CFAY marks 24th 9/11 Anniversary with Remembrance Ceremony

Sailors, Marines, and CFAY community members honored the victims of the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks during a remembrance ceremony on base, marking the observance's 24th consecutive year.

The ceremony started at 7:45 a.m. with formation and morning colors at 8 a.m. Following colors, about 100 service members marched in formation to the Chief Petty Officers Club, home to the installation's 9/11 memorial site, where participants gathered for remarks, a moment of silence, the tolling of bells for each hijacked plane and a wreath-laying.

"It is important on this 24th anniversary of the tragic events of Sept. 11, 2001, that we take a moment to reflect on these events, those who were lost, and what they mean to us and our fellow Sailors," said Chief Master-at-Arms (Select) Yvonne Saintil during remarks at the

memorial. "It's vital that we never forget that day."

"I joined the Navy before 9/11 and was in boot camp when the towers were hit," said Chief Navy Counselor (Select) Chistena Koch, one of the volunteer organizers of the ceremony. "I saw us go from a peacetime Navy to everything being turned on its head. It's important to remember where we've come from and where we're going, so we keep our country and our families safe."

The ceremony offered the CFAY community a solemn opportunity to honor the lives lost, pay tribute to the families and first responders affected, and reaffirm a commitment to the remembrance.

For more than 80 years, CFAY has provided, maintained, and operated base facilities and services in support of the U.S. 7th Fleet's forward-deployed naval forces, tenant commands, and thousands of military and civilian personnel and their families.

CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: Howard Street and Nimitz Boulevard partial closure until Sept. 28. Closures will only be on the weekends. Two way traffic will be maintained. Flagmen will be posted around work areas.

- Vacant Lot full closure until Dec. 30. The vacant lot between the Post Office and NMCRS Thrift Shop will be used as a laydown area for contractors doing various work around base.
- C Street full closure until Sept. 25. The Yokopon bus will be re-routed down Leahy street, stops will remain the same. Pedestrian routes will be open on either side of the project.
- Gridley Tunnel closure. First closure (until February 2026) is for temporary high voltage power bypass. Second closure is for permanent high voltage power repairs. The second closure (from Feb. 1, 2026 to July 31, 2028) is only for vehicular traffic. Tunnel will be open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic.
- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period until Nov. 26. Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Two-way traffic to be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.
- Nimitz Boulevard and Gridley Lane partial road closure. Closure period from Sept. 20 to Nov. 26, 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.
- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October.
- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.
- Ikego:** Yasakayato Street will be partially closed from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until Dec. 25. Installation of communication and electrical lines. Connect water main to new Child and Youth programs building. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.
- Ikego CDC parking lot partial closure until Sept. 30. 14 additional parking spots and Five parallel spots will be closed for the new CDC construction area.
