-- VANGUARD OF MEDICAL INNOVATION --STOKES WIRE-BASKET STRETCHER





The Stokes wire-basket stretcher is one of the oldest medical devices in continuous use by the U.S. Armed Forces.

First exhibited at the St. Louis
World's Fair in 1904, it was
conceived by the Navy physician
Medical Director Charles Francis
Stokes (1863-1931) who witnessed
first-hand the difficulties of
transporting wounded through a
Navy ship's gauntlet of gangways,
ladders and hatches while serving in
the Spanish-American War.

In January 1906, the Stokes stretcher was adopted by the Army and Navy for use aboard hospital ships, transports and at "seacoast artillery stations."

Today, the Stokes stretcher, is still in use throughout the world and a testament to the staying power of one Navy physician's great idea.
