Oakland, Calif. – Security was a major concern for members of the Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command's 834th Transportation Battalion as tanks and armored vehicles painted in Australian camouflage moved through East Bay streets down to the Port of Oakland last week. The equipment, part of a foreign military sales mission, would be uploaded for transport to Australia.

MEDLOG enables readiness during rapid deployment exercise

FORT DETRICK, Md. – When the order comes, U.S. Army units have to be ready to go. Army Medical Logistics Command did its part to answer the call during a recent emergency deployment readiness exercise, or EDRE, conducted by U.S. Army Central Command. An EDRE is a no-notice, rapid deployment exercise to assess a unit's ability to quickly mobilize personnel and equipment for potential real-world contingencies.

Fort Leavenworth's Grant Park officially opens with ceremony

FORT LEAVENWORTH, Kan. – Grant Park was officially deemed open June 25 for resident and family enjoyment following a ribbon-cutting ceremony. Improvement projects to the park include pickleball courts and seating areas. The construction for this first phase of the Grant Park renovation project cost more than \$2 million. Construction began in September 2024, but plans began much earlier.
