

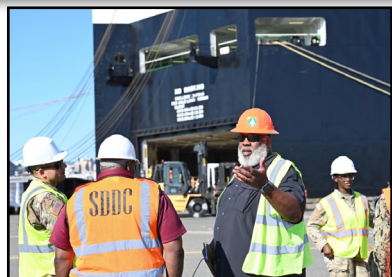

## Summer exercises showcase joint logistics power

TACOMA, Wash. – Over the summer, forces from the Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command participated in two major logistics exercises, Turbo Distribution and Trans Mariner. Leveraging real-world Korean Rotational Force operations as the assessment platform, Turbo Distribution evaluated SDDC's Active-Duty capabilities in rapid port-opening and cargo movement, while Trans Mariner validated its Reserve force readiness in command and control, vessel discharge, documentation and onward movement capabilities.
