FY 26 Lapse of Appropriations

The U.S. Government has entered a lapse in appropriations at 11:59 p.m. EDT on Sept. 30, 2025, commonly referred to as a “government shutdown.”

Below is the current status of installation services. Operations may change with limited notice, so please verify with the office before visiting.

Operating Normally (no changes at this time):

Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC) - Modified Operations:

- FFSC Counseling, Advocacy & Prevention (CAP): Non-medical counseling unavailable. For counseling services during this period, please visit or call U.S. Naval Hospital Yokosuka.
- FFSC Family Advocacy Program (FAP): No changes.
- FFSC Work & Family Life (WFL): No changes (AOB/ICR, résumé support, financial services, information & referral, EFMP).
- FFSC Transition Assistance Program (TAP): Offerings scheduled for the week of Oct. 6 are canceled. If you were scheduled, please contact the FFSC front desk at 243-3372 for assistance.
- FFSC Sexual Assault Prevention & Response (SAPR): No changes.
- FFSC Ikego Satellite Office: Closed until further notice.

- DoDEA Schools: Per DoDEA, schools remain open for normal operations. Sports and extracurricular activities (including practices) are paused during the shutdown. For school-specific information, please check your school's official page.
- Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society (NMCRS) – Yokosuka: Office remains open and ready to assist with emergency financial needs (e.g., food, gas, utilities).
- American Citizen Services (U.S. Embassy Tokyo): Passport/visa services continue as the situation permits. Embassy social media will post urgent safety/security information only during the shutdown.

We regretfully announce that the CFAY Friendship Day event scheduled for Sunday, October 5, 2025 has been canceled. This difficult decision was made due to the ongoing U.S. Government lapse in appropriations (government shutdown).

Friendship Day is a cherished annual tradition – an open-base festival that highlights the enduring friendship between the local Japanese community and the U.S. Navy. MOTORCYCLE SAFETY CLASSES: ENROLLMENT CHANGES

Starting Oct. 1, the Navy Safety Command has directed that all motorcycle training be advertised in the new safety program of record, Risk Management Information (RMI). To sign up for Motorcycle Safety Classes, you have to have an RMI account assigned by your command. For SOFA sponsored APF, NAF civilians and contractors that have a CAC, RMI accounts will be approved by the SOFA sponsoring unit. Dependents without a CAC must be enrolled by the sponsoring unit. CONSTRUCTION AND CLOSURES

Yokosuka: JM22 South Side partial closure from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Oct.

16. Crane work on building JM22.

Pedestrians and vehicles to be routed around work area.

- Leahy Street full road closure from 12 to 3 p.m. on Oct. 8. Crane work near building 1393. Pedestrians and vehicles to be routed around work area.
- Vacant Lot full closure until Dec. 30.

The vacant lot between the Post Office and NMCRS Thrift Shop will be used as a laydown area for contractors doing various work around base.

- Gridley Tunnel closure. First closure (until February 2026) is for temporary high voltage power bypass. Second closure is for permanent high voltage power repairs. The second closure (from Feb. 1, 2026 to July 31, 2028) is only for vehicular traffic. Tunnel will be open for pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

- Carney Gate water line replacement. Construction period until Nov. 26.

Expect detours and periodic closures for waterline replacement construction. Two-way traffic to be maintained. Most of the work will occur overnight.

- Nimitz Boulevard partial road closure. Closure period until Nov. 30, 8 p.m. to 5 p.m. on the weekends. Two-way traffic will be maintained with flagmen.

- Vandegrift Lane full road closure until October.

- The parking lot immediately in front of ATG is secured through 2027 in support of the NSST Shiphandling Trainer construction. Additionally, half of the 12-hour parking lot is also secured to support NSST construction material laydown and management.

Ikego: Yasakayato Street will be partially closed from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until Dec. 25. Installation of communication and electrical lines. Connect water main to new Child and Youth programs building. Flagmen will be posted on both sides to allow two-way traffic.
