




PA Counterdrug Assists with ATF Stolen Firearms Recovery

- DB Firearms FFL Burglary: Case involving Philadelphia and Allentown Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives field offices, Montgomery County Detective Bureau, Pennsylvania State Police, Telford Police Department, Bethlehem Police Department, Easton Police Department, Catasauqua Police Department, Homeland Security Investigations, Customs and Border Protection, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), US Postal Inspection Service, and New York Police Department.
- Investigation revealed a pattern of five Federal Firearms License (FFL) store burglaries in southeastern Pennsylvania and one FFL burglary in New Jersey. Stolen firearms recovered in variety of crimes including shootings, drug crimes, armed robberies, in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York (NY), Connecticut, Florida, Puerto Rico, and Dominican Republic.
- NY suspect, involved in firearms trafficking, was arrested after armed robbery of an undercover federal agent during a controlled narcotics purchase.
- Investigation timeframe: August 2023 Present
- Measurement of Performance (MOP): Provided analysis and Spanish to English translations of cellphone extractions, iCloud records, and prison calls to be utilized in arrest and search warrants.
 Provided Spanish to English translation assistance during interviews.
- Measure of Effectiveness (MOE): 2 arrests, 17 stolen firearms recovered, 1 illegal machinegun
