AMLC integrates MEDLOG into DEFENDER 25 exercise

FORT DETRICK, Md. – Soldiers and civilians assigned to U.S. Army Medical Logistics Command provided logistics assistance, maintenance support and training at DEFENDER 25. DEFENDER is the Army’s largest annual training exercise, involving about 12,000 U.S. service members and 13,000 troops from 29 allied and partner nations. Led by U.S. Army Europe and Africa, the exercise focuses on the strategic deployment of U.S.-based forces, the use of Army Prepositioned Stocks and follow-on exercises.
