Operation Patriot Press boosts readiness

REDSTONE ARSENAL, Ala. - Operation Patriot Press 2025, a large-scale logistical training exercise spanning nearly a year, concluded this month, demonstrating a significant win for total Army collaboration and cost-effective training. OPP is an annual, large-scale exercise designed to spotlight and test the total force integration of the Army Reserve, National Guard, and active-duty components in realistic training situations. The exercise is overseen by Army Materiel Command, and this year was led by the Indiana Army National Guard's 38th Division Sustainment Brigade in Kokomo, Indiana.
