

# September is National Preparedness Month (NPM)

September is National Preparedness Month (NPM) at Commander, Fleet Activities Yokosuka (CFAY).

According to Ready.gov, NPM has been observed every September since 2004, when FEMA's Ready Campaign launched the initiative to encourage Americans to prepare for emergencies. This year's theme, "Preparedness Starts at Home," underscores that readiness begins with individual and family action.

The 2025 campaign focuses on getting back to preparedness basics: know your risk, make a plan, build a kit and get involved. "Know your risk" means learning about the types of disasters that could happen in your area and how to respond. CFAY personnel in Japan face seasonal typhoon threats from summer into fall, and the country's frequent earthquakes can strike without warning and sometimes cause severe damage. Make a plan refers to developing a family emergency plan. Planning ahead of time helps reduce stress and can even save time and money in a crisis.

Families are also urged to build an emergency supply kit stocked with essentials to sustain everyone for at least a few days.

Ready Navy's official website (<a href="https://www.ready.navy.mil/">https://www.ready.navy.mil/</a>) provides the basics for any emergency kit.

Some recommendations to start an emergency kit include having at least three days of non-perishable food, a gallon of water per person per day, flashlights, batteries, a radio, cash in a waterproof bag, as well as critical medications and pet supplies.

"In an emergency situation, everything is moving fast and things can get overwhelming quickly," said Stephanie Soliz, the regional program specialist at American Red Cross Yokosuka. "Having a go-bag prepared can really help."

Soliz also encourages Sailors to fill out an American Red Cross Contact Card before deploying in case their families on land need to reach out in an emergency. She recommends Sailors write down their information exactly as the Red Cross will ask for it – with all of the military acronyms and unit identification codes – and take a photo of it to give to their family.

"It's hard to remember all of that information even on normal days when there's no emergency," Soliz said.

Base community members not sure where to start can look to the CFAY Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC). CFAY FFSC offers classes for Emergency Preparedness, budgeting for emergencies, and even how to fill out the United States Forces Japan (USFJ) Emergency Evacuation Program (EEP) packet.

The EEP packet is a requirement for all SOFA-sponsored personnel to have completed, submitted and held on file with each unit's designated Command EEP Warden.

"The EEP also provides peace of mind," said Reggie Toledo, CFAY's Emergency Management Officer. "If the order ever occurs, military families will be safely relocated and their property protected."

The final step is to get involved in community preparedness. Even simple actions, like learning basic first aid or CPR, can make a difference when professional responders are delayed. Yokosuka's branch of the American Red Cross offers classes frequently for a small fee with the next CPR/AED/First Aid Course scheduled Sept. 15



### **CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES**

**Yokosuka:** Carney Gate closure. Due to monthly maintenance, all vehicular traffic at Carney Gate will be secured from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Sept. 6. Pedestrian traffic will not be affected.

• Nimitz Boulevard partial closure until Sept. 7. Closure will only occur from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the weekends only.

- JM22 South Side partial closure from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Sept. 12. Pedestrians and Vehicles to be routed around work area. Posted security personnel and safety observers.
- Howard Street and Nimitz Boulevard partial closure until Sept. 28. Closures will only be on the weekends. Two way traffic will be maintained. Flagmen will be posted around work areas.
- Vacant Lot full closure until Dec. 30. The vacant lot between the Post Office and NMCRS Thrift Shop will be used as a laydown area for contractors doing various work around base.
- C Street full closure until Sept. 25. The Yokopon bus will be re-routed down Leahy street, stops will remain the same. Pedestrian routes will be open on either side of the project.
- Gridley Tunnel closure. First closure (until February 2026) is for temporary high voltage power bypass. Second closure is for permanent high voltage power repairs. The second closure (from Feb.1, 2026 to July 31, 2028) is only for vehicular traffic. Tunnel will be open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic.
- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period until Nov. 26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Two-way traffic to be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October.
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until Dec. 25. Installation of communication and electrical lines. Connect water main to new Child and Youth programs building. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.

• Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
