TYAD achieves \$42M cost avoidance

TOBYHANNA, Pa. – Tobyhanna Army Depot’s engineering community achieved a cost avoidance of over \$42 million through a value engineering project that took place over the course of a year and a half. The project focused on the Power Amplifier Module, a key component of the lifesaving AN/TPQ-37 Firefinder radar system. Twelve PAMs, as they are commonly referred to, are required to power each full radar.



Army continues investing in Puerto Rico

FORT BUCHANAN, Puerto Rico – The Army’s home in Puerto Rico and the Caribbean marked a significant step in supporting servicemembers and the local community March 23, with the groundbreaking ceremony for an Advanced Skills Training Barracks for military personnel.
