## 11th Airborne prepares to test sUAS in arctic conditions

JOINT BASE ELMENDORF-RICHARDSON, Alaska – The 11th Airborne Division is pioneering the use of small unmanned aerial systems for Arctic operations by establishing new manufacturing and training programs at military bases in Alaska. They will test these systems on a large scale during a Joint Pacific Multinational Readiness Center exercise in February. The newly formed 11th Airborne Division Innovations Team is establishing sUAS manufacturing and assembly labs at both JBER and Fort Wainwright.
