Stockpile destruction milestone leaves legacy

ROCK ISLAND ARSENAL, Ill. – The destruction of the U.S. chemical weapons stockpile represents one of the most significant achievements in the history of arms control. The U.S. once possessed more than 30,000 tons of chemical warfare agents. The elimination of the stockpile marks the first time an entire class of declared weapons of mass destruction has been destroyed under international supervision.



IMCOM Leaders visit Kwajalein Atoll


