CFAY Hosts Navy Awesome Café to Foster U.S.-Japan Friendship

he Japanese Media Relations division of Public Affairs at Commander, Fleet Activities Yokosuka (CFAY) hosted Navy Awesome Café June 24, 2025. The event brought 21 participants together for a morning of games, conversation and cultural exchange.

The group was comprised 11 U.S. Sailors, six Japanese civilians and four members of the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF). Participants engaged in icebreaker games, shared stories and learned about each other's customs and traditions.

Navy Awesome Café was introduced in 2016 as a way for U.S. Navy personnel and Japanese locals to connect. Nine years later, the program remains popular and continues to grow.

Kyoko Sugita, CFAY community relations specialist, kicked off the event by leading a round of charades. The group quickly erupted in laughter as volunteers acted out prompts like "a rush hour train car causes you to miss your stop" and "an American at an onsen (hot spring) for the first time."

"The first game is tough for Japanese people," said one Japanese participant who asked to remain anonymous. "We talked about how hard it is for us to step forward or stand out. Maybe it's just a cultural thing – but it was funny to notice that!"

Participants later broke into small groups to discuss a range of topics. U.S. Sailors asked about Japanese customs and daily life, while Japanese attendees were curious about how the Americans were adjusting to life in Japan.

Some participants relied on event organizers to assist with translation.

"We encourage all interested Japanese persons to attend Navy Awesome Café, even those who don't speak English," Sugita said. "Many of them believe they will never have the chance to communicate with American service members, but we are here to support and facilitate those conversations."

Every 15 minutes, participants rotated tables and changed conversation partners.

"Each group had a totally different vibe – some super energetic and others more relaxed," said the anonymous Japanese

participant.

As attendees grew more comfortable, discussions became livelier. People shared photos of their pets and talked about favorite sports teams as new friendships began to form as the event progressed.

As the event wrapped up, participants took selfies and exchanged contact information.

"The feedback from both Japanese and U.S. service members is always excellent," said Kazuyuki Takagi, CFAY information and editorial specialist. "By the end, people are less shy and excited to talk, learn more about each other and establish friendships."

This session was especially notable due to the participation of members of the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF). It provided a valuable opportunity for JMSDF and U.S. Navy personnel to connect on a personal level. Events like this play a vital role in strengthening the U.S.-Japan alliance.

Navy Awesome Café, the most popular exchange event, is part of CFAY's ongoing community engagement efforts to deepen the mutual understanding and strengthen relationships between U.S. Navy Sailors and the local Japanese community.



CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: Decatur Avenue full road closure from Aug. 4 to 9 for SRF-JRMC Command event "Bon-Odori 2025"

- Howard Street and Nimitz Boulevard partial closure from until Sept. 28. Closures will only be on the weekends. Two way traffic will be maintained. Flagmen will be posted around work areas.
- Vacant Lot full closure until Dec. 30. The vacant lot between the Post Office and NMCRS Thrift Shop will be used as a laydown area for contractors doing various work around base. This will not affect the parking lot at the NMCRS Thrift Shop.
- Nimitz Boulevard partial cosure until July 31. Single lane alternating traffic. Flagmen will be posted. Will restore and release the site on daily basis by 4 p.m. for full 2-way traffic.
- C Street full closure until Sept. 25. The Yokopon bus will be re-routed down Leahy street, stops will remain the same. Pedestrian routes will be open on either side of the project.

- Gridley Tunnel full road closure. Closure period: Until July 31, Aug. 1 to July 31, 2028. First closure is for temporary high voltage power bypass. Second closure is for permanent high voltage power repairs. The second closure is only for vehicular traffic. Tunnel will be open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic.
- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period until Nov. 26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Two-way traffic to be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.
- Howard Street partial closure until Aug. 6. Five parking spots will be taken for the work. Pedestrian walkway will be set up around work area. Only one lane southbound will be affected, turning into a small merge. Exiting parking area onto Howard from Fleet Rec will not be affected.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October.
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until Dec. 25. Installation of communication and electrical lines. Connect water main to new Child and Youth programs building. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.

- Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
- A Government of Japan Contractor will perform excavation work on Shisagi Street until Aug. 31, 2025. Working hours will be between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Excavation site will be controlled as one-way alternating traffic control road during the daytime work. After daily working hours, road should be re-opened.
