# 1st Signal Brigade Enables Eighth Army Best Medic Competition, Strengthening Theater Medical Readiness

Eighth Army Best Medic Competition Rehearsal. The brigade's actions ensured the seamless execution of all competition lanes, allowing for the effective validation of the top medical personnel in the theater. By enabling this high-profile event, the 1st Signal Brigade directly contributed to enhancing the medical readiness and overall lethality of forces across the Korean peninsula.



## CPB Senior Leaders Unite to Assess Readiness and Drive Brigade-Wide Innovation

Senior leaders from across the Cyber Protection Brigade convened in Augusta for an offsite focused on reflection, operational alignment, and mission readiness. Leaders reviewed brigade accomplishments, assessed ongoing operations, and collaborated on initiatives to enhance lethality, innovation, and a resilient command culture. The event reinforced strategic communication, shared situational awareness, and strengthened leadership cohesion to drive the brigade forward in support of Army cyber objectives.



## From Burden to Baseline: Integrating the Weekly Activity Report into the Agile Sprint

Weekly Activity Reports (WARs) often create a heavy administrative burden, forcing supervisors to spend hours reconstructing a week's worth of work from emails and chats. In the Data Engineering Office (DEO) within the 2nd Signal Brigade, this drag is reduced by integrating reporting directly into the team's agile sprint rhythm instead of treating it as a separate task. Engineers track and update sprint tasks in Microsoft Planner, adding progress notes, documentation, and accountability details that later serve as "reference cards" for both reporting and performance reviews. When the WAR is due, team leads summarize work directly from these task records into a shared document, and an LLM helps consolidate and standardize the final report. This approach creates a transparent, team-wide communication pipeline to leadership while minimizing redundant emails and last-minute scrambling.
