Sipping Through Southern Spain: Welcome to the Sherry Triangle

If you've recently arrived in Rota or anywhere near the Bay of Cádiz, there's something you should know: you're not just living in Spain, you're living in the heart of the legendary "Sherry Triangle." This isn't just wine country. It's centuries of history, barrels of tradition, and some of the best wines in the world. So pour yourself a glass (or better yet, head to a bodega), and let's get to know what's flowing just beyond your doorstep.

What is the Sherry Triangle?

The triangle refers to three historic towns in Cádiz province: Jerez de la Frontera, El Puerto de Santa María, and Sanlúcar de Barrameda. These are the only places in the world where true sherry or Jerez, as it's called in Spanish, can be produced under the Denomination of Origin Jerez-Xérès-Sherry.

Each corner of the triangle brings something unique to the table. Jerez is the commercial and historical heart of sherry, El Puerto is known for its maritime influence, and Sanlúcar (just across the river from Doñana National Park) is famous for Manzanilla, a lighter, saltier cousin of fino that pairs beautifully with seafood.

A Quick Sherry Primer

Let's clear something up: sherry is not just a sweet wine your grandmother sipped on holidays. In fact, most sherries are bone dry, nuanced, and wildly food-friendly. Here's a breakdown of a few key types:

- **Fino:** Pale, dry, crisp, and aged under a layer of yeast called flor that protects it from oxygen. It's the ultimate aperitif, especially with almonds or jamón.
- **Manzanilla:** A type of fino made exclusively in Sanlúcar de Barrameda. It's dry, light, and has a slightly saline quality thanks to the coastal climate.
- **Amontillado:** Starts as a fino, but later loses its flor and ages oxidatively, giving it a richer, nuttier flavor.
- **Oloroso:** Made without flor, oloroso is deep, dark, and robust. Think dried fruits, toasted nuts, and serious complexity.
- **Palo Cortado:** The unicorn of sherry. It begins like a fino but spontaneously develops traits of an oloroso. Rare, mysterious, and much-loved by sherry aficionados.
- **Pedro Ximénez (PX):** Made from sun-dried grapes, PX is sticky, sweet, and luxurious—like liquid raisins in a

glass. Perfect over vanilla ice cream.

Grapes and Harvest

The primary grape for most sherries is Palomino Fino, a relatively neutral grape that lets the winemaking and aging process take center stage. For sweet sherries like PX and Moscatel, the namesake grapes are used and dried under the sun before pressing to concentrate their sugars.

Harvest season begins in late August to early September, when the hot Andalusian sun has worked its magic. If you're around at the right time, some bodegas offer harvest tours or special tastings—a great way to experience the winemaking process from the vine to the glass.

Visiting the Bodegas: Tradition in Every Barrel

Bodega visits in the Sherry Triangle are not just wine tastings—they're full-on cultural experiences. You'll walk through cathedral-like aging cellars with rows of American oak barrels stacked in the traditional solera system, a complex aging method that blends younger and older wines to achieve remarkable consistency and depth.

You'll often hear locals talk about la madre del vino—the wine's "mother"—referring to the active biological layer of yeast in the barrel that's responsible for the flor. This, plus the unique humidity and temperature of the region, is what gives sherry its unique personality.

But for a more intimate look at the region's winemaking culture, smaller family-run bodegas offer something truly special. These visits tend to feel less like tours and more like stepping into someone's living history. We always enjoy spending time in these tucked-away wineries—there's a warmth, authenticity, and personal care that makes the experience feel like home. You might not find them on the big travel sites, but they're often the places that linger longest in memory.

Off the Beaten Path

If you're looking to go beyond the polished tours and glossy brochures, head into the smaller towns and lesser-known corners of the triangle. Places like Chipiona, Trebujena, or Chiclana de la Frontera have their own winemaking traditions and offer a more rustic and personal experience.

Ask around, pop into a local tabanco (traditional sherry bar), and follow your nose—or your palate. The less advertised the bodega, the more likely it is that you'll stumble upon an experience that's heartfelt and unforgettable.

Why It Matters

Sherry is more than just a drink—it's a window into Spanish history, agriculture, and community. Understanding it gives you a deeper appreciation of Andalusia and the people who have called this region home for generations.

So the next time someone asks, "Have you tried the sherry here?"—don't just nod politely. Go out and explore. There's a whole world of flavor waiting just beyond your base gate.

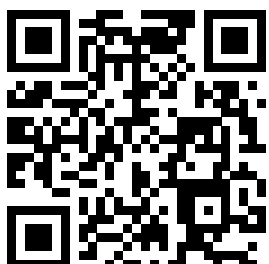

Health Promotions: Great American Smokeout

It's November, the leaves are changing colors, the weather is cooling, and all of the Holidays are just around the corner. And don't forget that the third Thursday in November is the Great American Smokeout!

Deciding to quit tobacco is one of the most important steps you can take to improve your health. Preparation is key to quitting successfully, and making a plan to stop is the first step. Consider your motivation to quit and talk to your health care provider to prepare for possible triggers and obstacles that may arise. This will help increase your chances of success.

Deciding to quit smoking is the first step; however, it is important to examine your motivation for quitting. Take time to identify your reason or your "why". It is helpful to write down one reason each day and display it in a visible location. This will help keep you engaged in your decision to quit smoking.

Your second step is picking a quit date and who will be in your quit smoking support team. Deadlines are a great way to create finish lines. The time between deciding to quit and your actual quit date is important for success. Remember to give yourself enough time to reflect and plan but not too much time which may create a delay or influence you to reconsider your decision to quit.

Remember that no one needs to



complete a hard task alone. Identify a network of people for support. This is a good time to share your quit date with someone who can become part of your journey. Having someone or several people who know about your plan and desire to quit will increase accountability and your chances of quitting.

So now that the date is set, begin tracking your relationship with tobacco. Write down the times of day when you use tobacco and how much you use. You can choose to quit with the help of a health professional, a self-paced program, or purely on your own, but knowing about your habits is very helpful. No matter what decision you make for your approach to quitting, it is advised that you discuss your intention to quit with a healthcare provider. They can support your decision with recommendations like medication, counseling, and education.

Start creating a step-by-step process for quitting and write it down. Identify your triggers (boredom, hunger, etc.) and then create a list of alternatives



like chewing gum or having a healthy snack. It is also time to remove all of the items that can trigger use. Clean out old lighters, ashtrays, dip cans, e-cigarettes, and pouches.

Cravings will come and when they do, be prepared. One strategy is the four D's: Delay smoking by ten minutes as many times as possible. Deep breath while delaying the urge. Drink some water and hydrate. And the last D is for distraction. Find something else to do with your time. Be sure to plan for difficulties and slip-ups as they may occur.

Now do it! You have the support team in place, your timeline is identified, you threw out the past and are looking towards a smoke-free and healthy future. Feel free to reach out to your medical provider for additional resources as well as your support team. In the end, celebrate your decision to quit and follow through for your loved ones and ultimately for yourself!

Fire Safety Tips for the Upcoming Holiday Season

Hello Team Rota,

It has been a busy and meaningful few months for your Rota Fire and Emergency Services team, and I wanted to take a minute to share what we have been up to.

We started the fall season by coming together for the September 11 remembrance events. That morning, we hosted our annual 9/11 Memorial Run to honor the lives lost and the heroes who answered the call that day. Later, many of us gathered at the base chapel for the remembrance ceremony. It was a moment to reflect, remember, and stand together as a community. It serves as a powerful reminder of why we do what we do and the importance of staying ready to serve others.

October kept us moving with Fire Prevention Week activities, held this year from October 5 through 11. The theme for 2025 was "Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home", focusing on how to use and store batteries safely to prevent fires. Throughout the week, our firefighters led several outreach events across the installation to help raise awareness about safe battery use and overall fire safety.

One of the biggest highlights was our Firefighter Muster Challenge, where different commands joined us for a day of teamwork and competition. We had teams giving their all in the truck pull, bucket brigade, and firefighter challenge course. Everyone brought great energy, but a big

congratulations goes out to 22 NCR for earning the top spot for 2025.

We also spent time with students at Rota Elementary School, where our firefighters showed the trucks and equipment and talked to the kids about what we do.

Our commitment to community outreach doesn't stop there. You have probably seen our Rota Firefighters Association around the installation hosting fundraising events throughout the year. These events are a fun way to connect with the community and, more importantly, they help us give back to those who need it most. Thanks to your continued support, we recently donated food and supplies to Asociación Saber Que Se Puede, a local food bank, and made a monetary donation to Asociación Rolucan Rota, the local organization supporting breast cancer awareness. I could not be prouder of our firefighters for their continued efforts to serve both on and off duty, and for their dedication to helping others here in Rota and beyond.

As we head into the holiday season, I want to remind everyone to keep safety in mind. It is easy to get caught up in the celebrations with decorations, cooking, and travel, but it is also the time of year when fire risk increases. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) offers the following safety tips to help keep your home and family safe this holiday season:

1. Inspect electrical decorations for

damage before use. Cracked or damaged sockets, loose or bare wires, and loose connections may cause a serious shock or start a fire.

2. Do not overload electrical outlets. Overloaded electrical outlets and faulty wires are a common cause of holiday fires. Avoid overloading outlets and plug only one high-wattage item into each outlet at a time.

3. Never connect more than three strings of incandescent lights. More than three strands may not only blow a fuse, but can also cause a fire.

4. Keep trees fresh by watering daily. Dry trees are a serious fire hazard.

5. Use battery-operated candles. Candles start almost half of home decoration fires.

6. Keep combustibles at least three feet from heat sources.

7. Protect cords from damage. To avoid shock or fire hazards, cords should never be pinched by furniture, forced into small spaces such as doors and windows, placed under rugs, located near heat sources, or attached by nails or staples.

8. Check decorations for a certification label. Decorations not bearing a label from an independent testing laboratory such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Canadian Standards Association (CSA), or Intertek (ETL) have not been tested for safety and could be hazardous.

9. Stay in the kitchen when something is cooking. Unattended cooking equipment

10. Turn off, unplug, and extinguish all decorations when going to sleep or leaving the house. Unattended candles are the cause of one in five home candle fires.

Hake in Parsley Sauce with Shrimp

Today we will be cooking a fish recipe that we really enjoy at home, and as you will see, it is very easy to cook. You can cook this dish with other types of fish such as grouper, monkfish and cod.

Hake in Parsley Sauce with Shrimp is a classic dish from the Spanish

Atlantic coast, where the freshness of the sea meets the simplicity of home cooking. This recipe combines tender hake fillets with shrimp, parsley, and a light white wine sauce — a comforting, flavorful meal that feels both traditional and refined. Whether shared at a family table or served to friends, it brings the taste of Southern Spain straight to your plate.

- Ingredients:
- ½ onion
 - 2 garlic cloves
 - ¼ green bell pepper
 - 1 bunch of fresh parsley
 - 1 chili pepper (optional)
 - 3 Tbsp (50 ml) extra virgin olive oil
 - ½ cup (75 g) all-purpose flour (we used corn flour for a gluten-free version)
 - 3 hake fillets
 - ½ cup (100 ml) light olive oil for searing the fish
 - ½ cup white wine (we used Mayeto from Bodegas El Gato, Rota)
 - 2 cups (½ liter) fish stock
 - 9 shrimp
 - 1 tsp salt



1 tsp cornstarch (optional, for thickening the sauce if needed)

Method:

Chop the onion, garlic, green pepper, parsley, and chili pepper (if using) and set aside.

Heat the extra virgin olive oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, garlic, green pepper, and chili pepper, and cook until the onion turns translucent. Stir in the parsley and let everything simmer gently for 5 minutes.

Meanwhile, coat the hake fillets in flour on both sides. Heat the light olive oil in a skillet and sear the fish for a couple of minutes per side until lightly golden. Set aside.

Add the seared hake to the pot with the veggies. Pour in the white wine and bring the heat up to let the alcohol evaporate, about 5 minutes. Then lower the heat and add the fish stock.

When the mixture comes back to a boil, add the peeled shrimp on top of the fish. Season with salt and plenty of chopped parsley. Cover and let it all cook together for 5 minutes.

Remove the fish and shrimp and blend the sauce until smooth (a hand blender or regular blender works great).

Return the sauce, fish, and shrimp to the pot. Simmer everything together for another couple of minutes so the flavors meld.

Turn off the heat and let it rest for a few minutes before serving.

Serve the fish with the hot parsley sauce, accompanied by rice or your favorite side.

COMPASS Rota: Guiding Spouses Through Navy Life

A new program is making waves at Naval Station Rota by bringing Navy spouses together to learn, connect, and grow. COMPASS Rota, which launched in January of this year, has already completed four successful sessions and continues to build momentum within the community.

The program is part of the Naval Services FamilyLine, a nonprofit organization dedicated to strengthening and supporting Navy families worldwide. What makes COMPASS unique is its volunteer-led, mentorship-based approach: it is run by spouses, for spouses.

COMPASS is a curriculum-based

program designed to provide practical knowledge, resources, and confidence to military spouses. Over the course of three days, participants explore a wide range of topics, including United States Naval history and traditions, finances (such as how to read a 'Leave and Earnings Statement', or LES), PCS (Permanent Change of Station), deployment, healthy communication, and local insights to help newcomers settle into Rota and the surrounding area. The sessions are not only educational but also interactive, giving spouses a space to ask questions, share experiences, and build connections. And because Navy life has its own language, COMPASS also helps spouses make sense of all those abbreviations and acronyms.

"COMPASS gave me a much deeper understanding of navy life and made me realize the program was for all spouses," shared Tré, a participant-turned-volunteer and mentor.

Since its launch in January, COMPASS Rota has already completed four successful sessions. "I'm passionate about COMPASS because military life is always changing—you don't know what you don't know until you need to know it," explained a Founding Mentor & Former Team Lead, Kristy. "COMPASS is a great way to connect with other spouses navigating the joys and challenges of this lifestyle. You're not alone!"

The New Team Lead, Heather, said she's eager to give back to the program

that supported her early on. "Compass empowered me as a new spouse, and I'm grateful to pay it forward," she said.

"Having mentors and a strong community truly makes a difference for our families."

Looking ahead, the next COMPASS Rota sessions that are scheduled for 2026 are on January 26–28, February 23–25, April 13–15, and May 4–6. All sessions will be held at 9:30 a.m.

From 1:30 p.m. at the NAVSTA Rota Chapel Fellowship Hall. Space is limited, so don't forget to register.

In addition to participants, COMPASS is also looking for volunteers to help the program continue to thrive. Mentors—spouses who have been married at least three years, completed at least

one PCS, and finished the COMPASS course and mentor training—play a vital role in the program. COMPASS also relies on Food Angels to help prepare the light breakfast and lunch offered each day—yes, participants are fed! To make attendance easier for parents, COMPASS also provides babysitting reimbursement at \$8 per hour (the current CDC rate) with a maximum reimbursement of \$96, and babies in arms are always welcome.

By combining mentorship, education, and community, COMPASS Rota empowers spouses to thrive and strengthens the Navy family here in Spain. With four sessions already completed since its launch, the program is proving to be an invaluable resource for spouses stationed in Rota.
