FORT BLISS, Texas – The Fort Bliss Central Issue Facility validated the Rapid Removal and Modernization of Organizational Clothing and Individual Equipment process during an Aug. 28 proof of principle rehearsal of concept. As the Army continues its modernization efforts, the R2MO program will support plans to advance the Rapid Removal of Excess program to include a modernization phase. The R2MO program aims to improve individual readiness by reducing the amount of OCIE each Soldier is responsible for carrying from each assignment.

SDDC facilitates 3rd ID cargo container and vehicle vessel load

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. – Soldiers and civilians from Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command's Jacksonville Detachment oversaw and assisted 3rd Infantry Division troops deploying in support of U.S. European Command as they conducted cargo reception and vessel loading operations at the Port of Jacksonville. The Jacksonville Port Authority, which includes the Dames Point facility, is one of the nation's designated strategic seaports contributing to national defense in the United States, and serves as a key hub for containerized cargo and vehicle transport.

75th FA BDE opens a culinary outpost food kiosk

FORT SILL, Okla. – The 75th Field Artillery Brigade held the opening ceremony for the Culinary Outpost Food Kiosk Sept. 11 in Kalsu Hall. Located right next to 75th FA BDE Soldiers' barracks, the outpost provides access to food to Soldiers outside of normal dining facility hours. It is open to all Fort Sill Soldiers to purchase food; Soldiers who hold meal cards are eligible to grab food at no charge as part of their meal entitlement. The outpost is part of U.S. Army Materiel Command's Food Modernization Program, which aims to provide Soldiers more convenient, healthy, accessible and affordable dining and food options.

Fort Drum launches free, on-post transportation

FORT DRUM, N.Y. – Need a ride? Starting Sept. 22, Fort Drum community members can use a free on-post transit service with more than 50 stops across the cantonment and Wheeler-Sack Army Airfield. The route includes dining facilities, fitness and recreational centers, the Post Exchange and Commissary, housing community centers, barracks and medical and dental clinics. Fort Drum officials met with local and state leaders during a community partner symposium in June 2024 where they discussed potential services that could be provided through an Intergovernmental Support Agreement. On-post transportation was among them.
