## For the New Guy

COLUMBIA, S.C. March 20 is the start of Pfc. Marquis Benton's first drill weekend with the S.C. Army National Guard and it has been full

of "firsts." Benton, 19, is an intelligence analyst with Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC), 218th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade, based out of Charleston, S.C. He completed Basic Combat **Training** his Advanced Individual Training earlier this year. With all his initial training complete he was able to attend his first drill with HHC.

Benton lives in Columbia, S.C. but traveled to the Charleston Readiness Center to meet with his unit before convoying to McCrady Training Center (MTC). Once he arrived at MTC his supervisor, Sgt. The pilots, Maj. Adrian M. Priester and Chief Warrant Officer Zimmer, made sure the flight was "extra special" by doing a few maneuvers demonstrated aircraft's capabilities. At one point during the flight Benton was lifted out of seat as the helicopter rapidly descended. Everyone on board enjoyed the thrill ride. When asked what he thought of his first drill Benton simply said, "It was amazing!" Benton said the highlight was definitely the Blackhawk ride.

Benton initially joined the Army National Guard for the financial assistant for college but now he's planning on becoming a warrant officer after he finishes college.
