Please refer to the CRBA, first-time tourist passport, minor tourist passport renewal, and I-130 checklists using the QR codes below to ensure you meet the requirements and are able to submit complete applications for CRBAs, passports, and/or I-130s.

Note: At this time, the U.S. Embassy is not accepting adult passport renewals during this event. You are encouraged to renew by mail with an online payment if you meet all criteria to renew by mail. For more details please scan the QR code below.

- For I-130 Petitions, eligible petitioners are U.S. citizen, Active Duty Service Members assigned to a unit in Japan. Petitions must be for a spouse, child(ren), or parent(s) who is currently in Japan and able to remain in country for the time it normally takes to process the visa.
- For I-130 Petition screening, you must first attend the virtual I-130 info seminar. Email yokosukalegalassistance@us.navy.mil to sign up for the seminar link.

Individuals must have their applications screened by the RLSO WESTPAC Yokosuka Legal Assistance by Thursday, May 15 to obtain an appointment.

After your application is screened, the Legal Assistance team will schedule you for a time slot for the U.S. Embassy Outreach.

Starting Tuesday, April 1, walk-in hours to screen CRBA and Passport applications are Monday - Thursday, 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. at the Yokosuka Legal Assistance office located on the 2nd deck of building 1555.

Dosun Festival May 18 (Sunday)

From 11 a.m. | Araihama Beach (5-minute walk from Aburatsubo Onsen. Take the Keikyu bus bound for Aburatsubo Onsen at Keikyu Misakiguchi Statioon, KK-72) Dosun Festival is a ceremony for the repose of the fallen Miura Clan's souls. The clan flourished in the Miura Peninsula from the Kamakura to Muromachi periods. Kasagake is one of Japan's ancient archery and horsemanship skills, along with yabusame and inuoimono, in which archers, as a team with their horse, will shoot arrows while mounted and galloping.

Kanda Matsuri May 10 (Saturday) - 11 (Sunday)

Kanda Myoujin (5-minute walk from Hijiribashi Gate of JR Ochanomizu Station, JC-03/7-minute walk from Electric Town Gate of JR Akihabara Station, JY-03) Kanda Matsuri, one of the three biggest Japanese Festivals, is held on odd numbered years. The festival is held over a 6-day period, but the main event takes place on Saturday, May 10 and Sunday, May 11: A parade through the surrounding districts of Kanda, Nihombashi, Otemachi, and Marunouchi. Saturday - the first day of the two main days of the festival. Shinkosai sees the three portable shrines carried out of the shrine and around the surrounding area. The Uke Matsuri at 3 p.m. is the most popular event – all manner of floats depart from different places around the area and arrive at Kanda Myojin Shrine around 6 p.m. Sunday – More than 200 portable shrines travel around the area from dawn to dusk.

CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: Carney Gate – Inbound Lane closure from May 7 to 27. Due to construction, inbound vehicular traffic at Carney Gate will be secured from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., with the exception of Sundays. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Gate open for daily operations from 5 a.m. to 8 p.m. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Please utilize Womble Gate for vehicular traffic from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.

• Carney Gate water line replacement.
Construction period March 24 to Nov.
26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction.
Two-way trafficto be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.

- Road closure behind Sanban Tower to facilitate work at Kinnick High School for four hours from May 5 to 23.
- Howard Street partial closure from April 28 to Aug. 6. Five parking spots will be taken for the work. Pedestrian walkway will be set up around work area. Only one lane southbound will be affected, turning into a small merge. Exiting parking area onto Howard from Fleet Rec will not be affected.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October 2025.
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed infront of Club Takemiya for underground electrical work from June 11 to Aug. 5. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.

- Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
- A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as one-way alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.
