CFAY Plans 4th of July Celebration with Color Run, Live Music, 2,000 Fireworks

full day of red, white, and boom is scheduled across the installation as Commander, Fleet Activities Yokosuka Morale, Welfare and Recreation (CFAY MWR) prepares to host its annual 4th of July Celebration, Friday, July 4.

Headlining the holiday is the 20-minute fireworks spectacular, featuring more than 2,000 fireworks are set to launch over Berkey Field in the event's finale.

But the festivities starts long before the first firework cracks the sky.

The day begins at 8 a.m. with a 5K Color Run through the base.

Participants can still register through July 3 at navymwryokosuka.com, with the run promising a vibrant kickoff to the festivities.

The main celebration begins at 3 p.m. at Berkey Field, where attendees will find food trucks, carnival games, face painting, and a Home-Based Business Vendors Market supporting local entrepreneurs. Performers and photo

ops add to the festival, setting the stage for a pair of highenergy musical acts: a tribute to AC/DC and a live concert by the U.S. 7th Fleet Band.

"We have something for everyone, from the morning run to live music, games and great food in the afternoon," said Joanna Klepacka, CFAY MWR community recreation director, who helped organize the event. "We're especially excited about the fireworks finale."

While the celebration is open to all SOFA-sponsored personnel and their guests, many families may choose to celebrate from home with backyard barbecues. For them, Commander, Navy Region Japan Fire & Emergency Services in Yokosuka is reminding residents to stay fireaware and follow base housing policies.

CFAY's Navy Housing tenants are reminded that charcoal grills, smokers, and deep fryers are prohibited on balconies. Propane grills are permitted, but their use is discouraged, and spare propane cylinders must be stored in an approved flammable storage locker.

"Keep the fun in your Fourth of July BBQ, but remember, safety first," said Robert Wimes, the installation's Fire Chief.

Fire officials also stress the importance of grilling away from buildings. Stay at least 15 feet from any canopy or overhang and keep propane tanks upright with hoses free of cracks or leaks.

According to CFAY's Fire Prevention Office, grill fires spike in June and July, with about one-third of those fires starting on porches or balconies. Even a small lapse in caution can have outsized consequences, especially in tower residences.

"Grill responsibly, keep a fire extinguisher nearby, and never leave your grill unattended. Let's celebrate safely," Wimes said.

Shonan Hiratsuka Tanabata Festival

July 4 (Friday) - 6 (Sunday)

10 a.m. to 8 p.m. (Until 7 p.m. on July 7) | Around JR Hiratsuka Station (2-minute walk from JR Hiratsuka Station, JT-11)

The Shonan Hiratsuka Tanabata Festival is held for three days from Friday to Sunday in early July of every year. It is said to be one of the biggest tanabata festivals in Japan, and its big, gorgeous bamboo decorations are famous as the best in Japan. The festival is also famous for its vast amount of food stalls which allow you to enjoy a wide variety of gourmet during the celebrations.

Camp Zama Independence Day Celebration

- Residence card (must show nationality) or a permanent address record card showing nationality along with a picture ID National Public Service identification (Kokka Komuinsho) My Number Card/Juki Card (must have a current photograph, Juminhyo with Honsekichi or Koseki Tohon issued within one year)
- Non-Japanese citizens must bring a passport with a valid visa or a permanent residence card (Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian who is in possession of one of the above valid forms of ID.)

CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: Howard Street and Nimitz Boulevard partial closure from July 4 to Sept. 28. Closures will only be on the weekends. Two way traffic will be maintained. Flagmen will be posted around work areas.

Vacant Lot full closure until Dec. 30. The vacant lot between the Post Office and NMCRS Thrift Shop will be used as a laydown area for contractors doing various work around base. This will not affect the parking lot at the NMCRS Thrift Shop.

- Carney Gate inbound lane closure until June 30. Night time inbound traffic closure from 8 p.m. to 4:30 a.m. Outbound traffic access, pedestrian traffic will not be affected. Gate open for all traffic from 5 a.m.
- Nimitz Boulevard partial cosure until July 31. Single lane alternating traffic. Flagmen will be posted. Will restore and release the site on daily basis by 4 p.m. for full 2-way traffic.
- C Street full closure until Sept. 25. The Yokopon bus will be re-routed down Leahy street, stops will remain the same. Pedestrian routes will be open on either side of the project.
- Gridley Tunnel full road closure. Closure period: Until July 31, Aug. 1 to July 31,

2028. First closure is for temporary high voltage power bypass. Second closure is for permanent high voltage power repairs. The second closure is only for vehicular traffic. Tunnel will be open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

- Full road closure next to building J-10 until June 30. Sinkhole appeared in the middle of the road due to Damaged Sewer Pipe. No impact to Water Systems.
- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period until Nov. 26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Two-way traffic to be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.
- Howard Street partial closure until Aug. 6. Five parking spots will be taken for the work. Pedestrian walkway will be set up around work area. Only one lane southbound will be affected, turning into a small merge. Exiting parking area onto Howard from Fleet Rec will not be affected.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., until Dec. 25. Installation of communication and electrical lines. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.

- Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
- A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as one-way alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.
