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Army advances 15-year OIB modernization plan

REDSTONE ARSENAL, Ala. – The Army made significant strides throughout fiscal year 2025 toward realizing its 15-year modernization plan for the Organic Industrial Base, demonstrating a commitment to ensuring the OIB's readiness both today and for future warfighting needs. From ribbon-cutting ceremonies to groundbreaking construction projects, Army Materiel Command delivered on promises and invested nearly \$100 million in facility and equipment upgrades across its sites.

Campus-style dining concept to enhance Soldier experience

WASHINGTON – On college campuses, students have a variety of food options in venues that have a wide range of hours and are easily accessible. With this idea in mind, the Army is expanding its food options to supplement traditional dining facilities, meeting Soldiers where they are and providing them the choices they want. The Army Nonappropriated Fund Contracting Office at Installation Management Command, G-9, on behalf of Army Materiel Command, awarded Compass Group USA, Inc. a concession contract Aug. 28, to create a unique campus-style dining venue at Forts Bragg, Stewart, Carson, Hood and Drum.

SDDC changes name to U.S. Army Transportation Command

REDSTONE ARSENAL, Ala. – Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command redesignated as Army Transportation Command, or ARTRANS, marking a historic shift in the command's 60-plus-year legacy of global deployment and distribution operations. The name change, approved by Secretary of the Army Dan Driscoll, better reflects the command's responsibilities and authorities while aligning the organization's title with the Army's broader naming conventions. The renaming provides greater clarity and consistency with other Army service component commands within other functional combatant commands.

Ensuring safe handling of lethal munitions for joint forces

TOOELE, Utah – Ammunition Peculiar Equipment is used around the world, but there's only one place in the world where you can get it. That place is Tooele Army Depot. The Ammunition Peculiar Equipment program objectives, as defined by AR 700-20, are "to provide a centralized source of standard, modern, safe, reliable, and environmentally acceptable APE for ammunition operations", and "to prevent injury to personnel and damage to ammunition and/or related facilities." APE is used to support conventional and chemical ammunition surveillance, demilitarization, maintenance, renovation and more.

ARTRANS, TRANSCOM, Seaport Task Force for port inspection

FORT EUSTIS, Va. – The 597th Transportation Brigade, Army Transportation Command teamed up with a seaport task force, made up of ARTRANS Soldiers and Sailors from TRANSCOM's Navy component, Military Sealift Command. The inspection will test their ability to rapidly establish and operate a port of debarkation and conduct cargo handling and movement operations to a forward unit in direct support of combatant commander requirements. The Reserve Component will then prove their ability to move cargo through all modes of transportation: ground, sea, rail and air.
