The U.S. Army Space and Missile Defense Command and the U.S. Department of the Navy (Navy) have prepared a Draft Document of Environmental Protection (DEP) to provide a description of proposed missile flight test activities at Kwajalein Atoll, the associated potential environmental effects, and procedures for monitoring, notification, and reporting. Testing would involve flight tests from sea-based launch locations, vehicle flight over the ocean, splashdown of boosters in the open ocean, and payload impact either in broad ocean areas or at U.S. Army test sites at Kwajalein Atoll in the Republic of the Marshall Islands. Within the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the activity would be located at the Ronald Reagan Ballistic Missile Defense Test Site (RTS) within the United States Army Kwajalein Atoll (USAKA). Flight test payloads would impact at target sites within the deep-water Kwajalein Missile Impact Scoring System (KMISS) range and on land at Illeginni Islet. Flight test support activities such as vessel traffic and human activity would occur at RTS as well as within travel routes between test sites and Kwajalein Harbor at Kwajalein Islet.






Kwajalein Reclaimed Water Standard Violation

The US Army Kwajalein Atoll (USAKA) Environmental Standards (UES) requires public notification when the Kwajalein and Roi-Namur Water Treatment Plants (WTPs) turbidity monitoring and testing procedures are not met. Turbidity from each filtration unit at the WTPs are monitored by inline continuous monitoring equipment capable of recording data at least every 15 minutes. The Kwajalein and Roi-Namur inline continuous monitoring systems have been inoperative for several months. Water operators are collecting manual grab samples for turbidity analysis every 4 hours. Repair or replacement projects for the continuous monitors are being evaluated. Turbidity is the cloudiness or haziness of a liquid caused by particles that are generally invisible to the naked eye and by itself does not cause microbiological contamination. Drinking water from several distribution sites are analyzed weekly by the Kwajalein Hospital Laboratory for microbiological contaminants. There is no threat to public health or the environment resulting from the inoperative inline monitoring equipment. No health-based restrictions are necessary for the normal use of drinking water. 





25TH ANNUAL SPRING BREAK MUSIC FEST

Despite the rain, nothing could keep the crowds away from the 25th Annual Spring Break Music Fest (SBMF) at the Kwajalein Yacht Club (KYC). The event certainly lived up to expectations. With sixteen incredible performances, the festival showcased a wide range of performing arts from dance to lively musical talents.

The SBFM began in 2001. Jim Stepchew recalls that a new band called The Zooks had just formed. One of the

band members reached out to Stepchew, asking if there was still a homebrew group that brewed beer, and indeed there was. The band member suggested they spend the day playing music and drinking beer at Coral Sands Beach—and that's how it all began. As word spread, other bands got involved and proposed a "battle of the bands." The KYC traditionally hosts a chili cook-off, which was held alongside SBFM. Word spread quickly, and soon grillers planned a BBQ cook-off, the Swim Team offered shave ice, vendors set up booths, food services provided meals, and a cash bar

was available.

Ultimately, after a lot of planning and coordination with Community Activities, the event was approved to be held at Emon Beach. Since private events require sponsorship according to regulations, the KYC stepped in to become the official sponsor of the SBFM.

As the years passed, the event grew into an all-day affair at Emon Beach, featuring helicopter and fire truck displays and plenty of activities for children, including a dunk tank, sunfish rides,

tricycle races, and water balloon fights. Eventually, as the population and number of bands declined, the event was relocated to Camp Hamilton. This move was made to simplify setup and operations for the event planners, making it easier to manage.

Although, SBFM has evolved several times since 2001, it is still a fun-filled event for the entire family. ▾

1. Attend Col. Morgan's TEAM KWAJ brief (either Teammate or Community version), read and adhere to the TEAM KWAJ Teammate Pact, presented at initial town halls, and periodically thereafter.
2. Attend the Island Newcomer's Briefing.
3. Attend at least one group greeting at air terminal for personnel arriving on island. Make them feel welcome and show them we are happy they are on Kwaj with us.
4. Attend at least two garrison after-hours team-building or social events (TEAM KWAJ Happy Hour, Commander's Call, Hail/Farewell).
5. Attend at least two TEAM KWAJ PT/Wellness sessions. Become a regular attender!
6. Visit Marshallese Cultural Center in last 3 months prior to tab award.
7. Visit Ebeye, Third island or Majuro in last 3 months prior to tab, use a Marshallese phrase or two and visit a store/restaurant.
8. Tell three co-workers how to earn the TEAM KWAJ tab.

9. Swim, snorkel, boat or paddle on the lagoon at least once with a teammate.

10. Complete the TEAM KWAJ Circle-island 6-mile ruck march/walk/bike and read all historic battlefield markers. This is an organized USAG-KA hosted event several times per year.

11. Mission Partner wild card event—discuss with your supervisor any additional organizational requirement. Could be knowledge-based, achievement-based, or physical challenge.

12. Final event, "Board of Review" -- meet with Col. Morgan face-to-face individually or in a small group with all requirements fulfilled. Schedule with garrison front office. Discussion items may include but are not limited to; TEAM KWAJ pact - "Healthy Community of Excellence," Kwaj history, Marshallese culture, military/strategic missions and their significance, and future operational potential.

Before I introduce myself, I would like to pause, recognize God, and thank him, knowing that he is everything.

My name is Sammy Juda, I'm a Private first class (pfc). I am from Majuro, Wotho, Namdik, and Mejit. I was born and raised on Majuro and moved to Ebeye in 2010. Since then, I have considered myself an Ebeye resident. I'm stationed in Fort Carson on Colorado, spring.

I maintain and drive a tank.

I'm also man of family, and I have three kids: two boys

and a girl. I just want to share my experience of returning home to Ebeye, Marshall Islands. I thank God that lifestyles here are still the same. We get together to play sports such as baseball. Shapewe enjoy playing baseball, able to see our families, and carrying bucket of water. I can be able to join my friends who were my friend before I left. My experiences in the military are different from those I have had in the civilian job sphere. I have spent 13 years living on Ebeye and working on Kwajalein.

I'm going to make a com-

parison between the two different jobs.

In the military, there are things that I've learned, which are how to be patient and to collaborate with others. The other things that I've had experienced which really pushed me forward.

Because sometimes in life, there are difficult things that we don't need to panic about. I was surrounded by a lot of people who always talked about the military, but I'm mentioning two people whom I know they push me on how to speak and action.

The first one is Manini Kabua, and the second one is the former Kwajalein Command Sergeant Major Kenyatta Gaskins. They gave lots of advice, but I'll offer a few that I know.


First, to all Marshallese, for what I know a thing that we are afraid of is 'komman oktak,' or "make a change." I am always conversing with the majorities of the young Marshallese to "do not be afraid to make a change." If you are planning to join military and move from here, that's a change, too. Some people might say "I don't want to be

away from home.” From what I experienced; you can always come home whenever you want. I never forget what I did before I left because this is our home.

And my second advice is don't stop. In case you fail the attempt once or twice, just don't stop. Failure does not mean the end of everything. Fail means “first attempt in learning.” I believe if you push yourself not to stop, you will succeed in making it.

As I conclude, I want to share a Marshallese proverb with you: “Ek mouj jab meloklok kuloñe,” which means, wherever you go, it doesn't matter which place you go, you will still return to our islands. And you will still be the Marshallese people. Lastly, fearing God is the beginning of wisdom.

Thank you and God bless you. ❧







Twice a month, the Kwajalein Atoll community gets to experience a special treat as episodes of the local news show are made available for their viewing pleasure. A product of USAG-KA, the Kwaj Current as it is called, contains in-house produced content including local events, local personalities, and service announcements to keep residents safe and informed. The episodes are made available on the Garrison YouTube channel, and shared throughout the formal social media footprint, and farther with the help of affiliate page managers.

First appearing in 1999 known then as “Window on the Atoll (WOTA),” the pur-

Although a bit larger than the original staff, the new team is game to also find the show’s ultimate voice with fresh new ideas—brain-

Please note that the Kwaj Current staff are also open to story ideas from the community and would love to hear what you would like to see produced by your friendly-neighborhood Audio Visual team who would jump at the chance to bring your concepts to wonderful life.

Thus far, Kwaj Current subject matter topics have included the dangers of unexploded ordnance (UXO), MWR events like the ever-popular shaving cream social, and special features. The latter part of the show has

featured military personnel stories, the ASL word-of-the-episode, school milestone event traditions, and PSA skits with a comedic flare designed to help the viewer retain the message as well as want to see the clip again and again.

WEEKLY TROPICAL WEATHER THREAT OUTLOOK

RTS WEATHER STATION STAFF

Discussion:

Through yesterday, we have received 1.96 inches of precipitation in the month of April, which is 0.10 inches above normal for the month. So far in 2025, we have only received 6.26 inches of precipitation, which is 6.47 inches below normal for the year. The central RMI remains in a moderate drought, although a wetter pattern over the last week or so helped bring some much-needed rainfall. A drier pattern has once again taken hold and looks to remain in place for at least the next week and likely beyond that. However, some shower chances may still be possible, generated by periodic areas of localized trade wind convergence passing through the Atoll. The thunderstorm risk appears low over the next week or so. No thunderstorm days occurred over the past seven days. A thunderstorm day is defined as an "in situ" lightning strike within five miles of the weather station. The Madden/Julian Oscilla-

tion (MJO) has returned to its negative phase for early-mid April, which is responsible for the drier weather conditions. It is expected to remain in its negative phase for at least the next week and possibly beyond that as well, which should maintain a drier pattern. The El Nino Southern Oscillation (ENSO) is still in la Nina conditions with the sea surface temperatures (SST) in the central Pacific between the RMI and the Date Line below normal. Cooler temperatures in the Pacific to the east of the RMI tend to work against increased shower activity, and are one of the main reasons for the moderate drought conditions affecting Kwajalein Atoll and the northern RMI for first part of the year, but there now seems to be changes that are starting to appear in the eastern Pacific, which are acting to erode the la Nina conditions across the whole of the tropical Pacific. ENSO-neutral is favored to develop by the end of April, and persist through the Northern Hemisphere summer.

Tropical Cyclones:

No significant tropical cyclone activity expected to affect anywhere in Micronesia, the Mariana Islands, Wake Island or Hawai'i. We are coming out of climatological winter for the northwest Pacific, still working against tropical cyclone activity along with increased shear and the cooler sea surface temperatures (SST) between the RMI and the Date Line.

Damaging West Winds / Westerly Swell:

None expected. Micronesia is northeast trade wind dominant.

Swell / Tide Inundation for Kwajalein Atoll and Wake Island:

We are moving toward a full-moon on the 13th, and will experience spring tides around that day. Winds look to vary between the low and mid-teens throughout the next week, although they may reach into the upper teens periodically, especially this coming weekend. Winds will be higher on the open

lagoon. Not expecting Small Craft Advisory (SCA) conditions nor High Surf Advisory (HSA) is anticipated for the next seven days. There may be gusty winds from showers into the 20s.

Purpose: This weekly briefing is delivered Thursday mornings to island leadership. The intention of this briefing is to provide situational awareness of weather events that may interrupt operations and transportation around Kwajalein, to/from Hawaii and Guam, and in the Wake vicinity. The main threat assessed in this brief is existing and potential development of tropical cyclone activity. This brief also provides an outlook of abnormal winds, sea state, and precipitation guidance for next 7 days around the Kwajalein Atoll. The distribution list will also receive updates on any developing tropical cyclone activity in the Kwajalein region that occur between the weekly outlook product. ❏

WEATHER DISCUSSION

Generally limited shower activity is expected this weekend, with winds likely to increase by later in the weekend. Subtropical ridging to the north will continue to promote dry, sinking motion throughout the atmospheric column, suppressing shower activity. A couple of weak atmospheric waves will move through which may bring modest increases in shower activity on Saturday and again on Monday, but these showers should generally be on the lighter side. Thunderstorms

appear unlikely due to a lack of instability or areas of stronger low-level convergence needed to generate deep convection. Winds will increase somewhat, going from the low-mid teens on Saturday to the mid to sometimes upper teens on Sunday and Monday.

SATURDAY

Partly sunny with stray to isolated showers. Winds NE-E at 11-16 knots with higher gusts near showers.

SUNDAY

Partly sunny with stray showers. Winds NE-E at 13-18 knots

possibly increasing a knot or two overnight, with higher gusts near showers.

MONDAY

Partly sunny with stray to isolated showers. Winds NE-E at 12-17 knots with gusts in the upper 20s possible near showers.

NEXT WEEK

A dry pattern appears likely to be in place throughout much of next week. The only shower chances will be generated by occasional areas of trade wind convergence. Winds look to decrease somewhat as the week progresses. ⚡
