in 1945 for efforts as a first responder at Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941. Solace is one of three Navy hospitals ships awarded the NUC for services in World War II.
