Army retires legacy equipment in new push for accountability

WASHINGTON – In a sweeping modernization effort, the Army issued new guidance on the removal and disposal of legacy Organizational Clothing and Individual Equipment, or OCIE items deemed to have no economic value, as outlined in previous guidance. Soldiers across all components will see legacy OCIE automatically cleared from their records and given clear procedures for responsibility disposing of outdated gear.

USAG Rheinland-Pfalz tests UAS response readiness

MIESAU, Germany – U.S. Army Garrison Rheinland-Pfalz teamed up with the U.S. Air Force and German Polizei July 16 to test its counter-unmanned aircraft systems capabilities and interagency communication networks in a realistic drone threat training exercise. During the exercise, operators from the U.S. Air Forces in Europe and Africa's Combat Training School flew a DJI Phantom 4 drone, testing the operational capabilities of systems currently in place.
