# MODERNIZING THE UNIFORM: BETTER FIT, SMARTER SEABAGS IN 2026



**WASHINGTON** — The Navy is changing up uniform and seabag [guidance](#) in 2026, and for junior Sailors, this one actually hits close to home.

Bottom line: better-fitting uniforms, fewer pointless items in your seabag, and less money and time wasted fixing uniform issues.

If you've ever bought a uniform that didn't fit right, spent money on alterations, or showed up to inspection wondering if your boots were still authorized — this update is for you.

As part of the changes, some boot models are no longer authorized after losing certification. Before you lace up and get called out, Sailors should double-check the approved boot list to make sure they're good to go.

The Navy is also updating uniform sizing to better match **real** Sailors' bodies, not outdated size charts. New [sizing charts](#) are being released with each updated uniform item, helping Sailors get the right fit the first time — with fewer exchanges and trips to the tailor.

Another win for junior Sailors: **uniform shortages are easing**. Shelves and online inventory are coming back, and Sailors who left boot camp without a full seabag because of shortages will receive a **one-time e-gift card** to buy the missing required items.

Navy officials say the goal is simple — cut the clutter, fix the fit, and



make uniforms one less thing Sailors have to stress about every day.

"These changes are meant to take care of Sailors," officials said. "When uniforms fit and are available, Sailors can focus on learning their job and supporting the mission." Calls for multi-year funding, clearer command accountability, operational adjustments, and Fleet Improvement Offices to drive continuous improvement and sustain a lethal, resilient, world-class Navy.
