
A MESSAGE FROM THE COMMANDING OFFICER

Families and Friends of USS AMERICA,

As I write this letter, with much anticipation and emotion, we are now watching Sasebo disappear over the horizon. Over the course of six-years from AMERICA's arrival to her departure, its crew and our families developed strong bonds throughout the ship's 12 patrols and rigorous operational tempo. For a handful of Sailors, Sasebo became a home-away-from-home and we were able to find them a billet on another ship to remain part of the Forward-Deployed Naval Forces (FDNF) in Japan. For the rest of the crew, we're departing with many fond memories of our time in Sasebo and service as a key 7th Fleet asset in the Indo-Pacific region.

As we look ahead, I want to provide insight on how the next phase in the ship's lifecycle will look for the crew. Once we arrive in San Diego, the ship and crew will transition from high-tempo operations to a full-on maintenance cycle. The daily work tasks will shift as AMERICA enters a nearly two-year maintenance and dry-dock period to include a series of upgrades, preservation projects and systems modernization, as part of the ship's regularly scheduled upkeep. Every Sailor on the ship has worked through an incredible number of professional qualifications, with the goal of ensuring we have skilled firefighters, first responders and watch-standers throughout the maintenance cycle and on the backside of the prolonged maintenance period. The crew's focus on maintenance, preservation and training are a critical foundation to keeping AMERICA in the fight and ready for our Nation's Tasking. Even though our setting will bring us home at the end of each day, the workload will bring its own challenges—and just as you have supported us in the past, we will lean on your enduring support to get us through the maintenance phase and back to the operational fleet, as soon as possible.

I can say firsthand from talking to Sailors, that the crew is collectively excited about our new home of San Diego and what being back in the U.S. will offer. Though we have become



Throughout our latest patrol with the 31st MEU, the crew enjoyed many accomplishments. AMERICA continued to celebrate a high promotion rate through standard merit-based advancement, the new advance-to-promote process, and Chief/Officer promotion-board results. We are extremely proud of our Chief Selectees—AMERICA is pushing eight future Chiefs through the coveted "Forged in Steel" initiation process! This Chiefs' season also includes our Master Sergeant Marine which is an amazing display of how strong our blue-green team is on AMERICA.

AMERICA left for Patrol on May 17th and has been running hard every day. We served as the flagship for two large exercises, including Talisman Sabre, which was held off the east coast of Australia, and the 31st MEU's Amphibious Integrated Training and Certification Exercise where the bluegreen teams were put through their paces exercising a full scope of Navy-Marine Corps expeditionary and amphibious capabilities.

While underway, we operated at new highs consisting of 1,085 aircraft launches which involved aircraft from 16 different countries, to include partner nation F-35B Lightning fighter jets which embarked AMERICA for a period. We also were the centerpiece of two large photo evolutions where warships from the world's leading navies come together to display the impressive naval power of the United States and our allies in 7th Fleet. We also exercised our ability to provide fuel at sea to a destroyer as well as receive fuel from a fleet tanker. Among all the operational accomplishments, the crew had the opportunity to experience some much needed liberty in Sydney, Brisbane, Okinawa, Sasebo, and Pearl Harbor. Another area that I like to highlight which is a true testament to the might of our Navy is the ability to be self-sufficient by repairing our own systems at sea. Sailors in the engineering department completed complex repairs across to include work on our big diesel generators, main propulsion gas

The combat systems team did an excellent job of keeping our massive communications suite in peak condition as well as our weapons systems ready for any eventuality. Our Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department (AIMD) team was extremely busy ensuring we maintained the highest aviation readiness I have ever seen, but also in repairing and manufacturing parts for other departments and other ships. All these accomplishments highlight the team-of-teams effort to make the work of the ship happen.

Throughout it all, the crew's dedication, professionalism, and sacrifice has been remarkable. I am incredibly proud of all that team AMERICA achieved and of their resilience amidst challenges presented by a compressed operational FDNF schedule, on top of all the preparations that have gone into our homeport shift to San Diego. Every service-member aboard and our families and friends sacrificed so much to enable a successful forward-deployment, homeport shift and entry into the maintenance period. I am deeply grateful for you—our families and friends that keep supporting our mission day in and day out. Behind every awesome Sailor or Marine is an amazing support structure. Thank you for what you do to support your service-member in keeping AMERICA as a premier warfighting asset.

Homecoming is an unforgettable experience and I encourage everyone to enjoy much needed time off to reconnect with your loved ones and get established in our new home of San Diego.





DEPLOYING ADVANCED OCEANOGRAPHIC DEVICES USS AMERICA'S SUPPORT TO ATMOSPHERIC RESEARCH

In a significant stride toward enhancing environmental awareness and maritime readiness, the forward-deployed amphibious assault ship USS America (LHA 6) has deployed four advanced oceanographic and atmospheric data collection devices in support of ongoing naval and atmospheric research. These tools are expected to play a vital role in developing both short-term and long-term weather forecasts, ultimately improving the U.S. Navy's ability to issue timely warnings and implement protective measures across its global operations.

The recently deployed devices, Teledyne Webb Research Autonomous Profiling Explorer (APEX) profiling floats, are a critical component of the Navy's efforts to gather real-time, high-resolution data from the ocean. These autonomous, free-drifting floats collect detailed measurements of water conductivity, temperature, and pressure, contributing directly to the accuracy of ocean models and weather forecasting systems used throughout the fleet to inform the accuracy of weather forecasts.

"Our team is excited for the opportunity to assist the larger Meteorology and Oceanography (METOC) community in providing the warfighter Battlespace-on-Demand through data collection." explained Chief Aerographer's Mate (IW/SW/AW) Chris Rondeau. "These are autonomous drifting profilers that acquire water column profile data, such as water conductivity, temperature, and pressure." While the impact of these floats may not be immediately noticeable aboard the deploying platform, their long-term value to the Navy's METOC community is substantial. Rondeau noted that although the deployment won't have a direct effect on USS America's current operations, it will significantly benefit other Navy assets as the data is collected over time. "The floats we launched will not directly affect or impact us onboard," he said. "But they will provide data to the METOC community for the benefit of 7th Fleet maritime assets and decision-making. We will not really be able to observe any of the fruits that these bear in the near term, but future operations will benefit from the data "

The data collected by APEX floats supports a wide range of strategic goals, from enhancing battlespace awareness to increasing the Navy's capacity to operate safely in challenging environments. These deployments reflect a broader commitment by the Navy to use data-driven insights for decision superiority, enabling warfighters to anticipate environmental conditions and make informed operational choices.

As the Navy continues to evolve its approach to maritime domain awareness, devices like the APEX float represent an invaluable link between scientific research and tactical readiness. Each data point gathered from the ocean's depths strengthens the Navy's ability to safeguard its assets, support allied operations, and respond effectively to dynamic and often unpredictable maritime environments.

"We were grateful and excited for the opportunity to give back to the METOC community in our own small way. These floats,

in conjunction with a network of other sensors, are how we can improve our forecast processes which ultimately enables our decision-making abilities," said Lt. Cmdr. Jasmine DePompeo, USS America's METOC Officer.

Through the deployment of the APEX floats, USS America reaffirms its commitment not only to maritime safety but also to environmental and scientific advancement, both critical elements in ensuring our leaders are enabled with critical data to successfully conduct maritime operations.

America, lead ship of the America Amphibious Ready Group, is operating in the U.S. 7th Fleet area of operations. U.S. 7th Fleet is the U.S. Navy's largest forward-deployed numbered fleet, and routinely interacts and operates with allies and partners in preserving a free and open Indo-Pacific region.

THE VOYAGE OF THE **GREAT WHITE FLEET**

December 1907, President Theodore Roosevelt launched one of the most ambitious demonstrations of American naval power in history: the voyage of the Great White Fleet. Composed of sixteen battleships painted a striking white with gilded scrollwork on their bows, this fleet represented the United States' growing strength on the world stage. Over the next two years, the fleet circumnavigated the globe, covering more than 43,000 nautical miles and calling at ports on six continents. The mission was both a test of endurance and a powerful statement of diplomacy through naval might.

At the dawn of the 20th century, the United States was rapidly expanding its influence. The U.S. victory in the Spanish-American War of 1898 had left the U.S. with overseas territories such as the Philippines, Guam, and Puerto Rico. Yet, many European powers remained skeptical of America's ability to project power globally. Roosevelt, a firm believer in the importance of sea power, saw the fleet as the embodiment of America's new role as a world power. Sending it on a global cruise would not only train the Navy in long-distance operations but also signal to allies and rivals alike that the United States had arrived on the world stage. The fleet departed from Hampton Roads, Virginia, on December 16, 1907. Its first leg took it down to South America, with stops in Trinidad, Brazil, Chile, and Peru. Each port call was met with elaborate celebrations, showcasing both goodwill and curiosity about the imposing American warships. After transiting through the Strait of Magellan, the ships crossed into the Pacific Ocean, where they made an important stop in San Francisco. This leg underscored the challenges of maintaining such a large fleet far from home, logistics, coal resupply, and crew discipline all tested the Navy's organizational skills.

From the U.S. West Coast, the fleet sailed across the Pacific, making port in Hawaii, New Zealand, Australia, and the Philippines. In Australia, the fleet received rapturous welcomes, with crowds numbering in the hundreds of thousands, signaling a recognition of shared democratic values and maritime interests. In Asia, particularly Japan, the stop carried added weight. Tensions between the United States and Japan had been simmering, and Roosevelt intended the fleet's presence to serve as a deterrent while also extending a hand of friendship. Remarkably. Japanese officials responded with hospitality, easing fears of confrontation.

The homeward journey took the fleet through the Indian Ocean, Suez Canal, and Mediterranean Sea, where it visited Egypt. Italy, and France before crossing the Atlantic back to the United States. Everywhere it went, the fleet was celebrated as a marvel of modern naval engineering and a symbol of American resolve. The voyage concluded in February 1909, just weeks before Roosevelt left office.

The Great White Fleet's journey had lasting consequences. It showcased the U.S. Navy's ability to operate around the world, strengthened ties with allies, and impressed upon rivals the seriousness of American power. Domestically, it fueled enthusiasm for further naval expansion and modernization, leading directly to the development of even larger and more advanced battleships. Above all, the voyage transformed the image of the United States Navy from a coastal force to a global power.
